### **URSULINE UPDATE**

Update on the Ursuline Western Province from Sr. Shirley Garibaldi '64

We continue to be alive and breathing as we face each day with the assurance of God's presence and guidance. We continue to serve in California, Idaho, Montana, and Alaska. Although our numbers have decreased, we continue to have a strong presence in these states. As we age, we see we cannot continue to do some of the ministries we did as younger religious but our contact with people, our prayer and what we can do remains strong.

This last year we lost Sr. Francis Xavier Porter. Some of you may have had her as a Science teacher at St. John's. She lived in Great Falls, Montana and cared for our archives housed there. She lived at the Ursuline Centre there and had a strong presence at the retreat center. As many of you may know, we lost quite a few buildings in the fire of 2017. The cost to rebuild our retreat center was enormous, and we no longer had the personnel to staff the center. All else was gone, and the high school had already been sold to the Roseland School District. We only had the convent left, and that was empty. Following the fire we rebuilt the priest's quarters, put a new roof on the building, painted the building and installed new carpeting. Following that, we put it on the market, and the Bishop was interested in purchasing it. Later, realizing he could not afford it, the Marian Sisters of Santa Rosa bought it, along with the remainder of the land, for their community. We leave a legacy of over 135 years in Santa Rosa.

We are now working on giving input for the rewriting of our Constitutions, evaluating our Road Map for the next 5 years, and including a viability study of the province for the future. As you can see, we are busy in many ways. The days slip away, and we continue to be there for each other and for all the people we have served and continue to serve in some way. Be assured of our prayers for all of you. You are wonderful and courageous women facing the daily challenges in the world we are living. Those of us who attended so enjoyed the gathering in April and look forward to our next one to see you again. Please continue to hold the Ursulines in your prayers as we face our challenges as a community in this time and in this place.
