







CHEWIE, WE'RE HOME

In a not-so-far-away galaxy known as Disney's Hollywood Studios, *Star Wars* has found its new base. With new rides and interactive adventures, there's no shortage of fun to be found here. The question isn't necessarily what to do (Hint: all of it), but how to do it best? The key is simply prioritizing what you want to do and taking enough respites at the cantina to get you through until the fireworks at the end of the day.

PATIENCE, YOUNG PADAWAN

For young *Star Wars* fans, there is no better experience than the chance to be as brave as Rey and Finn by training in the ways of the Force. Jedi Training: Trials of the Temple delivers the chance for young padawans (ages 4-12) to don the iconic brown robes and take up light-sabers against the Dark Side. The apprentices will train with a Jedi before they face fearsome opponents including Darth Vader and a new villain, the Seventh Sister Inquisitor from the Disney XD series *Star Wars Rebels*.

Be sure to register to participate before the show. Avoid disappointment by registering immediately upon entering the park, as spots are limited. Registration is located at the Indiana Jones Adventure Outpost near Echo Lake.

STAY ON TARGET

Since you're already near the lake, continue around it and into Animation Courtyard to the all-new *Star Wars* Launch Bay. *Star Wars* Launch Bay features exhibits, costumes and characters that immerse visitors into the world of both the light and the dark side of the Force. The attraction is home to a Star Destroyer-themed area and a Rebel Base, complete with the cast of characters you'd expect in each, so choose carefully.

Visitors to the launch bay will find replica props, models, behind-the-scenes videos, costumes and much more. While exploring, seek out Chewbacca for a photo. Or, if you're bold enough, move past the Stormtroopers to try for a picture with Darth Vader. The bravest of visitors may even venture through the portal to meet Kylo Ren on the bridge of his First Order Star Destroyer, the newest area feature that opened in February.

Take a break from the excitement in Launch Bay Theater to watch the short, moving film that celebrates the Star Wars saga and its creators. Before you move on, be sure to snap a selfie on an Imperial speeder bike and grab some special merchandise at Launch Bay Cargo, including a lightsaber umbrella.

If you plan your timing carefully, you can watch as the First Order's Captain Phasma orders a squad of Stormtroopers into formation to march from *Star Wars* Launch Bay to the Center Stage. This demonstration of intimidating strength begins April 4 and coincides with the arrival of a new live show to be performed at Center Stage. *Star Wars*: A Galaxy Far, Far Away is a new stage show that will take place multiple times each day to bring visitors an even more exciting look at the stories they love.

The new show will feature live scenes to celebrate iconic moments from the films. The live entertainment will feature some of the saga's most memorable characters, including loyal Chewbacca, villain Darth Maul, and of course the nefarious Darth Vader and his corrupt grandson Kylo Ren.

ACROSS THE GALAXY

Do, or do not. There is no try. Rest assured, Disney did not disappoint Yoda with its latest incarnation of Star Tours, located across the park. Star Tours first launched in 1989, and in 2011 was reimagined as Star Tours – The Adventures Continue, a 3D motion-simulator with unique storylines and an expanded troupe of characters. Now, another evolution has arrived with new locations from *Star Wars*: The Force Awakens. Fans will find something unique to enjoy with each ride thanks to its multiple story combinations featuring favorite characters and destinations including Naboo, the Death Star and new favorites from the latest film.

Also in that area is the new *Star Wars*: Path of the Jedi. This attraction presents abridged scenes from the *Star Wars* saga, making it perfect for new fans who want to learn more about the other films, and for nostalgic long-time fans who can't get enough of the epic tales told in episodes I-VII.

Finish your day in a haze of explosions, but not from blown-up starships. The new Symphony in the Stars: A Galactic Spectacular fireworks show lights up the sky in time to *Star Wars* theme music. John Williams' moving compositions ignite the imagination as colors paint the skies.
