It's hard to believe that school starts in just a few short weeks.

We are hoping the road program is underway soon. This year all the contractors are busy and we anticipate the work will continue into winter and possibly spring. We are still trying to add to the program this year which will depend on additional sources of funding. We will continue to do sewer rehab on the city mains as well as increased sewer maintenance. We are currently working on the southwest side of the city starting at Forest Grove and working north jetting as well as using the sewer camera for inspection.

We get many questions on our point of sale in Willowick. We have had a large number of house and business sales in the city and there always seems to be some confusion. Willowick requires a sewer dye test, sidewalk and apron block inspection, and fire and CO2 alarm inspection. The sewer dye test is the only way we can be sure our sanitary and

storm sewers are not crossed on the private property side and as we all know this is very important. We are trying to keep the sanitary sewer from surcharging with rainwater during a hard and fast storm. This is why our basements flood and is the time we can require a private property to comply with a new owner. This is also the way we maintain our many miles of city sidewalks. One of the reasons why Willowick is a great family place is that we have 99% sidewalk coverage. Concrete has a life span especially in a northeast climate with freezing and thawing. The Fire Department would do the inspections for Fire and CO2 detectors before COVID 19, but we have since utilized an affidavit that states the seller guarantees that they exist and are in working order. This is all done for the protection and safety of the city and its residents.

I would like to also clear up some information at the Building Department regarding contractors. The city maintains a contractor list to let people know who is registered with the city in any given year. Contractors have to register if they are doing any work in the city, even if the homeowner pulls the permit. This gives our residents recourse if the contractor does not perform their contractual duties. The city requires the contractor to be bonded and pay into Ohio Workman's Compensation when they register. The contractor in no way is an endorsement by the City of Willowick as to how well they perform their work, only that they are registered.

There will be two ballot issues this November for the City of Willowick. One is the Recreation Department renewal levy. This levy was first passed in 1986 and collects just over \$60,000 a year. This amount will not change or increase your property tax. It is a vital part of our recreation budget. Recreation Department is what makes Willowick an outstanding city to live in and raise a family. The other amendment will allow zoning changes without going to the ballot. With the retail climate ever changing we may have to move fast to gain a new business. Zoning may be what deters a business if the location they are looking at is not zoned for their needs. Going to the ballot could take longer than a year or cost the city thousands of dollars to have a special election. In most cases, these days, the business owner chooses another location in a different city that accommodates their needs. Our new process would allow us to be able to change the zoning, if the city wants to do so, in 3 months or less. The process would put the business in front of Willowick Planning Commission, which is made up of volunteers who live in Willowick. After a hearing in the Planning Commission, it would then go to City Council for three readings so that the public has ample opportunity to voice their opinion. This would put us in line with the cities around us. It has proven quite successful in bringing in new business.

On June 22, Police Chief Turner held an informal talk at Willo-Beach Park on Cresthaven Drive to update the residents there about the carjacking that took place a few weeks earlier. It was nice to see so many people there - probably around 50 showed up - and have them ask questions during the meeting and come up to me after the meeting and introduce themselves. It's nice to put faces to the names of residents.

Coming up in November there will be two important issues on the ballot for Willowick residents.

The first is a .5 mil levy renewal for the Park and Recreation Department. We have one of the premier Park and Rec departments in the county. The programs we offer and our facilities are second to none. Director Julie Kless does an outstanding job running the department and this levy renewal will allow our parks and facilities to be a major ****draw**** to our

The second issue on the ballot will be referendum zoning. This issue deals with businesses who want to come to our city but need to have the location they are moving into to be zoned differently than it currently is. The current process requires the zoning change to go to the ballot to be voted on which can take upwards of 18 months, depending on the timing of the next election. This can cause businesses to go elsewhere. The issue on the ballot in November, if passed, will speed up the process and allow the Planning Commission and City Council to make changes to zoning so businesses can move here and get set up quicker.



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


