Rules for the November meeting Depression Glass Auction

Bidding will start at 7:00 P.M. with additional bidding for 15 minutes following the monthly meeting. There are **over 200 items** available. Items have been researched to the best of our ability to come up with the identification, value and starting bid. Some items have no value listed because such items are not known. It takes a lot of time to research and every effort has been made for the little time we had to do this. Items were not collected until October because of the lack of a chairperson. Each item has been checked for cracks and chips. If for some reason you find a crack or chip that we overlooked we will not hold you accountable for that purchase.

Angel's Place items are marked with **pink marker** at the top of the biding sheet. Proceeds from these items will go directly to Angel's Place as requested by the donor of the items. All other item profits go directly to the club.

No item will start lower than \$1.00 and bidding will be in \$1.00 increments only.

A **special mystery bag section** is available. The first number of members to fill in the lines on the sheet will be entitled to pick a mystery bag. Contents will be unknown to the members. \$1.00 will be the cost for any bag. Something like a grab bag from a penny party. Bags will be awarded as members pay for their winning bids. Items vary. No bag will be less than \$1.00 in value.

Items will be paid by **check or cash** to treasurer. Items must be paid for before packing. You will be responsible for collecting your items and packaging them after payment is made. A copy of the number of your items won will be given to you after payment to help you collect such items or items. If help is needed we will be more than happy to assist. Each item is individually numbered for easy claiming.

Boxes and packaging will be stored under the table where item was displayed for easy access. Use these boxes and packaging. Additional bags will be available at check out table.

No props or stands are to be removed from the tables. They are on loan. **Take only item won** unless specified.

Most important...it takes time to add up winning bid. Please know that every effort will be made to make this time as smooth and quick as possible. **We ask for your patience.**
