**INTRODUCTION:** This application is for Hurricane Harvey CDBG-DR **Infrastructure** funding. It is created to be used for infrastructure activities needed to fulfill an unmet need resulting from the Hurricane Harvey disaster declaration.

To be eligible for funding, all activities must have documented proof of an impact by the DR-4332 disaster declarations of 2017 and allowed under the State of Texas Action Plan for Disaster Recovery. CDBG-DR funds must be used for disaster-related expenses in the most impacted and distressed areas. An activity underway prior to a Presidential disaster declaration will not qualify unless the disaster impacted the project.

Once disaster-related impact to infrastructure, housing, and economic revitalization in the HUD and State identified most impacted and distressed areas has been established and assessed, Applicants are required to provide sufficient detail about each proposed project to identify the National Objective, the population that will receive benefit, the estimated costs and materials needed, the projected schedule to completion, any potential environmental impact, and other details specific to the type of project involved. **Please be thorough in completing this application to ensure prompt review.**

Due to the extreme amount of rainfall caused by Hurricane Harvey that fell in the City of Shiner and across Lavaca County during the month of August 2017, the City continues to face physical and economic losses beyond the jurisdiction's financial capability of recovery. Shiner does not have the funds to correct the numerous drainage problems within the City.

The City of Shiner experienced flooding across the City. According to the National Weather Service, portions of Bastrop, Fayette, Lee, Lavaca and Gonzales counties received over 20 inches of rain from Hurricane Harvey. The City of Shiner received 20 inches of rain and led to flooded roadways. Heavy winds caused downed trees and some structural damage.

Shiner is a City in Lavaca County, Texas with a population of 2,088. There are 784 households in the city with an average household size of 2.56 persons. 22.7% of households in Shiner are renters. The City does not currently have any subsidized housing.

Participants review current floodplain ordinances for opportunities to increase resiliency (above current standards) such as modifying permitting or building codes. Mitigation efforts also address NFIP compliance, and public awareness.

The City of Shiner is steadily working towards making the community more flood aware and constructing drainage structures to prevent hazardous flooding events for the future. Construction of this project will:

- (1) repair the damage sustained during Hurricane Harvey flooding;
- (2) reduce the risk of flooding of homes; and
- (3) reduce the flooding of project area streets, and allow passage of emergency vehicles in heavy rain events; and
- (4) protect post-disaster investments in residential, commercial, and public infrastructure facilities in the area.
- 2. Describe how the proposed project coordinates with local and regional planning efforts to ensure consistency with and promote community-level and/or regional post-disaster recovery and mitigation planning.

Lavaca County's Hazard Mitigation Plan is a multi-jurisdictional plan. The participating jurisdictions include Lavaca County, and the Cities of Hallettsville, Moulton, Shiner, and Yoakum. These jurisdictions provided valuable input into the planning process.

3. Describe how the proposed project integrates mitigation measures into rebuilding activities and achieves objectives outlined in community-level and/or regional post-disaster recovery and mitigation planning to reduce future risk.

The City of Shiner participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). In continuance of compliance with the NFIP, particiants work with neighboring jurisdictions to advance the goals of the Hazard Mitigation Action Plan as it applies to ongoing, long-range planning goals and actions for mitigating risk to natural hazards throughout the planning area. Improving bridges and drainage culverts to prevent flood damages and ensure emergency access after a storm event is an identified action in the Plan for all jurisdictions.

4. Describe the cost and benefit analysis used in the selection of the proposed project and how they inform community-level and/or regional post-disaster recovery and mitigation planning.

The selection of this area and, specifically, the identified project sites, was based on the impact of Hurricane Harvey, the consideration of unmet need after FEMA funds were requested for recovery activities, and the long-term integration of City needs based on the understanding that this project is part of a programmatic approach to implement recovery, and mitigation efforts defined in the Lavaca County Hazard Mitigation Action Plan. While detailed cost-benefit analyses were beyond the scope of the post-disaster recovery and mitigation planning effort, Planning Team members utilized economic evaluation as a determining factor between actions.

5. Describe how the proposed project will avoid disproportionate impact on vulnerable populations and create opportunities to address economic inequities facing the local community.

The area of the proposed project is made up of predominantly LMI households. Subject to repeated flooding, the area will benefit from the impact of this project which will help prevent flooding to homes and other structures, and will help prevent the economic loss of flooded/impassable roadways in this LMI area.

6. Describe now the proposed project aligns with investments from other state or local capital improvements and infrastructure developmen

Modifications to the concrete mixture can provide additional lifespan and strength or flexibility. Engineering will determine the appropriate technologies based on function and cost.


