Daily Mass... Why Go?



Mike Bannon-- the parish archivist-- has been attending weekday Masses (in addition to Sunday Mass) for several years now. Why?

- Recall the first time you attended a daily Mass.
 How was it different from a Sunday Mass?
 My distant recollection is that I found the setting of daily Mass more quiet with less visual distractions. I could focus more on my conversation with God.
- 2. What prompted me to restart attending daily Mass? Three years ago, with the sudden death of my wife, Lee, from a massive stoke, I was thrown into acute grief, experienced extreme and painful loneliness and suffered frequent panic attacks. Along with a doctor's help for the panic attacks, I needed God's Grace to help me "lean" into this grief journey. I turned to frequent daily Mass to ask God's help with my continuing grief. This frequent daily Mass attendance has helped me with the grief process.
- 3. Why do you still attend daily Mass? What is the benefit you feel from it?

I still attend frequent daily Mass because I need the Grace of God to do the right thing every day and to ask for help and aid from God for other people who I know are in deep spiritual and physical need.

We perform no good act without the Grace of God. Why not attend frequent daily Mass to increase the flow of God's Grace to your soul and strengthen your Spiritual Life?

This week, I found an article from the Feast of the Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, that showed how the Priest, Father Gerrity, was ensuring that the children of the Catholic Families of the area, would be able to have religion classes despite them attending public schools. These children would not have otherwise been able to receive religious instruction at school, and after Catholics came forward to ask for some kind of exemption to this rule for their children, the students were allowed to leave school in order to allow them to attend these classes.

I have contacted the authorities of the Public School about the Released Time religious program afforded to the Churches of the Area. They have assured me that our Children are eligible for this program. The Children are released from School Tuesdays and Wednesdays at stated times. Just as soon as we can get the names of all the Children and arrange some way of getting the children here to Church we will start the program. Today the Sisters will take the names of all children in the fourth and fifth grades who will be released from School to attend our Religious classes here at the Church. The parents of these children can write a note to the teacher when we get the program in operation. The school authorities were glad of our selection.
