Mardi Gras

The celebration of Mardi Gras is a tradition among many of the Chapters of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Incorporated. Alpha Omega Chapter presents its 62nd Annual Mardi Gras Ball with great pride and appreciation for the entertainment of Omega Brothers and their guest.

Mardi Gras is synonymous with fun, merriment – a last fling before the fasting and penitence of the Lenten Season. Masquerade balls, parades with decorated floats, music and colorful pageants are all a part of the festival of the Carnival Season which ends at midnight on Mardi Gras, the day before Ash Wednesday.

Many of the costumes of Mardi Gras date back to the pagan festivals of Ancient Rome. Masks and costumes were worn at these celebrations. This custom is alive today in Brazil, Italy, Mexico, Spain, Argentina, Germany and Trinidad. In the United States, the largest and most elaborate celebration of the festival of Mardi Gras remains in New Orleans.

It is traditional in New Orleans to begin celebrating the Carnival Season several weeks preceding Mardi Gras with balls and parades which are held almost daily. The parades are most noted for decorated floats, costumes, bands, and favors, "throws" of beads, Doubloons, etc. Random street masking, costumed persons, and dancing help make Mardi Gras in New Orleans a big rollicking party for throngs of happy people.

In recent years the wearing of formal attire to the ball has become common place, but the wearing of a costume is encouraged. This way you really get into the spirit of Mardi Gras and receive the most enjoyment of this festive occasion.

The costume can be fun and does not have to be expensive or elaborate. You may find just the right items from your trips to Africa, Mexico, Hawaii, Spain, Holland or other countries. If you did not wear a costume this year, consider it for next year. Come to Mardi Gras and have fun!!!

Mardi Gras represents a long history of perseverance, progress, good times for Brothers and their families, and Friendships revisited. It is the Mardi Gras Committee's goal to not only preserve and protect this legacy but to continue in this tradition of fundraising to assist college bound students with scholarship resources.

Mardi Gras is believed to have arrived in North America on March 3, 1699, when the French-Canadian explorer Pierre Le Moyne d'Iberville camped about 60 miles downriver from the future site of New Orleans. Knowing it was Fat Tuesday back in France, Iberville named the spot Point du Mardi Gras and held a small gala. A few years later, French soldiers and settlers feasted and wore masks as part of Mardi Gras festivities in the newly founded city of Mobile (present-day Alabama). To this day, Mobile claims to have the oldest annual Mardi Gras celebration in the United States.

Alpha Omega Chapter is one of the oldest and largest chapters in the Fraternity and was chartered on October 1, 1922. The Alpha Omega Social Action & Scholarship Foundation is the giving arm for Alpha Omega Chapter and was incorporated in 1992 as a non-profit 501[c][3] entity. The foundation is a recognized agency of the Combined Federal Campaign and functions as a Brotherhood of Men devoted to making a positive impact through the advancement and uplift of humanity in the areas of scholarship and social action. Over the past ten years, we have awarded more than \$170,000 in college scholarships. Without this vital assistance, many of these students would have no other means of debt-free financial assistance.

During his junior year in college Carroll worked as an intern at the Office of Naval Research. The following year, after receiving his Bachelor of Science Degree, he became the first black contract negotiator hired by the agency.



Carroll later served at the Defense Logistics Agency serving in a variety of positions before rising to become the first black director of the Defense Department's Hazardous Waste Environmental Contracting Activity.

In this position he managed a number of firsts; the introduction of automated computer systems in the environmental contracting activity, the introduction of ISO 2000 management practices into a federal contracting function and following these achievements he was able to achieve taxpayer savings by dosing three field offices across the country and consolidating activities in a central location. He also found time to earn a Master of Public Administration Degree from Western Michigan University while serving as director.

On at least one occasion he was summoned to appear before the U.S. Congress to testify as to the viability of the Department's Hazardous Contracting Activity.

Since his retirement in 1998, he has been a community activist, an ardent sailing enthusiast and a seasoned world traveler.






