Kittitas County lifts burn ban

Kittitas County, WA - 10/01/2018 - Kittitas County is lifting the burn ban effective October 1, 2018. Fire District #1 will be maintaining the burn ban in their district.

Please use caution when burning or having campfires. Never leave a fire unattended, keep fires small and manageable, clear area around campfires and watch the embers, do not burn in windy conditions, make sure your campfire is 100% out before leaving, soak the fire pit area thoroughly with water, stir and repeat until the fire is cold.

BURN REGULATIONS

- ***NATURAL VEGETATION ONLY NO LARGER THAN 10 FT X 10 FT PILE. ANYTHING LARGER REQUIRES A PERMIT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY.***
- ***MUST BE ON MINERAL GROUND WITH FIRE RING***
- ***MUST HAVE A WATER SOURCE ON HAND AND FIRE EXTINGUISHING TOOLS***
- ***MUST BE AT LEAST 25 FEET FROM TREES, BRUSH AND PROPERTY LINES***
- ***IF LARGER THAN CAMPFIRE: MUST BE AT LEAST 50 FEET FROM ANY STRUCTURES***
- ***MUST BE ATTENDED***
- ***DO NOT BURN IF WINDS EXCEED 15 MPH***
- ***CALL DEPARTMENT OF ECOLOGY BEFORE BURNING TO CHECK ON AIR QUALITY AT 1.800.406.5322***
