

Building and Grounds Update



June, 2021

Status of Projects:

Parking lot driveway resurfacing project.

At the voters meeting on May 15, 2022 there was a presentation regarding the deteriorating condition of our parking lot / drives, and the need to repair and resurface. There were several options presented regarding phasing of the project, however the general consensus was to resurface and restripe everything at one time.

We requested proposals from three paving contractors. At the time of the Voters Meeting we had received two verbal estimates from two of the paving contractors for approximately \$30,000. We had not received the estimate from the third contractor at the time of the voters meeting.

On May 16, 2022 we received the third company's written proposal. Their price to resurface and restripe everything is \$22,590. The church has approximately \$11,000. The general consensus at the voters meeting was to proceed with fundraising events and requesting donations for the resurfacing project, as well as looking at financing, that would include combining the existing land loan with a portion of the \$11,590 needed to complete the funding for the project.

New doors for Pastor's office


