

Consider these short prayers:

"Heavenly Father, crowds cheered and welcomed Jesus and later yelled for his crucifixion. I try to honor and celebrate You, but I know there are areas of my life where I reject or ignore You. Today, give me the strength to sing Your praises at times I might otherwise dishonor You. Amen."

Palm Sunday: God's Response to Sin, Part 2 oggcatholic.org/homilies-audio.html

Focus: Jesus, the ambush predator

1. Last week: Jesus is sent by the Father to be the Passover Lamb of God.

a. This week: What was Jesus' perspective?

2. A look at Jesus.

- a. CONSIDER: How do you normally think or talk about him?
 - i. Patient, kind, gentle, compassionate, merciful, etc.
- b. Compare that to some Scripture passages:
 - Isaiah 49:24-26 ... I will contend with those who contend with you...
 - 1 John 3:8 The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.
 - iii. John 12:31 Now shall the ruler of this world be cast out.
 - iv. Luke 1:68-79 He has come to save us from our enemies...
 - v. Luke 11:21-22
 - "When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own palace, his goods are in peace; but when one stronger than he assails him and overcomes him, he takes away his armor in which he trusted, and divides his spoil."
 - Christianity: The invasion of one kingdom by a stronger Kingdom.

3. Look at the Crucifixion

- a. Church Fathers: Jesus is going to war to rescue us.
 - i. What do you see?
 - ii. What do we know about Jesus?
 - 1. He is the Word, he is God. (John 1:1-3, 14)
 - Enemy occupied territory that's what this world is. Christianity is the story of how the rightful King has landed, you might say landed in disguise. (CS Lewis)
 - iii. Ambush predator:
 - Sweats blood, arrested, chained, judged, stripped, mocked, spit on, crowned with thorns, nailed to a tree.
 - 2. Trying to draw the prey close, in order to pounce.
 - He dies. Jesus, the eternal Word of God, the Light of the World, enters into Satan's kingdom of darkness.
 - His divine light scatters the darkness. Jesus conquers the darkness from within.
 - Other images: bait on a fishhook (Gregory of Nyssa); bait on a mousetrap (Augustine)

4. A First Look at the Resurrection

- a. "Who is he who contends with me? Let him stand in opposition to me..." (Melito of Sardis)
 - Above all, Jesus is unconquerable. He conquers the one who holds us captive.
 - This is God's response to sin.
 - iii. More to come for next week.

Reflection questions and homework:

- Does this have any meaning to you? Does it open your eyes in any way?
- Do you understand this, that you matter this much to God?
- 3. Read: Colossians 1:13-14; Colossians 2:13-15; Hebrews 2:14-15; Revelation 1:9-18
