and swept me off my feet. After dating for six weeks, Ron and I were having dinner one night at Juniors Deli in West LA when he leaned over the kosher pickles and asked me to marry him. I said yes and we got married four months later...so my mother could have enough time to make the wedding gown. Fast forward, we were eventually blessed with a baby boy who we named Glen and who has made us so proud ever since with all his accolades as a class drummer. Magazine recently named him one of the "60 best drummers in the world." He is the light of my life and brings me joy every day.

Ron Sobel

Born in San Francisco, Ron came to Los Angeles when he was 10 yrs old. After graduating Hamilton High he enlisted in the US Army Reserves where he served for 8 yrs. He also graduated USC having majored in business and food distribution. While there he joined the USC rowing team and became the coxswain. He was the guy with the big megaphone who shouts out the orders to his crew (any surprise here?).

After college he became salesman for Marcal Paper Products selling cheap paper straws and plastic wrap that stuck to everything but the food it was supposed to cover...a testament to a great salesman. He drove up and down the coast and all over town calling on customers. Ron was "Google Maps" before it ever existed. He eventually acquired his fathers little tag business and expanded it to become his own Office Depot. No Trail Duster event ever wanted for name badges, folders, push pins, envelopes, staples, etc. He was with generous everyone everything. No one promoted our club more than Ron...whoever he ran into and wherever he went he pitched our club like no one else and managed to sell it to many. During

the pitch he never failed to mention that our son, Glen Sobel, is a rock star and the drummer for Alice Cooper. This he unabashedly told the world. Every 4th of July meant that he would be at Warner Park in Woodland Hills early in the day with his tarps where he would reserve a nice shady spot for the Trail Dusters.

Lastly, who could talk about Ron without mentioning his stamps? He was the consummate "philatelist" who belonged to several stamp clubs and participated in countless stamp shows over the years. They dubbed him "honorary postmaster" at the West Hills Post Office where he could be found 6 days a week helping people mail their packages. He was a community activist as well, servina on the West Hills Neighborhood Council, the local Chamber of Commerce and his homeowners board.

Our Trail Dusters Club has brought a special kind of joy never expected once we retired. One day our insurance agent invited us to a BBQ at his home where we met lots of "older" people who were playing a weird card game called Hand & Foot. We were told that they would become our best friends once we joined the Trail Dusters Square Dance Club. I looked at Ron and said "no way." But he had other ideas. He convinced me to go to the first class and the rest was history. We joined the board in 1998 and held many board positions. We were class coordinators three times, historians, quartermasters, visitation chairs and treasurers for seven years. I was also co-chair of our New Years Gala for many years.

We always told others that the best thing we ever did was join the Trail Dusters Square Dance Club. In a nutshell, joining the club was like an unexpected gift bestowed upon us, a gift that keeps on giving. The friendships we've made over the

years enriched our life beyond our wildest dreams. I look forward to many more wonderful times ahead with all of you.


