## · How long have you been in the building engineer trade?

I have been in the building engineer trade for 14 years. I started working at the Hyatt Regency in Columbus, Ohio and then traveled to various locations in the United States and to Toronto, Canada. My positions included Director of Engineering, Assistant Director, and Project Manager. After leaving the hospitality industry, I went to work for Pearl and now work for Travis Commercial. ## · Any awards, recognition, or special training?

I have received a few awards over the years, but the best recognition I received was from the Hyatt and the New Orleans Mayor's office after Hurricane Katrina.
