

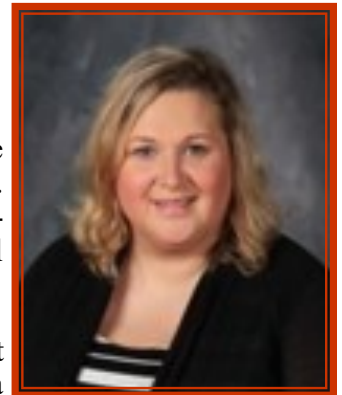

Honorary members shall not be entitled to vote in Association matters, to hold an office, or to serve on a committee.

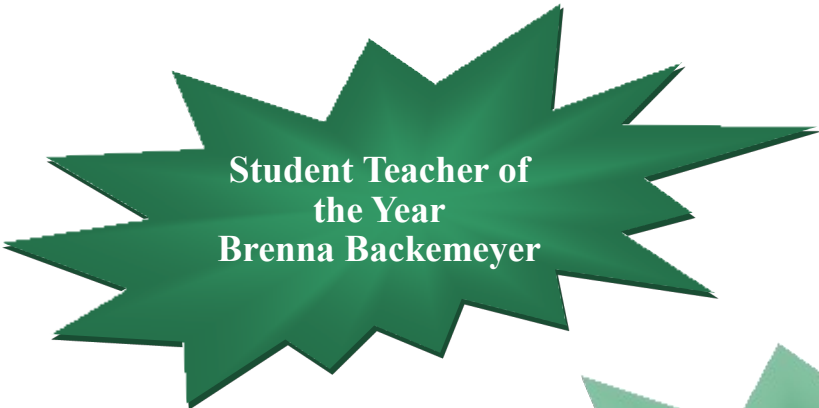
