We finally had the first football game of the season last Saturday night between Central Arkansas and Austin Peay and it went off without many complications. Do note that a few hours before kickoff, news was breaking that several Austin Peay players had tested positive for COVID and would miss the game (VIP customers got alerted to a Central Arkansas -3 play).

Since many of you are new to BP Sports, let us take the time to distinguish between our newsletter and our VIP service. First, the newsletter is our most popular item. It gets emailed every Wednesday afternoon and it features power ratings, schedules, trends, computer projections, write-ups on every game and our favorite best bets at that moment in time. The picks have done quite well over the last 5 years (see below). We felt we have found that certain sweet spot in the week where we have enough information and also we get the better of the numbers as compared to game-day.

As far as the VIP service, that is a daily update with the latest information. Basically, you get more picks and more information. In the past we've released picks at all times during the week whenever we feel the line is right and we have the best information at that time. This year in particular, there will be more late-week picks because of COVID-19 announcements. The VIP service, because it features many more updates and more picks costs more. If you're someone who bets \$100 or less on a game and bets less than 10 games a week, we suggest you stick with the newsletter. However, if you're someone who bets \$500 a game and bets more than 10 games a week, then the VIP service maybe for you especially this season.

Remember since we are a "mom and pop" type of business, we are happy to announce that any customer that is already signed up or will sign up for 2020 football (newsletter or VIP) will be automatically enrolled in our "grandfather" program. The "grandfather" program means that no matter what price inflation rates are in the coming years and decades that we are in business, you will never pay more than what you paid this year for our services. For example, if you paid \$79 for this year's newsletter. That will be the cost of the newsletter next year. It will be the cost of the newsletter for you in 2025, 2035 and even the year 2045 as long as we're still here and in business.

The next issue will be sent Wednesday, September 9th and it will be the first full issue of the 2020 season as currently there are 23 CFB games scheduled and we finally have a full NFL slate of 16 games. Using my power ratings as a guideline, we have developed a line on each game played this college football season. This line factors in the difference between the two teams' ratings while also taking into consideration where the game is played. After you have a line for each game, you can come up with a win percentage on the game. Usually 3-point favorites tend to win straight up between 55 and 60% of the time while 7-point favorites win straight up between 65 and 70% of the time.

Many "Joe Public" bettors make the mistake of computing a season win total just by counting wins and losses by who is favored in the game. While that method is a start, it is not the most accurate. When a team is favored by 3-points, they have around a 57% chance to win that game straight up. Therefore, instead of just marking down a full win for that team, you would reward that team with 0.57 of a win. On the other side, if a team is a 3-point underdog, instead of just marking down a full loss for that team, you would reward that team with 0.43 of a win. Then after you have done this for all the games, you add up all the decimals and that should be a more accurate season win total for each team.

Obviously, this season has been much different with some teams playing as many as 12 games and others only playing 8 games. These win projections reflect schedules as of September 1st.

Games in Rotation Order HOME TEAM IN CAPS

Thursday, September 3rd

SOUTHERN MISS 33 South Alabama 20. South Alabama returns 14 starters from a 2-10 team. However, they did make some strides at the end of the year including a 34-30 win over Arkansas St as 10.5-point underdogs in the finale. The Jags bring back Desmond Trotter at QB and this is head coach Steve Campbell's best team yet. On the other side, we don't like what we've been reading from Southern Miss' fall camp. The Golden Eagles have lost 4 projected starters in WR/RET Jaylond Adams (3 return TD's), MLB Racheem Boothe (49 tackles), DE Jacques Turner (13 TFL's) and CB Shannon Showers (58 tackles). We gave out South Alabama +15 yesterday to VIP customers, but the line has moved through a key "14" number.

UAB 35 Central Arkansas 14. Central Arkansas comes in at 1-0 after beating Austin Peay 24-17 last Saturday night with a late TD. The Bears dominated the box score with 23-16 first down, 460-333 yard and 5.8-4.7 yards per play edges but almost lost outright as 4.5-point favorites. Central Arkansas had 11 trips inside Austin Peay's 35-yard line but didn't score a single point on 6 of those possessions! Now they're taking on a UAB team that returns 18 starters and is the clear-cut favorite in CUSA. UCA QB Breylin Smith didn't impress us last week and now takes on one of the better Group of 5 defenses on short rest. Note that UAB is on a 18-0 SU run at home with an average win by 19 ppg and they're 14-3-1 ATS in those games with an average cover of 6 ppg. We like UAB!

Saturday, September 5th

1★ Arkansas St (plus the points) MEMPHIS 45 Arkansas St 28. Arkansas St has become one of the more consistent Group of 5 programs in the country as they now have nine consecutive winning seasons. The Red Wolves have two very capable QB's in Logan Bonner and Layne Hatcher and return all five starters on the offensive line. The defense got a big boost last month when Fresno St LB Justin Rice (112 tackles), the preseason Mountain West defensive player of the year, transferred in and will fill the gap in the middle of the defense. On the other side, Memphis just suffered a big loss on Sunday when it was announced All-American RB Kenneth Gainwell will opt out. Gainwell ran for 1,459 yards while also catching 51 passes for 610 yards. We like Arkansas St!

Smu 45 TEXAS ST 23. SMU won last year's meeting 47-17 (-17.5) as they out-gained Texas St 639-241! SMU is coming off their best year in more than 30 years. The Mustangs were ranked for the first time since 1986 and had double-digit wins for the first time since 1984. However, they did lose three of their last five games including a "no-show" vs a depleted FAU team in the bowl. This year's team welcomes back 13 starters led by QB Shane Buechele who threw for 3,929 yards and a 34-to-10 TD-to-INT ratio. On the other side, Texas St should be improved on offense this year led by Memphis transfer Brady McBride at QB. The problem is the defensive side of the ball where they lose three multiple-year starters at LB that combined for 971 career tackles! Currently, we don't see much value in this game.

ARMY 30 Middle Tennessee 24. Middle Tennessee returns QB Asher O'Hara who threw for 2,616 yards and 20 TD's while also topping 1,000 rushing yards. The expectation was for a couple of Power 5 transfers at RB to take the pressure off of O'Hara but both West Virginia transfer Martell Pettaway and Florida State transfer Amir Rasul opted out last week. On the other side, Army comes in off a disappointing 2019 season but should be much improved this year. Keep in mind, Middle Tennessee didn't know they were playing Army until just a few weeks ago so they didn't have a typical off-season preparing for Army's option. Despite the money coming in on Middle Tennessee, we like the Black Knights here.

MARSHALL 35 Eastern Kentucky 14. Eastern Kentucky comes in off a 7-5 season but have a new head coach in Walt Wells and must replace two of their top players in RB Daryl McCleskey (1,238 yards) and 2019 OVC Defensive Player of the Year Aaron Patrick on the defensive line. On the other side, Marshall is 17-9 straight up the last couple of years but it has felt a little underwhelming especially when you consider Marshall is just 9-17 ATS in those two years. The Thundering Herd bring back 13 starters this year. QB Isaiah Green decided to return after putting his name in the transfer portal earlier this summer. However, Marshall will go to Grant Wells at QB. No line up as of press-time but we are looking to bet Marshall.

NORTH TEXAS 44 Houston Baptist 24. Houston Baptist comes in off a 5-7 season where they nearly upset FBS UTEP in last year's opener. Bailey Zappe is back at QB after throwing 35 TD passes last season along with his top two receivers. On the other side, North Texas will have to replace their all-time leading passer in Mason Fine who threw for 12,505 career yards and 93 TD's. The Mean Green also overhauled their coaching staff with five new additions. No line up as of press-time but we are looking to bet Houston Baptist.

UTEP 30 Stephen F. Austin 27. Stephen F. Austin was only 3-9 last season but return QB Trae Self and explosive receiver in Xavier Gibson. On the other side, no program has had a worse last 3 years than the Miners who are just 2-34 SU since 2017. UTEP enters 2020 losers of 11 straight and they return only 10 starters from last year. The Miners will go to Gavin Hardison at QB. No line up as of press-time and we're not sure we will have a bet on this game.

Monday, September 7th

Byu 27 NAVY 26. This is the Game of the Week and it deserves the National TV audience on Labor Day Night. BYU returns 14 starters but just a couple of days ago lost TE Matt Bushman to a season-ending injury who we thought was their best offensive player. On the bright side, the Cougars bring back QB Zach Wilson and all five starters on the offensive line (110 career starts). The defense should be improved led by 321-pound NT Khyiris Tonga. After Navy won 11 games last year, the Midshipmen should take a big step back this year. They lose all-everything QB Malcolm Perry who ran for a QB FBS-record 2,017 yards last year. Surprisingly, Navy will go to senior Dalen Morris at QB. All the early money has come in on BYU here (+3 to -1.5). Note BYU D.C. Ilaisa Tuiaki doesn't have much experience defending the option. Regardless, we think the game goes down to the wire.

Week 1 Computer Projected Lines

For the past three seasons we have posted computer projected lines for every game. Games where there was a difference of more than 3 points saw our computer lines actually beat the Vegas line at a 302-252-12 (55%) clip. Keep in mind, these computer lines don't take into consideration off-the-field factors like revenge or flat spots. They are basically a power-rating number difference between the two teams that also takes into consideration the home field advantage.

The Comp column is the computer projected line and the Diff column is the difference between the Vegas line and the Computer line. "+-" numbers in the difference column say back the underdog. "-" numbers in the difference column say back the favorite. Let us know if you have questions.

Top ATS Trends/Angles for Week 1

1. South Alabama has lost 15 straight road games (6-9 ATS) by an average of 22.4 ppg. This week the Jaguars are 15-point underdogs at Southern Miss.
2. Southern Miss has fallen short of expectation by a combined 57 ATS points (1.4 ppg) under head coach Jay Hopson.
3. Since returning in 2017, UAB is a perfect 18-0 SU at home (+19 ppg) and 14-3-1 ATS (+6.1 ppg).
4. The OVER is on a 34-18 run (67%, +5.6 ppg) in Memphis games since early 2016. That's the best mark in the country.
5. Last year SMU was 10-3 to the OVER, with their games going over OVER the total by 9.5 ppg, the best mark in the country.
6. Middle Tennessee has stark home/away splits the last six years going 26-9 SU (59% ATS) at home vs going 14-28 SU (46% ATS) away from home.
7. Despite the fact Army is on a 17-2 SU run at home, the Black Knights are just 8-15-1 ATS as a home favorite the last 5 years.
8. North Texas is just 3-15 ATS overall in their last 18 games failing to cover by 9.2 ppg.

Predicted Conference Champs

AAC: UCF -110. We have the Knights favored in every game this fall. Their toughest game will be a road trip to Memphis (-2).

ACC: Clemson -375. We have the Tigers favored in every game including 10 by more than a 2-TD's. Their toughest game is at Notre Dame (-8).

Big 12: Oklahoma +125. We project the Sooners to be favored in every game including 8 by double-digits. Their toughest game is vs Texas (-4).

CUSA: UAB +225. We project UAB to be favored in every CUSA game this fall. The Blazers get key games vs WKU and Southern Miss at home.

SEC: Alabama EVEN. We expect the Crimson Tide to be extremely motivated this year and project them to be favored in all 10 conference games.

Sun Belt: Appalachian St -125. We project the Mountaineers to be favored in every game this fall and all of them are by 6 points or more.

Best Conference Value Bets

AAC: Cincinnati +400. We have the Bearcats favored in every game but one this fall (at UCF). They also get a key game vs Memphis at home.
