Friendly Reminders

The trash pick-up day is on Thursdays unless there is a holiday, in which case service will run one day behind throughout the holiday week, beginning with services scheduled for the holiday. The holiday schedule applies to recycling as well.

Recycling is every other Thursday; in March, recycling days are the 14th & 28th. It might be a good idea to mark your calendars for every other week throughout the year.

The following is a list of <u>non-recyclable</u> materials and should not end-up in your recycling containers: Styrofoam, plastic bags, wrappers, food, electronics, construction & yard waste, diapers, soiled paper, medical items, tools & toys.

What can be recycled: cardboard, metal cans, paper, plastic containers.

However, remember to empty, clean and dry what you recycle.

keep all recyclables free of food and liquid. Keep it Loose, meaning never put recyclables in bags or containers other than the recyclable bin from Republic Services.

Please don't forget to bring your trash and recycling containers in (out of sight from the street) after service the same day.

Snow Removal

This year we have had more snow stick around longer than normal, with a lot of melting and freezing, leading to very treacherous walking conditions in the neighborhood.

Please be considerate of your neighbors (not to mention the liability issue), and shovel the snow from your sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of a snowfall.

Be neighborly and if you have a snowblower, running it an extra few feet down the sidewalk will be remembered by those who live nearby.

No one wants to break a bone or your wallet by slipping & falling on your property. There are fines & service charges associated with non-compliance by the city of Aurora.

If any portion of your street remains icy or ice packed, you can call the Streets Division of the City of Aurora @ 303-326-8200. In addition, and for safety, remember to keep your garage doors closed, and no puffing!
