



### A yoke + faithful partnerships =

#### great harvest

"The oxen wear a yoke, like the calf yoke, but much bigger and heavier. A chain goes from the yoke to the sled. When the oxen walk forward, the yoke goes with them, and whatever is chained to the yoke has to come along too!"


We all are one a spiritual pilgrimage. Sometimes we can feel closer or farther away from God, but as I get a bit older and hopefully wiser, I've begun to grasp how important it is to be yoked side by side with God. It's quite likely that you've heard this wellknown scripture in Matthew 11: 28-30

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Many times when reading this verse, I focus on the burden part and think, *"How can a burden possibly be light?"* It was necessary for me to do a little research on farming to unpack the intended meaning of this verse.

A yoke is a tool used in farming that two cattle use to carry the load. Imagine a single cow trying to carry a yoke intended for two cattle all by itself. No matter the effort the single animal, it would walk itself a trench by going in circles. The single animal would not be able to accomplish its task with equipment that was built for a team to carry.

*Like cattle carrying a yoke for farming, the ministry of the church is not a solo effort.* 

While independence and self-starting are skills that are often sought out and desired in our world, scripture asks us to reflect on the call of unity and teamwork in the work of growing the faith community.

If we insist on carrying our yokes alone, we run in circles and dig trenches that isolate us— instead of gardens that give us life. We are called to partner with Jesus, casting our burdens down, taking time to rest, and learn from Jesus example of gentleness and humbleness. We also are called to partner and yoke with each other to share in the mission of serving our community – so our souls and bodies will be rested - not exhausted.

In the world of farming, a garden could never be planted, grown and harvested without that initial process of yoking up two oxen, tilling up the soil and planting some seeds. In the world of ministry, it's just as important to team up with each other in order to till the soil and plant the seeds of faith in our lives and the lives of those around us.

As we are yoked with Christ in the practices of our faith, people

# **Mission Message**

#### SEPTEMBER 21: INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PEACE

Global migration has reached unprecedented numbers, and cultural polarization is only one result, resulting in conflicts between neighbors. Lutherans in Liberia, Zimbabwe, South Sudan, and Columbia are leading the way in moving people beyond conflict toward reconciliation.

Liberia: When the 15-year civil conflict ended in 2003, women who had been instrumental in ending it formed a group called Women in Peacebuilding Network. In fact, one of the women, Leymah Gbowee, a member of the Lutheran Church in Liberia, won the Nobel Peace Prize. They monitor the progress of the peace agreement between the government and the rebel leaders, document violations, and intervene with actions of peace and reconciliation.

Zimbabwe: Zimbabwean churches historically have aided the victims of politically motivated violence, but in order to help prevent the violence, they launched the Ecumenical Church Leaders Forum, led by retired Bishop Ambrose Moyo of the ELCZ. 88 local committees are now in place, trained in conflict prevention, management, resolution and peace building.

Colombia: In 2016, a peace agreement was reached between the government and a guerilla group, after more than 50 years of conflict. The House of Reconciliation and Peace Education was founded last year by Emmaus Lutheran Church. Its vision is to preach the gospel and to live out the gospel in the community, so they are teaching the people in the neighborhood to resolve conflicts peacefully.

S. Sudan: Regional violence in S. Sudan has forced people to flee,

You may know what a playground is, but a "Pray-ground"? Pray-grounds are a method of engaging young children in worship and parents of young families – beyond nursery or bypassing Sunday worship. A "Pray-ground" space is established in the front area that often includes: a rug, some soft toys, coloring books, crayons and small table and chairs. **<u>3. Variance Update</u>**: It is with great disappointment that the leadership of TOL Church announces the variance request to the city of Jamestown for our Smith Ave. property was denied by City Council. 5. **Discussion:** Our recent experience with the city variance denial causes concern about how we will be able to engage in mission efforts going forward, as the Smith Ave. We have now learned that the Smith Ave. Parsonage is only able to be used for pastoral residential housing, to retain nontax status. We continue to be in conversation with the City of Jamestown to get more information of zoning guidelines and how a church can work with them. As we continue to work through the data that has been collected, it's important for our church to stay focused on mission and what physical location best suits those efforts.

Currently TOL's mission statement is general and flexible; but provides a lens for us to ask:

"Where is God calling TOL church to make its home as we are: United in worship, sharing Jesus and serving all people?"

We are asking the geographical question this way:

*"What can we do, "ministry-wise" with each location?" "What is developing as mission opportunity?" "Who are partners for mission and ministry for TOL?"* 

We have worked through many steps of this process and grown in our compassion and care for each other through the  $\longrightarrow$  KT
