We recommend to all members that, when you get your **annual flu shot**, you also get the latest **COVID booster** shot. The CDC says that the COVID virus is in a transitional phase in the US, becoming "endemic" instead of "pandemic". This means that the desease is still around but not at a level that is causing significant disruption in our daily lives. The seasonal flu is endemic. We will <u>not</u> be hosting a flu shot clinic this year at Post 346.

Hey parents and grandparents of Auxiliary and SAL junior members! Please remember that when your child reaches age 18 they automatically become senior members of our Post and will then need to pay adult yearly dues (Auxiliary \$40, SAL \$30). Example: Juniors born on or AFTER Jan 1, 2005 are junior members for 2023. Juniors born on or BEFORE Jan 1, 2005 are considered senior members for 2023, and will be asked to pay adult dues.

Many people believe they are too smart to be taken in by a scam. But they miss a key point.

Scammers try to bypass your intellect and rely on psychological and emotional manipulation. Specifically they weaponize universal human instincts such as fear, loss, love and trust. Here are some of their techniques for calls, texts, and emails:

They establish camaraderie. Scammers will parrot back their target's religion, political affiliation, military background or life situation to get the target to feel that "he's just like me." Thereby establishing trust. Cont.>

Scams cont. They play on your aversion to loss. Many people have deep seeded fear of missing out (FOMO) on opportunities. The criminal creates a sense of uniqueness for an idea, or a dwindling availability of a product or service. YOU MUST BUY NOW!

They flatter you. Usually at the beginning it's a lot of praise for their victim. This lends itself to a sense of connection and trust. Your brain says "If this person likes me, then I can trust them."

They make you feel anxious. We live in an age of anxiety where there are many actual fears. It's pretty easy to get people to say "okay, what do I have to do to make this problem go away?"

They create instant terror. When you're afraid the emotional part of your brain takes over the cognitive part. In such moments of powerful emotion you are far more likely to believe what the caller is saying and to fall for a scam such as a loved one in danger.

They seduce you. In a romance scam, as in a real relationship, you'll have reciprocating self-disclosures. I'll tell you a little bit about me and in return you tell me a little bit about you. And as we go further down that path we disclose more personal things and that creates a sense of closeness, trust and even love.

They intimidate you. They present themselves as an authority figure (police, IRS, Medicare rep, etc.). Technology now makes it easy to pretend to be someone you're not. Criminals can program a caller ID so that your phone will say "Oakland County Sheriff's Office" for example.

How to stay rational when a scammer tries to rattle you. Monitor your reactions to calls from strangers. Do you feel agitated, are you getting anxious or angry? If the answer is yes, get out of the situation immediately. If a caller says that you MUST ACT NOW! It's a scam, HANG UP! Or just say "I will not do this by phone, send a letter, goodbye." Then hang up re-center yourself, leave the room, take a deep breath and calm down. Look at the situation like an outsider. Never make an immediate impulse decision no matter how urgent a caller says the situation is. Wait at least 24 hours to allow your emotions to subside before considering opening your wallet. Get advice from a person you trust. Merely discussing the situation out loud helps bring rationality back.

In 2020 fraud related complaints to the FTC against P2P (person to person) apps such as Venmo, Zelle and PayPal, ballooned 427%. In 2021 Americans lost over \$6.9 billion to fraudsters, including \$337 million in online shopping and non-delivery scams, according to the FBI. If you were the victim of a scam, remember you are not 'stupid', you didn't 'fall for' anything, you were manipulated. And you are not alone.

Happy New Year to all! In service, Marya Davis, Commander







Membership **Eligibility**



Legion membership eligibility. Veterans or active duty military who have served at least one day of active duty in the US Armed Forces since December 7, 1941 and have been honorably discharged or are still serving. Must present a DD-214 (DD-217, DD-256, or DD-257).

Auxiliary membership eligibility. 1) Relationship to veteran: Grandmother, mother, sister, daughter, grand-daughter, male or female spouse, or self (for female veterans). Per IRS regulations, step-relatives are not eligible. The IRS only allows two degrees of a blood line, so great granddaughters and beyond are not eligible. 2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.

SAL membership eligibility. 1) All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons. 2) Potential member must be related to a *living* veteran by one of the relationships stated AND veteran is a current member of the American Legion. OR, potential member is related to a *deceased* veteran who served at least one day of active service during eligible time periods (Apr. 6, 1917 to Nov. 11, 1918 and any time after Dec. 7, 1941) and was honorably discharged. Deceased veteran does not have to have been a member of the American Legion.
