**BY LAWS OF THE
 APOSTOLIC FAITH BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.**

**Article VII
 Doctrine**

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers who believe in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

- * Triune God; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit
- * Creation and Formation
- * Man is basically sinful and in need of salvation
- * Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life
- * Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul, and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ
- * Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.
- * Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit
- * Sacrament of the Lord's Supper
- * Washing of feet
- * Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers
- * Do not condone divorce and remarriage
- * Destruction of the wicked
- * Conditional Immortality
- * Rapture of the Man Child Class
- * Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly
- * A ministry supported by tithes and offerings

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teachings of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

A WORD FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

We don't have shelves for them so if anyone feels inclined to help some way in the acquiring of some, it will be so much appreciated and useful.

Again, thank you so much for your support of the School -your School: the Lord's College. It is our desire to be pleasing unto God and that we do the very best we can in promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ for it is the power of God unto Salvation.

The smell of enchiladas cooking in the oven, the sound of students yelling to one another over the “crack” of pool balls, inflatable palm trees and tiki huts, a packed parking lot, and dorm rooms wall-to-wall with sleeping bags, pillows and sheets welcomed in the Youth Summit on Thursday, August 7th. Around 2 p.m., students as far away as South Texas and as close as Baxter began registering at the AFBC in Baxter Springs, KS for the 5th annual Youth Summit. The 2008 theme was “EXPECT” with Mark 11:24 as the main scripture... “Whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it and it will be yours.”

Thursday after dinner, we were blessed with a music service led by Brandon Dorris and a message from Brother Randy Dalton. Following the service, the students came together for an afterglow of Sundaes and then late night games in the chapel. The next day was kicked off at 8 a.m. for breakfast and then it was off to the volleyball courts for the annual volleyball tournament. Artwork (spray-paint) by Matthew Harris decorated the grassy courts with the theme reminding students to continue EXPECTING from the Lord all day. After lunch, students were given a code to decipher in order to find their list of items for the city-wide scavenger hunt. Judges Charity Dorris, Eddie Sanchez, and Brady Oakes gave points for accomplishing clues and creativity. After a few moments to return some collected items to the dorm, the 3:00 service began. The Triple S Drama Team (Joplin, MO) kicked off the service, and then Brother John Durham of Lavone, TX spoke a message about ‘EXPECTING’ from the Holy Spirit. It was at this service that we were truly blessed... not because of the music, or the sermon, but because even though the kids were hot and tired, it was clear, for most, *why* they had attended Summit. They put back personal weakness and still pressed in to receive from the Lord, truly EXPECTING that God had *something* for them.

Later that evening, after a wonderful dinner cooked by “chef” Karen Oakes and other kitchen help, we were ministered to in song by Higher Calling Youth Ministries (Crosses, AR) at the 7 p.m. service. Eddie Sanchez brought the Word in a powerful way, and once again, it was awesome to see young people seeking our Lord. What a wonderful blessing to hear the sound of youth as they cried out to the Lord, desperate for more of Him.

After an awesome altar service, students met in the cafeteria for watermelon and then rallied in the chapel for the trophy ceremony. Granby Youth Group (Granby, MO) was awarded first place in the volleyball tournament, and the Baxter/Alvin Youth Groups (Baxter Springs, KS and Alvin, TX) took home the plaque for the scavenger hunt. When students were released from the chapel rally to the empty lot behind the cafeteria, they were surprised to find the area lit-up by tiki torches, Chinese candles, and patio lights all surrounding a stage with a microphone and speakers. Students participated in the Youth Summit’s Got Talent (spoof of America’s Got Talent) and rolled laughing at our 3 hilarious judges Brian Harris, Brady Oakes, and James Flora. At the end of all the contestants, phone numbers were provided for students to call in and vote for their favorite contestant. Kendra Dorris (Galena, KS) won first place with her a capella vocal performance.

Overall, there were 75 registered students and many that attended that did not stay on campus from local churches. Truly God’s Word *was* faithful in so many ways that weekend, concerning EXPECTING and believing in prayer. One small instance was that it was scheduled to rain all three of those days. When we heard the forecast, we decided to ask for good weather “in prayer and believe” that it would be ours. And would you believe it? It rained Thursday morning *until* 2:00 when students arrived, and we could not have asked for more perfect weather all the way until Saturday when it rained after every last student was gone! We have been more blessed through this Youth Summit, than we ever would have imagined. We want to encourage you today, if you have a need, simply EXPECT from the Lord and truly it will be yours! The Lord has moved in mighty ways among our youth this summer, and we urge you to continue supporting your youth that we may see even greater things, should the Lord tarry, in 2009! And to the youth: continue seeking after the Lord. Never let your guard down, but continue to stand strong, EXPECTING that the Lord will help you win your family and friends to Him.
