

January 2020 Space Coast Quilt Guild General Meeting Minutes

9:30am meeting called to order and pledge of allegiance recited

Correspondence: thank you card received from Shirley and the Critters, Certificate of Appreciation received from Aging Matters, thank you card received from the Women's Center and the work that Sherrianne Larson does for them, thank you card received from Hospice of St Francis.

2019 First Baptist Church received \$600 in offerings and \$1127.29 in Food Pantry donations from the Guild.

Storage fees have gone up \$9.00 but we are grandfathered in and do not have to pay the additional fee.

Bylaw updates motion to approve from Cora Postlethwait seconded by Jan Seger approved by Guild.

Birthdays: Ellen Herring, Jo Charvet, Rosemary Earley, Eileen Guntner

Membership: Nita Eggers reported that we have 35 members present and 2 guests. Guests are Debbie Smith with Friends of Children and Patsy Thompson brought by Nita Eggers. 50 people have paid dues for 2020 and there are still several to pay.

Treasurer Report: Janet Romer reported that the Guild is in good standing. Motion to approve from Sherrianne Larson, seconded by Karen Martin and approved by the Guild.

Doris Andera introduced Debbie Smith with Friends of Children Brevard. Debbie thanked the Guild for having her. Friends of Children is a support agency for Guardian ad litem. She described the situation that the children go thru. Children from Sebastian to Mims over 1,000 children. They help to cover the gap between what the state provides and when financial aid comes in which sometimes can take 3-4 months. They strive for normalcy for the children. In 2019 they gave \$25,000 away to 220 kids. To donate there is information on flyers as well as information for the Superhero Run. The run is a fundraiser for programs for the children. Doris presented Debbie with a bright and cheerful quilt made and donated by Karen Martin as well as an embroidered doll that Karen made. Debbie thanked us for the quilt.

Doris Andera discussed donation items as follows:

Joyce Tesdall took 35 walker bags for donation to Stand Up for Elders for Christmas Gifts after Cracker Christmas. Cora Postlethwait with Highway Patrol has 30 out of 50 quilts needed for 2020. Quilt size needed is smaller than a twin and larger than a crib quilt. Sherrianne Larson with Hospice of St Francis needs 40"x40" size quilts. Sherrianne Larson also handles the Women's Center and they have 7 of 25 quilts so far for the year. Cindy Goodens spoke with Kimberly from BETA they are very appreciative of our donations. They have been promised 25 24"x24" quilts for 2020. Cindy also donated a dressing table to BETA and is making booties for the new Mothers to be. Doris has the bed size quilt for Aging Matters 2021 donation to raffle, it will be given in October 2020. Aging Matters also receives 100 stockings and 100 pillowcases from the guild. Cecelia Reid collects travel shampoos to add to the stockings. Karen Martin is working with the go cutter to complete the stockings which will be worked on during sit and sews, we will also work on having the items finished for BETA. We donated a quilt to the ROTC to raffle off as a fundraiser. A quilt was donated to Father Rob of St Gabriel's Church and the Pastor of First Baptist Church at the Blessing of the Quilts.

Doris has purchased batting on sale for our donation projects.

Doris discussed day trip to Maitland with The Great Outdoors and Judi Sierer. \$34.00 for trip Thursday January 30th. Doris will be working closely with Judi to schedule our bus trips as well because she does have a connection that will save us over \$500.00 on the costs of the bus. Doris is also planning a trip to the Quilt Expo in Lakeland and will follow up with more details.

Doris passed out a pile of quilts that need to be quilted and bound for members to work on.

Jan Brock discussed Fort Christmas Blue Grass Festival. One day event Saturday March 28th from 10-4. To participate the booth would cost \$25.00 and insurance would cost \$39.00. Jessica Gaudi motioned to approved, was seconded by and approved by the Guild

Sunshine Girl, Cindy Gooden reported that this month we have sent out 4 Birthday cards, 2 Sympathy cards and 1 Get Well card.

Sherrianne Larson drew names for the basket door prizes, winners were Katie Martin and Connie Duff

Karen Martin and Katie Martin are helping Jeanette Kidd with activities while she is out for medical needs. They are working on scheduling presenters and classes. So far class suggestions have been for One Block Wonder part II and a log cabin block.

Katie Martin passed out Block of the Month due at the February general meeting. Block is called BQ5

Refreshments- Rita Lundy passed out sign up sheet for volunteers, there are still several spots available that need filled in.

Katie Martin presented Fat Quarter Winners - Jan Brock, Gaye Van Vorst, Joyce Tesdall and Janet Romer

Jan Brock thanked past officers for their work.

Cecelia Reid – Asked membership if there was interest in making a new Guild Cookbook, re-printing the past Cookbook etc. Guild agreed that it would be a good idea to gather information on the subject.

Laura Grimsley – Asked membership if they would be interested in a one-day trip to Sanford for a craft show in May. Laura will get more information.

Doris Andera discussed the opportunity quilts. The Star quilt is all in \$1 for 1 ticket or \$5 for 6 tickets. The patriotic quilt is our military giveaway. Anyone is allowed 2 tickets and they will write the initials of a service member that is living to receive the quilt.

Donation requests need to go to board then the board brings them to membership for approval. Janet Romer donated embroidered quilt for future raffle donation.

Laura Grimsley stated that there is a request in writing for a quilt donation to Project Graduation.

Dori Grimshaw suggested we make items with musical instruments for Blue Grass Festival.

Helping Hands: Karen Lee charges .02 per square inch edge to edge long arm sewing. Karen also does custom quilting, binding and can provide batting as well. Linda Smith does edge to edge long arm sewing for .013 per square inch. Linda also quilts donation quilts for the guild for \$15.00. Janet Romer can create embroidered personal labels for your quilts, prices will vary. Laure Grimsley charges .011 per square inch for edge to edge quilting for guild members only. June Barker can help with hand binding and sews labels on our donation items.

Jo Charvet hosting Show and Tell – Jo is setting new rule for show and tell, every item presented must be finished quilted and bound to participate. Jo will also be re-organizing the set up so that presenters can use the microphone and members do not have to turn around or strain their necks. Presenters: Janet Romer completed 3 quilts from heart block of the month for donation. Nancy Rader showed 2 quilts and pillows. Karen Martin showed baby doll which was swiftly grabbed/donated to Debbie Smith with Friends of Children. Janet Harrison shared 2 quilts with matching stuffed animal pillows. Dori Grimshaw – displayed hand quilted lap quilt that she has gifted to her mother. Joyce Tesdall brought in finished quilt from the Designer Challenge block, quilted by Linda Smith. Ellen Herring shared completed quilt, placemats, bag and 2 table runners. Sherrianne Larson shared finished table topper that she received from the Christmas Luncheon gift exchange. Doris Andera shared an embroidered Sunbonnet Sue quilt that she is donating to the guild, a wall hanging that will have lights added and will be donated to sell at Cracker Christmas as well as another quilt. Nancy Evans shared 5 quilts. Janet Romer donated 5 quilts one of which was a forgotten treasure from the Christmas Luncheon gift exchange, she also shared a large quilt that the kit was gifted to her by Nancy Smith when she was still with us. 


