

God saw all that He had made, and it was very good. (Genesis 1:31)



The Acmar Community Quilt

Although May is officially ALS Awareness Month, this October holds special meaning for us at Acmar United Methodist Church. We were somewhat aware of the disease commonly known as "Lou Gehrig's Disease" in a distant way until this devastating disease struck one of our own.

Then it became increasingly personal.

When Bruce Payton met and married an Acmar girl, Rhonda Turner, they made lots of plans for their future. As each learned about their hobbies and interests, they found they both wanted to travel. They planned driving trips to various



parts of the country, usually destinations connected with history or natural wonders. Bruce worked at a job he loved, but he was an avid outdoorsman in his free time: fishing and hunting whatever was in season, or just testing his skill as an accomplished marksman. When he wasn't fishing, hunting, shooting, or driving, he could be found in his woodworking shop creating beautiful pieces that will always be treasured. When he became "Paw Paw", he also began making toys.

Bruce became a part of our Acmar church family, eventually bringing his sweet mother, Sarah, along with them to church. As serious symptoms began to appear, the diagnosis of ALS was a crushing blow. In stunned disbelief, we began to see Bruce slipping away. Bruce could no longer work and Rhonda took early retirement to devote herself to his care full time. Good friends helped build a deck/ramp and make the necessary modifications to their home to make it accessible for Bruce. In 2015, while in a wheelchair but still able to eat, speak, and use his hands, they ventured out on a three week trip across America. Rhonda drove the van, while Bruce critiqued her driving! They covered over 6,000 miles to several national parks and places they had thought they'd have plenty of time to visit "someday." Even though some places weren't accessible, they were so glad to have taken the trip when they did. As his condition worsened, even coming to church was no longer possible. Rhonda once remarked that this disease had taught them so much about people. Some they thought were true friends gradually drifted out of their lives, but others surprised them by becoming frequent visitors and help whenever it was needed, creating a special bond of love and friendship. The local ALS Association provided support and equipment allowing Rhonda to keep taking care of Bruce at home. Hospice brought a special nurse whom they grew to love and will always consider a part of the family.

Their grandchildren living out of town meant they didn't get to see them as often as they'd like. Then Bruce developed a special relationship with the youngest addition to our church family, Merritt Champion. When baby Merritt visited a couple of times each week, she was content to lay against his chest with his arm around her. It was usually Bruce who reminded when it was time for a bottle. As she began to grow and get busier, we found that, although he could no longer speak, Bruce could still laugh! With the amazing technology that allowed him to communicate using his eye movements, Bruce could have the Dynavox play music, turn on cartoons on TV, or participate in a game of Peek-A-Boo with Merritt. He never seemed to mind when she would climb over him and play with his nose. He once said he hoped to live long enough that she would remember him. We'll make sure she does.

Bruce peacefully passed away September 12, 2017. The celebration of his life focused on all the things he did in his time on earth and the many people who loved him. Acmar United Methodist Church members will once again participate in the "Walk to Defeat ALS" which draws people of all ages and abilities together to honor the courageous souls who are affected by ALS, to remember those who have passed, and to show support for the cause.
