STRUCTURED TEACHING MODEL
3 DAY TRAINING**

The Structured Teaching Model training is based upon the TEACCH Model, using evidenced-based strategies to create a framework for program service delivery. The intensive 3 day format focuses on understanding the characteristics of autism, classroom structure, communication, social, and play skills as well as problem solving behavior. Participants will:

- ❖ Apply STM model to create strategies for teaching academics, social, play and communication skills
- ❖ Use the principles of physical structure to design a classroom
- ❖ Use structure to create individualized student schedules and work systems
- ❖ Use the principles of visual organization and visual supports to create appropriate student tasks/assignments
- ❖ Devise strategies to assist their own students to learn more effectively and appropriately
- ❖ Use knowledge gained to problem solve student responses based on their autism traits
