Inoperable Vehicles

- ⇒ 30 days to maintain the inoperable vehicle before in violation on private property
- ⇒ Must be registered and tagged
 - ⇒ Be in running condition
- ⇒ View Ordinance 550 located on our website

How we charge for water usage

Every customer pays a base charge (minimum) every month. This charge is \$20.25 and does not include any water usage. This charge is used to pay for the KDHE loan and maintenance towards the water system. Every customer pays this charge whether they use water or not every month as long as they have an account, and their water meter is turned on. Water usage is calculated by the 1000 gallon and the charge per 1000 gallons is currently \$8.15 per 1000 gallons. This is a separate charge from the base charge that is used to pay RWD 4 for the water usage, in which we purchase water from.

Dog Tags

Residents are reminded that all dogs 6 months and older are to be registered with the city every year by April 1st. Price for tags are \$10.00 per dog. After April 1st, the price increases to \$15.00 per dog.
