CONGRATULATIONS TO NORTON'S FALL DART TEAMS!

#### "What can the ADO do for me?"

This is an often-asked and legitimate question. Why should an individual or an association support a National Darts organization, when the object of forming an association in the first place was to "play darts with my friends"?

The answers vary, depending on the intent of the question. Speaking generally, however, the ADO can do for you what you can't reasonably do for yourself or for your organization.

Namely, the ADO can provide:

- -- National Coordination
- -- National Advertising
- -- Standardization of Tournament Rules and Equipment
- -- National and International Competition
- -- Representation on a worldwide basis (World Darts Federation)

People are into organized darts for a variety of reasons: social fun; the exilaration of winning; the competition; even the money.

Darts are organized, run and promoted on the local level. A league or an association is free to structure their leagues any way they choose. This is as it should be. However, working at the local level limits the exposure, the prize structure and the competition, thereby creating the need for a National organization that ties the whole together.

The American Darts Organization (ADO) was established as the national organizing body for the Sport of Darts in the U.S. It's purpose is to promote the Sport nationally and internationally, without taking over control of the local organization AND without using the facade of a national organization to make a quick buck.

The ADO is organized at the grass roots level all across the United States. It is not sectional nor interested only in the name players. The ADO is dedicated to helping the fledging organization; to developing the growing base of new players; to educating the general public and to promoting, organizing and sponsoring darts, period.

What does all that mean in terms of you, the individual, or your Club? It means the intent of the ADO is to become for darts what the USGA is for Golf or the PBA is for bowling.

- -- It means we'll be able to secure nationwide sponsors.
- -- It means we'll be able to provide national TV coverage.
- -- It means we'll be able to hold \$100,000 + tournaments in the future.
- -- It means the number of Darters and Dart pubs will mushroom.
- -- It means local newspapers, radio and magazines will be interested in covering your events.
- -- It means people will begin to understand that there is more to a game of darts than shooting bulls.
- -- Finally, it means darts will be a bonafide national sport with its own nationally recognized prestige, glamour and super stars.

Like anything else, there is strength (and clout) in numbers. The ADO represents over 60,000 dart players, nationwide. In truth, this number is still small when one considers the number of golfers, bowlers, tennis players, etc. in the U.S. However, it wasn't many years ago that these organizations were struggling for recognition, acceptance and memberships. The day of darts is close at hand. The ADO is going to speed the process.

Let's return for a minute to the practical question of what the ADO can, and IS doing for you, the player.

#### The ADO has:

- -- developed & distributed an annual National Tournament Calendar
- -- developed & distributed a quarterly Newsletter ("Double Eagle")
- -- developed & distributed Tournament Sanctioning Requirements/Procedures
- -- developed & published a standardized set of Tournament Playing Rules and minimum equipment standards
- -- established a 180 Certificate award
- -- established & maintained a National and Regional Championship Points System, offering awards and special recognition
- -- produced an 'ADO National Team' to play against top Canadian players in the semi-annual USA vs. Canada Match
- -- established the annual 'East-West ADO All Star Challenge' event. Each ADO Region has the opportunity to be represented on these teams, and every ADO member has a chance to compete in All-Star competition, via association playoffs
- -- established the 'ADO Youth Darts Program', for darters between the ages of 13 and 18. Local and Area playoffs culminate with an the annual ADO National Youth Championship.
- -- produced top-notch US teams for World Cup and Pacific Cup competition, including our 1987 Women's World Cup Team
- -- sent players annually to the World Masters, World Women's Singles, World Youth Masters, Nations Cup, World Professional, World Pairs, World Match Play, and other international events
- -- named an Official ADO Travel Agency, and been instrumental in establishing favored airline, rental car and hotel rates for traveling darters

#### The ADO continues in its efforts to:

- -- encourage additional sponsorship/media coverage for the sport
- -- organize darts for the handicapped
- -- establish an ADO National Darts League
- -- develop and make available an 'ADO Seminar' to assist local member organizations with the administration and operation of local league and tournament related activities
- -- assist in the promotion and coordination of darts among US Armed Forces personnel
- -- develop a comprehensive, equitable system for player ranking/selection

So "what's the ADO doing for me, the player?" Actually, quite a bit. And, at hardly any cost "to me, the player". When your organization maintains membership in the ADO, the average cost per person is under \$1.00 per year....about the cost of one glass of beer!!

If your club hasn't joined the ADO, urge them to do so. The cost verges on the ridiculous; the benefits verge on the spectacular.

#### FROM THE DESK OF S. U. OMYNONA

Well the new board members have been elected and have now taken office in the Dayton Dart Association. I would like to mention a few things that should be looked into while the association moves into the decade of the 1990's.

Firstly, lets look into the feasibility of having as association office to work from. This would provide an anchor spot for the DDA even as the Officers and board members change from year to year. A place to locate our property and central location for sending and receiving information for the membership. Maybe even a live person to man the phones on league nights. (Anybody out there got an office or space they could donate to the cause?)

Other leagues around the country have developed a yearly calendar for their membership and seems like one of the best ideas I've seen. This calendar would cover all of the important dates for the year including our play-offs, league start-up, ADO play-offs, summer golf outing, family picnic and major tournaments in our locality. Each year we compete in the Quad City Challenge and having the dates of qualification at the beginning of the season would certainly precipitate a good turnout for this event. As you notice I've mentioned a summer family picnic and sounds like a great time for alla the members to meet each other for a fun time. We might even; have a dart tournament outside, using wooden darts that might fly a little off line in order to even up the competition. Maybe a tourney for the small fry as well.

Another thought for the board members to contemplate is a possible trip to one of the tournaments ie: Windy City open in Chicago. lf we could make arrangements for a bus trip it's possible we could see a large DDA contingent at one of the big ones. In any case sounds like one hell of a party weekend. As long as we're talking trips how about a DDA Reds or Bengals sponsored trip. Of course the DDA would not have to pay for it as the members I'm sure would cover the costs. Might look nice up on the big scoreboard in Riverfront Stadium that the Dayton Dart Association has arrived.

Now for the one event that I would like to attend would be the Dayton Dart Association Golf Outing. Many of the members of our fine organization play this game and seems like a natural for our association. Let's look into the possibility of same.




