

Living our Faith Every Single Day

In January our Diocese will be starting a new way of studying our faith through a program called ALPHA. If you are not aware of what this is, it is really quite simple. **ALPHA** is a tool used to start conversation about having and growing a relationship with Jesus Christ. Our Youth Ministry Program has been using this since June 15th with remarkable success. During the summer (even with Covid happening) we have had 30+ youth meeting in 7 different small groups having conversation about their faith— 30+ youth every two weeks for the past 3 months!! These conversations have being the most beautiful and wonderful thing I have been a part of since I started at SPX. There have been conversations from as silly as "If you had 24 hours with unlimited money and resources, what would you do?" to as serious as

"Where is a place that you can talk about faith?" We have discussed the morality of birth control and current events that are happening in this world when it comes to the Black Lives Matter movement. We, as a parish staff, are really hoping that you would pray about being involved in one of these small groups come January as it will give you an opportunity to really reflect and discuss what it means to have a personal relationship with Christ and how to live it out in our day to day lives. The amount of growth I have seen in these youth over that past 3 months has been astronomical as they are given a safe place to think critically while also discuss tough issues without judgment on their point of view. My prayer is that you prayerfully consider joining a small group when the time comes.
