FRONT WHEEL BEARING FAILURE

I often write my safety articles based on something I heard of that happened to another motorcyclist or something that happened to me. This article is about something that I experienced. I was on a day ride Wednesday when I began to feel some vibration in the handlebars of my 2008 GL1800 Honda Gold Wing. I immediately thought that this might be the front wheel bearings. I was going to check it out when I stopped for gas, which was close by. Before I got to the gas station I began to hear a plastic rubbing noise. The front plastic fender can telegraph the grinding noise of the worn bearing which is what I was hearing. I made it to the gas station and put the bike on the center stand so I could freely turn the front wheel. I could feel resistance in the wheel turning and when I put my ear against the plastic front fender and spun the front wheel, I could hear the vibration. Plastic front fenders will channel the vibration noise and make it easier to hear.

Front wheel bearings on most motorcycles are sealed. That means you cannot grease them at normal maintenance intervals. Every time you have a front tire replaced you should check, or have the mechanic check the condition of your front wheel bearings. If you are

not ready to remove the front wheel for a new tire, checking the bearings can be done by supporting the bike with the front wheel off the ground. Spin the wheel and see if you can feel any resistance or slack. Hold on to the opposite sides of the wheel with both hands. Shake the wheel to see if you feel any free play. Look at the bearing dust covers on both sides of the wheel at the axle for metal dust shavings. You could use a mechanic's stethoscope to listen at the axle as you spin the wheel for any grinding or strange noise. If the wheel is removed you could put your finger in the center of the bearings and spin the inner race feeling for any roughness in movement.

There is no set amount of mileage when front wheel bearings will fail. It all depends on the conditions the bike is ridden in. If you travel in a lot of wet conditions or ride on muddy dirt roads, your chances of front wheel bearing failure is increased. My bike has 102,000 miles on it and has been ridden on many cross country trips in the rain. I tend to keep my motorcycles for a long time and usually change the front wheel bearings around 100,000 miles when it is time to replace the front tire. I didn't need a front

tire yet which is why I had not changed this bike's front bearings as yet. Knowing the tell tale signs of front wheel bearing failure is what alerted me. Most motorcycles only have one wheel bearing on each side of the wheel. The Honda

GL1800 has two wheel bearings on each side of the wheel. That means when the outer bearing fails, the inner bearing will keep you from having instant loss of control. When one bearing fails it is time to replace all 4 bearings and 2 outer seals.

It would be safer to change your front wheel bearings early

rather than waiting for a dangerous mishap. The front wheel could lock up and you are going down. Preventative maintenance is the key to safe riding.

We are here to assist you with your training needs.

If anyone is nervous about the “public speaking” aspect of a presentation, I can help or, we may be able to team you up with an experienced presenter to be your co-presenter and mentor. No worries! **MARCH ALREADY? – IT’S
 RALLY TIME!**

I can’t believe it is March already. But, I am sure getting excited and ready for the Florida District Rally! I have volunteered to present a seminar which I am excited about. I am also excited about seeing old friends and making new friends at the Rally. I am excited to see what the vendors have. And, I just can’t wait to have so much **FUN!**

The Florida District HSI program is coming along. I have our instructors in place and am working on ordering supplies. We should be up and running very soon. If you or your fellow Chapter members are interested in taking a First Aid / CPR course, please let

your Chapter Director or me know.

Since the HSI course is base around CPR and the use of an AED I thought some information regarding heart health could be interesting. I found the following information in my AARP magazine. I thought it was interesting enough to share.

**4 QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR
 DOCTOR ABOUT YOUR
 HEART:**

Q: How’s my blood pressure?

Forty percent of Americans don’t know their blood pressure numbers and 64 percent don’t know what those numbers mean, a 2019 survey found. Normal blood pressure is less than 120/80. If that top number is 120 to 129, that’s “elevated”. If the top number is 130 or higher, or the bottom number is above 80, that’s considered “high”.

Q: What are my target cholesterol numbers and how do I measure up?

A total cholesterol level under 200 is considered normal, but the best levels of heart-threatening low-density lipoproteins (LDLs) and triglycerides depend on your age, gender and whether you have other heart risks like diabetes. No wonder half the people with high cholesterol in a recent survey said they were

confused about the best cholesterol level for them and how to get there.

Q: Can you refer me to a dietitian? **Fifty-nine** percent of heart doctors say nutrition help can improve heart health as much as medications do. But in a 2021 study, 71 percent of doctors admitted they refer fewer than 10 percent of their patients to a registered dietitian. If your doctor isn’t helpful, you can search for a dietitian in your area through the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, at eatright.org.

Q: Is it time to see a cardiologist? **Your** primary care doctor will likely refer you to a cardiologist if you have serious risk factors for heart disease. But speak up and ask about one if you have a family history of heart disease or a condition called hereditary cardiac amyloidosis, where specific abnormal proteins build up in the heart and other organs.

You know what they say – you need to be your own advocate when it comes to your health. Don’t be afraid to ask your doctor questions.
