Steinhatchee Trip Report

At the end of September, a group of SRRC members traveled to Steinhatchee, Florida. Chris Hope of Outboards Only was kind enough to handle all of the logistics of the rooms and guides. Naturally, everyone was a little concerned as Hurricane Hermine had caused extensive damage to this entire area, especially Steinhatchee and Cedar Key. We stayed at the Sea Hag Marina and Fishing Cottages and they did a fantastic job in rebuilding and restocking the marina. The lodging units were not damaged by the storm surge, but they had chest high water in the tackle shop at the peak of the storm. Through some heroic work and great volunteers, the company had most everything cleaned and put back together properly.

Steinhatchee is a place that looks like Florida of fifty or more years ago. When you get out in the water, the grasses reminded one of the seagrasses of the Florida Keys of old or the best of the Bahamas. Because of Hermine, there were significant amounts of floating seagrass that had been torn from the bottom. However, the meadows of living seagrasses were still impressive. People are friendly and the area is one that you should visit if you want to see old Florida at its finest.

This resort caters to fishing enthusiasts and those who seek scallops in the summer season. Although there is a nice swimming pool, the only other thing to do involves boating. There are no beaches and no shopping nearby. It is a pure spot and this is a large part of its appeal.

All Stuart Rod and Reel Club Outings are based purely on the honor system. All scheduled outings are daylight outings. You can fish any of the correct dates listed above. The event will begin at the first safe light in the first morning with lines out of the water by 1 PM on the last day. You can only fish for score on <u>one day</u> of the tournament. Scores must be turned into the Angling Director by email, phone or in person by 2 PM local time on the day AFTER the event ends.

You are encouraged to join with other members for the post-outing food service as listed above. Only paid members are eligible to win an event. Guests and spouses of family members may participate in the food service and non-alcoholic beverages at Sandsprit Park. For food at a listed restaurant, guests and non-paid family members will be charged for their food and beverages.

Family members under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian to participate in an outing. Guests are always welcome to fish in outings, but only fully paid members are allowed to win any prizes in the outing. Outings cancelled due to inclement weather may be rescheduled for the following weekend at the discretion of the Angling Director. Any scoring disputes will be settled by the Angling Director. MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS WITH SPEAKERS:

The monthly membership meeting is the second Thursday of the month. Our home port is The Quality Inn/Flanigan's Bar & Grill located at 950 SE Federal Hwy. (US 1) Stuart, FL. Flanigan's offers a very nice menu for \$18. We have the privilege of many fishing industry and conservation leaders in the Southeastern Florida region. These experts include tackle manufacturers, tournament winning Captains and guides, television and print journalists, and academic researchers. We have a guest speaker from this pool at each monthly meeting. Speakers will address topics of interests such as how to fish for the upcoming outing's targeted species and our diverse estuary system. This is a great way to gain additional local knowledge of this fishery.

MONTHLY OUTINGS: The Club sponsors a fishing outing each month. All outings are based on an Honor System. You don't have to keep your catch or take a picture of it either. Outings are scheduled for the weekend following the general membership meeting. Outings are usually three day events where anglers select to fish Friday, Saturday or Sunday. Most outings are scheduled from first safe light till 1PM. The targeted fish and scoring change from month to month with interesting twists such as more points for one species than another. The intent is to have fun! The winner of each monthly outing receives a Club logo embroidered fishing shirt. As part of the outing we have several lunches at restaurants along with club and family cook-outs. Additionally, the Board is encouraging members to partake of the lunch regardless of the day fished. These are no-cost events. With two away outings and the remainder based at Sandsprit Park, there is opportunity to participate without travelling around the state. Frank Miller as the Angling Committee Chairman will also consider your ideas about other outings in other parts of the state. This year's outing schedule was developed to increase participation, emphasizing the fun of fishing. You are able to view the 2016 schedule in every edition of True Lies.
