# INTRODUCTION

The Southern Connecticut Diamond Club, Inc. is a non-stock corporation which was originally organized in 2005 as an informal organization. Its motto was "To foster and promote the game of baseball." The Southern Diamond Club got its motivation from a prior organization, known as the Greater New Haven Diamond Club. This former organization was founded in 1980, but went into a "batting slump" after 1992.

Thankfully, several former members, along with a group of new dedicated individuals, still believed in the motto, and started the Southern Connecticut Diamond Club in 2005. What these men started has blossomed into a full-fledged network of baseball people helping others enjoy the game. In 2011, the organization went from an informal group of baseball enthusiasts to a full-fledged, non-stock corporation.

In 2005, the club was established with the Whitey Piurek "No I in Team" awards for area high school baseball players. 2008 marked the first Hall of Fame Awards Dinner of the Southern Connecticut Diamond Club, honoring those who have done great things for baseball in the region. The Southern Connecticut Diamond Club also decided to pay tribute to the Hall of Famers of the disbanded Greater New Haven Diamond Club by inducting them all as Hall of Famers into their own organization.

The Southern Connecticut Diamond Club, Inc., has and will continue in its efforts to spread the goodwill of baseball to those fortunate enough to be associated with it. It will continue in its efforts to recognize and award those who have given so much to so many through this great game.

# THE ANDREW GASSIRA MEMORIAL UMPIRE'S AWARD



Andrew Gassira was a lifelong resident of the New Haven area, who passed away in October, 1979.

Despite the fact that he had no sons, he spent evenings and Saturdays each year fulfilling his role as League Commissioner, Umpire in Chief, coach and teacher for the 83 teams making up the Hamden Fathers' Baseball Association. He would line up umpires, keep their payroll records, conduct training clinics, attend games, keep performance ratings on his staff and supervise the entire program.

Born in 1922, Gassira graduated from Commercial High School, entered the U.S. Army, was discharged, and then entered J.C.C. College under the G.I. Bill. He graduated from the Baseball Umpiring School in Bartow, Florida, in 1948 and worked with the New York Yankees. He umpired in the AAA Baseball System in Georgia and upstate New York. He then got married and went to work for G & O Radiators where he became a draftsman and worked there for 31 years.

Gassira was a basketball coach for the Trowbridge Rec Center in New Haven and also refereed high school and college basketball.

He umpired in American Legion and Babe Ruth Leagues. He was a member of the Greater New Haven Baseball Umpires Association, the Connecticut College Baseball Association, and the Hamden Fathers' Baseball Association.

FRANK MOHR


An original Diamond Club honoree on the 1980 College Team where he was an Academic All-American and two year captain at SCSU, Mohr continued to share his passion for the game in the coaching ranks at his alma mater as an assistant to Joe Bandiera ; player/manager of the short lived Independent Connecticut State League; assistant to Bob DeMayo at North Haven for a season and then Head Coach of Lyman Hall High School.

He turned his love for the game to the other side of the mask and joined the Greater New Haven Baseball Umpires Association ranks 20 years ago. Always learning and attempting to get better, Mohr took many of his lessons from mentors too many to mention. Many of them are previous Andy Gassira award winners. He's proud to say that he has learned from the best.

His umpire accomplishments include numerous scholastic league and five CIAC state championships along with three American Legion State Championship games.

Now retired after 40 years in education, Frank can also be found on the hardwood in the winter where he has achieved notoriety as a very accomplished NCAA Women's Basketball Official working over 30 NCAA DIII tournament games highlighted by two Final Four appearances (most recent a National Semifinal in 2017) and four elite eight games.

Coach Rosarbo is currently President of the Connecticut Raiders Organization, a local AAU program. He was also the recipient of the 2011 Coach of the Year award Class M given by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. Throughout the years, Ronnie has helped numerous girls get college scholarships so they could continue to further their dreams. He prides himself on making and maintaining relationships with the players and their families, taking what he knows to be successful from working with kids in the City of New Haven for 25 years. Ronnie is known for uniting kids who would otherwise not know each other, making sure that they have a strong foundation on and off the field. These relationships have withstood the test of time and he is in contact with girls and their families from his first team. Playing for Ronnie means you become an honorary member of the family. On and off the field, Ronnie Roe is also well known for his pep talks and life lessons. Taking a knee before and after the game, a swift hit on the helmet, all while getting the most valuable lesson of all, sportsmanship.

While every coach wants the win, Ronnie always puts sportsmanship first citing one of his favorite poems and lessons, The Charge of Light Brigade by Tennyson. These lessons are not only limited to the softball field. As a security guard for the City, he spent time at many sporting events and the teams would wait for one of his talks. It became a tradition. Most recently a former basketball player stopped his daughter and said, "After losing the championship game we were so down but Ronnie Roe swooped in and made us feel like we won the game rather than lost."

Ron is married to Cindy Campano Rosarbo. They have one daughter, Florence Constantinople, Son-in-law Paul Constantinople Jr. and grandson Paul Constantinople III. His siblings are Carmela (Joseph) Savo, Vincent (Tina) Rosarbo III, Joseph (Gina) Rosarbo and Louise (Jeff) Dinsmore.



#### JOCELYN RUOTOLO CHANG

Jocelyn Ruotolo Chang was involved with Little League for as long as she can remember, as she grew up on the softball fields. Growing up she was part of a very strong Little League family. Her father, David Ruotolo, was District Administrator for Connecticut District 4 baseball and softball. Jocelyn shared the same love of the sport with her father, and played her entire life.

She graduated from West Haven High School in 2000, where she also played softball. After high school, Jocelyn went on to Southern Connecticut State University to play softball. Jocelyn graduated from SCSU in 2004, and moved on to start her own business.

Once done playing herself, Jocelyn turned her love of the game as a player into a coach. Her first coaching position was at Bethany Middle School in 2006. Gaining experience, the next coaching opportunity came at Amity High School for three seasons as the Freshman Coach. In 2009, she was hired as assistant coach at Career High School. The following year she was fortunate enough to get the Head Coaching position at Sheehan High school. After eight seasons she stepped down due to her family and business demands.

In addition to Jocelyn's professional coaching, she volunteered as a Little League and Travel Softball coach for many years. Jocelyn also worked part time at USA Elite as a pitching, hitting and catching coach, Jocelyn's greatest coaching accomplishment would be from the 2012, when her team advanced to the Junior Little League World Series in Kirkland Washington. It was truly her proudest moment, and a once in a lifetime event that she got to share with her best friend, mentor and father – who shared her same love for the sport.

In March 2013 Jocelyn's love for the sport morphed after her father passed away. Her father was her best friend and mentor. At the time of his death, David Ruotolo was still the District Administrator for CT District 4. Jocelyn was elected in April of 2013 to take on the role that her father served and stepped into his shoes as the CT District 4 Administrator for six years.

Stepping into this role, made her have a new appreciation for the sport, and her father. While Jocelyn served as the DA she was responsible for running the Junior League Eastern Regional. This tournament is made up entirely of Volunteers and without her great staff there would be no way to pull it off. These tournaments are also fond memories of the time she got to spend with no only her father, our entire family, and his friends – who have all become extended family.

In 2019 Jocelyn made the extremely difficult decision to step down as District Administrator to focus more on her business and family. Jocelyn credits her involvement with Little League for making her the person she is today. Jocelyn is the daughter of David and Rita (Kathy) Ruotolo, and sister to Stephanie Suraci, of Weston, FL and Jennifer VanBrederode, of West Haven, CT. Jocelyn's love of her life is her twelve year old son Sebastian Chang, who is her world.




CHARLIE FLANAGAN

Charlie Flanagan has a long history of volunteerism in local baseball, including five years as a head and assistant coach in Hamden Fathers Baseball, and six years as head basketball coach for Hamden YMCA. He also spent six years as the director of the CT Seadogs AAU Baseball and head coach.

Charlie was also active in American Legion baseball, serving two years as assistant coach for Orange American Legion, and 21 years as head coach of North Haven Post 76 American Legion Baseball and five years as its general manager and current coach. During his tenure, he established two scholarships for eligible high school seniors on North Haven Post 76 Baseball, give out \$2,500 annually to defray college costs; and set up an insurance program last year that enabled the American Legion players throughout the state to play.

For his volunteer efforts Flanagan received the Gold Ring from the Boys and Girls Club and was inducted into the State of CT American Legion Hall of Fame. Over the years he has sponsored numerous youth teams in Hamden and North Haven and is a six-year sponsor and contibutor to the West Haven Twilight League.

JIM GUERCIA (posthumously)


James A. Guercia, 74 of Clinton/Killingworth died peacefully on June 22, 2020. He was born February 1, 1946, in New Haven.

Jimmy graduated from Wilbur Cross High School in 1964 where he was a student-athlete and leader in his class. Some of his high school achievements include all-state honors, football and baseball, and the Gridiron Award. Jimmy's accolades continued into his college career at Southern Connecticut State University where he helped lead The Owls to the NCAA Atlantic Coast Championship at Yankee Stadium and orchestrating one of the most iconic plays in Southern Connecticut State University's football history with a kickoff return for a touchdown in the final minute in a win over nationally ranked Hofstra.

After graduating college, he began a 45-year dedicated career at Notre Dame High School of West Haven as a physical education teacher, football, baseball, and track and field coach. His passion for teaching and coaching left an everlasting impression on decades of students, athletes, and peers. He was inducted into The Halls of Fame for Wilbur Cross High School, Southern Connecticut State University, and Notre Dame High School. Many other organizations have honored him for his dedication and accomplishments during his lifetime, including the New Haven Gridiron Club and the West Haven Twilight League. Jimmy was never someone to share the accolades he achieved. He was a humble, kind, generous, and compassionate man who lived to see others succeed. The friendships he held close remained for decades and were truly cherished. His love and dedication to his family was a quality he wore with pride.

He was devoted and happily married to his love and best friend, Barbara Fox (Torre) Guercia. Jimmy's most proud accomplishments were in raising his children, both biological and extended. In his heart there was no difference. Throughout the years he took them fishing and camping, taught them his secrets of cooking and gardening, played the guitar, listened to music, and attended countless extra-curricular activities. His grandchildren were the apple of his eye as he carried on some of those very same traditions with them. Survived by, in addition to his wife, brother Thomas Guercia and wife Betty, sister Sondra Beavis, daughter Alison Guercia-Smith and significant other Scott Wilkinson, daughter Heather Klein-Albert and husband Peter, son Jason Guercia and significant other Cindy Pinaud-Argersinger, son Derek Torre and wife Jessica Destefano-Torre, son Sean Torre, son Jarret Guercia and wife Sarah Hovick-Guercia, and grandchildren, Cooper and Abigail Smith, Samantha and Collin Albert, Shelby Argersinger, Ben and PJ Torre, and Ryder and Zepplin Guercia.
