

Don't Get Scammed!

Scammers are now posing as priests and other clergy. In this latest scam, you might receive an email that appears to be from your Pastor or another priest that you may know. The scammer would ask you to help someone in need by purchasing a gift card, and then providing the codes to that card to the scammer who is posing as clergy.

Here's how to protect yourself from being scammed:

- 1 Know that scammers are out there. Be suspicious of any request for funds of any type via an email message. Verify any request with a call to the person who supposedly sent it.
- 2 Know that any email from a priest should be from a diocesan or parish email account. Messages sent from free services, such as Gmail or Yahoo, are more likely to be scammers.
- 3 Know that priests will NEVER ask for financial transactions via email.


