We are hoping the road program is underway soon. This year all the contractors are busy and we anticipate the work will continue into winter and possibly spring. We are still trying to add to the program this year which will depend on additional sources of funding. We will continue to do sewer rehab on the city mains as well as increased sewer maintenance. We are currently working on the southwest side of the city starting at Forest Grove and working north jetting as well as using the sewer camera for inspection.

We get many questions on our point of sale in Willowick. We have had a large number of house and business sales in the city and there always seems to be some confusion. Willowick requires a sewer dye test, sidewalk and apron block inspection, and fire and CO2 alarm inspection. The sewer dye test is the only way we can be sure our sanitary and

storm sewers are not crossed on the private property side and as we all know this is very important. We are trying to keep the sanitary sewer from surcharging with rainwater during a hard and fast storm. This is why our basements flood and is the time we can require a private property to comply with a new owner. This is also the way we maintain our many miles of city sidewalks. One of the reasons why Willowick is a great family place is that we have 99% sidewalk coverage. Concrete has a life span especially in a northeast climate with freezing and thawing. The Fire Department would do the inspections for Fire and CO2 detectors before COVID 19, but we have since utilized an affidavit that states the seller

guarantees that they exist and are in working order. This is all done for the protection and safety of the city and its residents.

I would like to also clear up some information at the Building Department regarding contractors. The city maintains a contractor list to let people know who is registered with the city in any given year. Contractors have to register if they are doing any work in the city, even if the homeowner pulls the permit. This gives our residents recourse if the contractor does not perform their contractual duties. The city requires the contractor to be bonded and pay into Ohio Workman's Compensation when they register. The contractor in no way is an endorsement by the City of Willowick as to how well they perform their work, only that they are registered.

There will be two ballot issues this November for the City of Willowick. One is the Recreation Department renewal levy. This levy was first passed in 1986 and collects just over \$60,000 a year. This amount will not change or increase your property tax. It is a vital part of our recreation budget. Our Recreation Department is what makes Willowick an outstanding city to live in and raise a family. The other amendment will allow zoning changes without going to the ballot. With the retail climate ever changing we may have to move fast to gain a new business. Zoning may be what deters a business if the location they are looking at is not zoned for their needs. Going to the ballot could take longer than a year or cost the city thousands of dollars to have a special election.

In most cases, these days, the business owner chooses another location in a different city that accommodates their needs. Our new process would allow us to be able to change the zoning, if the city wants to do so, in 3 months or less. The process would put the business in front of Willowick Planning Commission, which is made up of volunteers who live in Willowick. After a hearing in the Planning Commission, it would then go to City Council for three readings so that the public has ample opportunity to voice their opinion. This would put us in line with the cities around us. It has proven quite successful in bringing in new business.

On June 22, Police Chief Turner held an informal talk at Willowick Beach Park on Cresthaven Drive to update the residents there about the carjacking that took place a few weeks earlier. It was nice to see so many people there - probably around 50 showed up - and have them ask questions during the meeting and come up to me after the meeting and introduce themselves. It's nice to put faces to the names of residents.

Coming up in November there will be two important issues on the ballot for Willowick residents.

The first is a .5 mil levy renewal for the Park and Recreation Department. We have one of the premier Park and Rec departments in the county. The programs we offer and our facilities are second to none. Director Julie Kless does an outstanding job running the department and this levy renewal will allow our parks and facilities to be a major ***draw*** to our city.

The second issue on the ballot will be referendum zoning. This issue deals with businesses who want to come to our city but need to have the location they are moving into to be zoned differently than it currently is. The current process requires the zoning change to go to the ballot to be voted on which can take upwards of 18 months, depending on the timing of the next election. This can cause businesses to go elsewhere. The issue on the ballot in November, if passed, will speed up the process and allow the Planning Commission and City Council to make changes to zoning so businesses can move here and get set up quicker.

Nominations Sought for Lake County Senior Citizens Hall of Fame

The Lake County Council on Aging is seeking nominations for the Lake County Senior Citizens Hall of Fame. Established in 1994, the Hall of Fame is a tribute to seniors who have generously given their time and energy to improve the quality of life in their communities or the county at large. Their contributions can be from their professional lives, or through volunteer work.

Judging will focus on the nominee's contributions toward improving the community or the lives of others. An independent panel will then select the top nominees for induction on October 7, 2021 during the Council on Aging's Annual Awards Presentation and Luncheon.

"Each year we recognize contributions made by older persons in the county. These extraordinary individuals work as volunteers, serve as role models, or use their talents to help others," said Joe Tomsick, CEO of the Lake County Council on Aging. "There certainly is no shortage of Lake County seniors who have been incredible contributors in their communities."

Nomination forms for the

Senior Citizens Hall of Fame are due by August 13, 2021 and can be returned to the Council on Aging, 8520 East Avenue, Mentor, OH 44060.

Induction will be held during the Council on Aging's Annual Awards Presentation and Luncheon which will be held on October 7, 2021.

Nominating Criteria

- Each Nominee must be age 60 or older.
- Nominee must have been a resident of Lake County, Ohio for the past 5 years.
- An individual or couple who – as a senior citizen (60 or older) – has had significant impact on an individual, organization or community.
- This individual or couple may have an impact on another person, organization or community through his/her employment, civic or volunteer activities since age 60.

Who May Nominate / Eligibility

- A person, group, business or organization may nominate individuals.
- Self-nominations are not

Lakeland Distributes Another Round of Emergency Funding to Students

Lakeland Community College will distribute another round of emergency grants to eligible students. As of July 7, 2021, over \$2.8 million has already been given directly to Lakeland students to help defray costs associated with college.

The funding comes via the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERF) that provides COVID-19 relief to students under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act and the American Rescue

Plan. Students may use the grant toward the cost of attendance, or for emergency costs that they've incurred due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, medical and mental health care, technology or child care.

The grants are available to all enrolled students (excluding College Credit Plus). Students do not need to be a financial aid recipient to receive assistance but are encouraged to complete the 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine eligibility for additional federal, state and local funding opportunities.

Lakeland first distributed emergency grant funds in May 2020 through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES)

Act specifically intended to provide emergency financial aid grants to students. Many who rely on campus resources such as computer labs, Wi-Fi, food pantry, child care, etc., unexpectedly had additional costs in order to continue the semester entirely online.

The application for fall semester grants will be available Aug. 2, 2021. Lakeland's fall semester classes begin Aug. 21.






