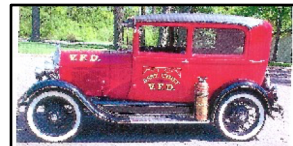

A video was presented to highlight Dave's work with cars and the set up of the museum. Several antique cars were on display to view. The next stop was at the Seed Savors museum a beautiful edifice. A tour into the gardens was canceled due to the weather. The staff presented information about the ongoing research conducted at this facility. This is the only museum of this kind in the U.S. We stopped at "What's New Antique Shop" Lots of things to look at or purchase inside and out.

On to The Wildberry Winery, with more rain falling so the outside walk among the vines was cancelled. The staff presented a video and told us about their vineyard. We tasted several wines - then purchased. A scenic drive back to Decorah to the Dunning Springs, Dave took pictures of each car with the rushing Springs in the background. After dinner Dave and Cathy had them developed and handed them out to each of us. Thanks guys! Took a tour of the Brick Kiln building at the Phelps Park. On to T-Bocks for dinner and the Country Inn where we stayed. We left the next morning with Judy n Walt leading us through the hills and valleys to the Bily Clock museum and Antonin Dovork exhibits at Spillville. The clocks were elegantly hand carved by brothers Joseph and Frank Bily. Then we stopped at "The Fort" at Ft. Atkinson where Terry met us and told us about the history of the Fort, the Winnebago Indian tribes and the Military. The Military station was used to keep peace between native tribes. Onto the Worlds Smallest Church at Festina. The Church seats 8 people. There is also a cemetery around the church and Terry says there are Indians buried there also. Around the corner from there was a Indian settlement with around 240 Indian children in a school. The next stop was at the German American Museum at St. Lucus, a delicious lunch was served by the historical society. A huge museum about the lives of immigrants and military were on display illustrating that area many years ago. On to the Country View Dairy. A family operation with Original and Greek Yogurt is made with Country Fresh Goodness by a Mennonite's couples dream. Dan Howard greeted us , told us how this was started, gave us a tour and then we were treated to taste the healthy, natural, creamy and delicious yogurt. The flavors were vanilla, peach and salty carmel. The favorite seemed to be peach. Many returned for seconds. Many in the group inquired about it coming to the MN. area. ## A Well Known Car To Many Members Of The TCMAFC Finds A New Home.

My name is Micheal Farley. I live in Bismarck, ND with my wife Jennifer, and my two kids: 10-year-old Nathan and 5-year-old Andrew. I've met several of you over the years at either Back to the 50's or the TCMAFC fall fairgrounds show. Many of you also knew my grandfather, Bill Bragg, from his attendance several years at the annual Pancake Breakfast.

Ray Bragg's Coupe and I go back quite a few years, 36 years in fact. My first ride in the rumble seat came when I was four years old. Ray had made his first trip with the Coupe from Anoka, MN to his hometown in Wahpeton, ND where I lived. Ray made several trips to Wahpeton in the 1990's in the Coupe, and that's when I really developed my love for the A. Ray taught me the art of setting points and timing, greasing zerks and speedometer cables, shimmying the rear hubs, and changing oil among other things. Ray's coupe was the first manual transmission vehicle I drove when I was 16, and I took to double-clutching in short order.

In 1998, Ray assisted my grandfather in purchasing a 1929 Tudor Sedan from Lamberton, MN, that was restored but somewhat unassembled. Ray, grandpa, and I (along with another local Wahpeton man) put the Tudor together over that summer and got it running well. When grandpa purchased the car, the rear end was in upside down, and he had three reverse gears and one forward gear! I have photos of grandma and grandpa sitting on milk crates going around the block in "reverse". The next day, we pulled the rear end, spun it in the air 180 degrees, and put it back in. Then we were in business! My grandpa passed away in 2009, and his Tudor went to Minot, ND, to his son Bill Jr. until 2017, when I purchased the Tudor and brought it to Bismarck.

In later years, Ray and I would attend car shows with either his Corvette or the A and also enjoyed several drives. Our last trip together in his Coupe was in July 2013 to St. Francis, MN and return. Ray was so satisfied with how the car ran that day, and it's a trip I will always hold dear. The car would be put away that fall, for what would end up being almost six years.

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019, when I was able to purchase Ray's Coupe from Miriam and brought it to Bismarck. In the rain, we loaded the Coupe into the trailer with me, my wife, and Miriam pushing from behind, and my son Nathan steering. The next day, we arrived in Bismarck, unloaded, and within a few hours the Coupe was running like a top again. New battery, fresh gas, oil change, air in the tires, water in the radiator, and she took right off. In the future, we hope to attend a Pancake Breakfast or a fall trip in Wisconsin with the TCMAFC. Maybe even a national meet.

In my opinion, Ray did one of the most important things he could have done, and that was pass the love and knowledge of the Model A on to the next generation, which I now get to do with my two sons. My sons have so much fun with these cars, whether it be in the garage, on rides, or at shows. Nathan is already an expert at changing oil, and Andrew is a master at hand signals and always sits on the left side behind me. I have met many Model A owners here in Bismarck, and they are generous with their knowledge, assistance and parts. If you are ever in town, look me up and let's go for a ride!

We were flexible and jumped at the chance to drive to Russ and Lois Agrimson's house.

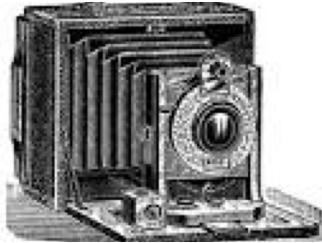
We enjoyed seeing their yard full of daisies, projects that Russ is working on and both of their collectibles.

### The rules are as follows:

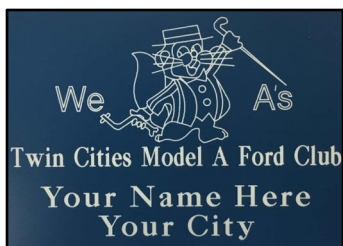
Submit any photos that were taken from November 1st. of 2018 until October 31st. of 2019.
