

### "992 to 1000 A.D. "



At some time during those eight years, our Norwegian Heritage began in America. "Heritage" is defined as the traditions, achievements, and beliefs that are part of the history of a group or nation. One of my beliefs is that Leif Erikson discovered America during that period of time. (About 500 years before some guy named Columbo.) I even remember having a somewhat heated discussion as a child with my sixth grade teacher, Mr. Roble, when I did not want to participate in the usual Columbus Day Activities in Grade School on October 12th. I asked, what about the famous Viking Leif Erikson? I believe that I lost the argument and ended up celebrating Columbus Day.

But just two years later in 1964, I was vindicated. The United States Congress authorized and requested that President Lyndon Johnson proclaim October 9th of each year as "Leif Erikson Day". He was only in his late twenties when he discovered America, and died at the age of 50 somewhere in Greenland.



Brandy gave wonderful talk on the history and characteristics of the Fjord Horse breed and about her adventures with Thunder. After finishing a 100 mile mountain trail ride in less than 24 hours, winning numerous trail rides, top places in show, pulling and dressage, these two have proven that Fjord Horses can excel in any type of competition. This gray dun is considered the epitome of the breed.

For those of us at the Cory meeting, the most enjoyable part of the experience was being near these gentle, personable horses. From the colts to the stallion, they were like big puppies. They seemed to enjoy us as much as we enjoyed them.


