Grand Knight's Message Dear Brother Knights,

While I have not been very active with the Degree Teams since becoming Grand Knight, I was able to attend on Monday night when five new members were taking their First Degree with our Council. I was struck, watching those five new members taking their first steps, and wondered about all the people who would be affected by their membership. I thought about my 45 years hunting deer and remembered we have always tried to be careful of our harvest so that good hunting will continue year after year. We do not harvest does because we believed that when you kill a doe, you are actually killing at least a hundred deer with her. Doing the math, it would not make sense to do that unless you were trying to significantly reduce the deer population in a certain area. Along the same lines, when you bring a new member into the Knights of Columbus, that member is exposed to quite a few other Knights doing service and charitable works. In turn, that member, learning our codes and becoming stronger in his faith, begins looking for ways to serve others. Those people's lives become better and they look for ways to serve more people. How many people are helped and have better lives? Hundreds? Thousands? Who really knows? Still, thinking about it is profound and makes each new member precious and special.

During this Lenten season, any service or charitable work we can perform will surely deepen our faith and bring us closer to Jesus Christ. While I was attending a nondenominational Bible study a few years ago, one of the Protestant members began telling me that we Catholics had it all wrong on praying the Holy Rosary. After thinking about it for a moment, I reminded him of all the things we had discussed in that study group: not being the leader of our households like God had intended; not loving those around us as ourselves; not being strictly honest in our business dealings, etc. He said, "Well, we are working on it." responded that I found it hard to pray the Rosary and get into all that other stuff at the same time. I have noticed a correlation in my own life between the time I take praying, serving others, and being charitable, and the number of sins I commit. He couldn't think of an argument for that!

Thanks to each of you this month for stepping up and helping with the spaghetti dinner, fish frys, and 1st Degrees. Matt Snyder has volunteered to take over the spaghetti dinners from now on and will need volunteers for his committee. Christ is Risen! Truly, He is Risen! Alleluia!

It is over. The countdown to the end of Lent has been completed. Hopefully, the effort devoted to giving up or doing something extra has been rewarding for you by changing you in some way. We just completed the Holiest Week in the Church calendar. We were there as Jesus was betrayed on Holy Thursday and tried and found guilty, beaten, crucified and buried on Good Friday. Then on Holy Saturday, we experienced an emptiness, a sense of loneliness, knowing that Jesus was lying in a tomb, and we felt separated from Him. But then came Easter Sunday. Alleluia! He is Risen! Nothing that happened on Thursday, Friday, or Saturday makes sense without Sunday.

Wednesday's Gospel reading was the story of the walk to Emmaus. It is easy to listen to this and think that those two disciples really weren't that quick. How could they walk for seven miles with Jesus, listening to Him speak and teach, and not recognize Him? But with a little reflection, we realize that we are no different. When we are dealing with day-to-day problems at work or in our family, when we or a loved one are having health issues, or when a loved one or friend dies and it just doesn't make sense to us, do we recognize that Jesus is walking with us? If you are like me, the answer is sometimes "yes" but also, more often than I want to admit, "no." That is what the Resurrection is all about. It is about Jesus walking with us and showing us that God's hand is in everything we experience and that Jesus will always be with us to share the struggle so we can experience the joy at the end.

We celebrate Easter for 50 days, 10 days longer than Lent. The message is clear: the reward is greater than the suffering. Christ is Risen! Truly, He is Risen! Alleluia!!

Finally, remember our <u>349th consecutive Rosary will be prayed on Friday, May 4, 2012, at 7:30 p.m. at St. Vincent's Church.</u> I hope to see many of you there as we start our 29th year of First Friday Rosaries. God bless all of you.

Spiritual Growth Corner by George Kalil

The month of May gives us two great feast days: the Ascension and Pentecost. Take some time to read the account of the Ascension in Acts 1: 6-12. Put yourself there with the Apostles. How would you react? The Man that you have been with for three years, who taught you, fed you, performed miracles in your sight, was arrested and put to death. Then He was reunited with you after the Resurrection and has now been taken up into Heaven right before your eyes. He is gone again. And even worse, He has told you to go and make disciples of all the nations (Matthew 28: 18-20). How do you feel: alone; abandoned; overwhelmed; confused? How are we supposed to do this? Well, in Acts 1: 1-5, He tells us. His Father will send the Holy Spirit to help us. Then, ten days later at Pentecost, He does. Boy, does He! Tongues made of fire appear, and you receive this Spirit and your mission begins. The twelve of you go out and change the world forever.

The thing to remember about our Faith and this Church of which we are a part is that it is a living Faith. This story didn't just take place 2000 years ago; it isn't just a lesson in history. It is as true today as it was back then. If you have been baptized and confirmed, the Spirit is with you. The hard part for us is that the Spirit didn't appear as tongues of fire so we don't always recognize Him, but He is still here leading us. We still have the same mission. Through our **evangelizing**, we are to change the world. Don't let that word scare you. Sometimes it is as easy, or as hard, as just doing the right thing when everyone else wants to do the wrong thing or saying what needs to be said when nobody else will. We have been preparing for this, first during the Lenten season and now during the Easter season. Shortly, we will be given our commission to go and make disciples of all the nations. What are we going to do? How are we going to answer that call? As Knights, we are called to take up the challenge and go change this world in which we live one small piece at a time.

Finally, remember our <u>350th consecutive Rosary will be prayed on Friday, June 1, 2012, at 7:30 p.m. at St. Vincent's Church.</u> Maybe that little sound you hear in your heart is the Holy Spirit calling you. God Bless You.


News Summary By Joe Tinervia

Spiritual Growth Corner by George Kalil

I am going to propose an exercise that may be scandalous to some Catholics. Pick up your Bible. You know, the one on the coffee table, and read from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, Chapter 6, verses 1-11 and from Luke, Chapter 6, verses 12-19. These were the two readings from a recent daily Mass. I think both have some insight for us today. In the first one, Paul is reprimanding the Church in Corinth for bringing their disputes with each other to the "unjust for judgment instead of to the holy ones." He also asks why they have lawsuits at all. He tells them that it is a "failure on your part that you have lawsuits against one another." Can you imagine the United States without lawsuits? True justice comes from God and that is what Paul is reminding us all.

The second reading talks about Jesus going up the mountain to pray by himself before choosing the twelve Apostles. He did this often when He was preparing for some big event in His life. Remember the Garden of Gethsemane on Holy Thursday? I don't want you to think this is political because that is not the intent. The election coming up is important for many reasons, and we can't afford to make the wrong choice. I am asking you to read these two Bible passages, reflect on them, and then pray that your heart will be open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit as you prepare for the upcoming election. We have two more First Friday Rosaries before the election, and even though we offer them for the sick and homebound, you can also offer these rosaries for guidance for the election. There is strength in numbers. The next rosary will be on October 5 at 7:30 p.m. at St. Vincent. The capacity of the church is 650 so there is plenty of room for all members and their families. I hope to see many of you there. God Bless You.





Grand Knight's Message Dear Brother Knights,


