Randy and I experienced God's prevenient grace when we were invited to Emmaus nine years ago. He knew that in a few years Randy would be diagnosed with cancer and we would have many needs. He blessed us with a group of people who said yes to the promptings to be the body of Christ by bringing food to our children and parents while we were in Little Rock for many weeks. A group that embodied Christian action by sending cards, emails, texts and letters of encouragement at just the right time; who prayed and prayed and prayed some more; who cut our grass and raked our yard; who flew our children to see us over Thanksgiving and gave them a ride back home (even giving up their seat for one of them); who made sure that we had a yummy Thanksgiving dinner far from home; who packed up every single thing in our house in a very orderly fashion and helped us moved; who provided when times were tight; and so many other ways. I am always overwhelmed by the love of Christ at Emmaus. However, the body of Christ has inundated us with love and encouragement outside of camp. Just as we did nothing to deserve this love, your discipleship has given us a picture of Christ's extravagant love for us that we could never earn on our own. What a blessing it is to be part of such an awesome priesthood of believers!

I am also thankful for what God has done in my heart since my Emmaus walk. He knew my priorities were not where they should be and that I needed to grow through study. He put in my heart a desire to strive for a life of piety. Having back and neck surgery fifteen years ago and then Randy's cancer has taught me much about perseverance. In addition, He knew that I needed grace – lots of it!

I am so grateful for Emmaus and all of the many ways that it has touched my life! I pray that the ladies of Walk 164 will be overwhelmed by the love of Christ and that they will know this joy. This walk just might be God's prevenient grace for one of them. A huge thank you to everyone who is giving of their time to pray, serve or just be a part of Walk 164! May you be richly blessed for all you do!





The Theology of I Clap

Last year, the Emmaus board voted to adopt abbreviated claps for Emmaus introductions. Aside from saving time at closing when many introductions are made, there are other reasons why the vote makes sense. You are invited to consider the theology behind a single clap:

1 clap is far more mysterious than many. John Wesley used the word mystery a fair amount, especially related to faith. The mystery of our faith is something he rarely apologized for. Mystery should be celebrated. Anyone can applaud the traditional fashion, but distinct organizations are wise to be set apart. One clap immediately communicates to new pilgrims at sendoff that there will be something mysterious and uniquely original about the upcoming weekend experience.

Too much clapping may appear insincere. Any group welcomes honorees with standard applause. As guest speakers are introduced, when people are recognized by awards, a large crowd all claps randomly until each participant decides that's enough. At the end of tiring, consecutive introductions, apologies for half-hearted enthusiasm are as necessary as any clapping redo. We wouldn't want to risk differentiating the level of reception among many introductions. One clap avoids this problem when people commit to one strong clap. Why hurt anyone's feelings by clapping more for some and less for others? Give everyone a single clap, and avoid the problem all together.

1 clap is less tiring. Jesus promises rest for the weary (Matthew 11:28).

When several introductions are made one after the other, subsequent receptions become less and less enthusiastic. Should you really feel guilty your clapping volume is waning with so much clapping to do? No need to be tired - I can motivate my hands into one strong clap. I know they'll get to rest in a half second! The energy you save can be reallocated to cleaning toilets, cutting 38 tomatoes in the kitchen, or whatever else God called you to do.

1 clap is consistent with other Emmaus principles. Let's face it-we do things differently at Emmaus. We worship on Saturday evenings, set our alarm at 3 am to pray for a half hour, clean toilets for people we have never met, and hide in the dark to sing to strangers. If we are going to honor all these crazy marks of discipleship, why not set the tone at the first introduction with the one slap clap?
