Summary:

On 9/30/17 at approximately 0105 hours, Police were on an overtime detail at The Strand, located at 79 Washington Street, when a male subject later identified as Alejandro Martinez Escobar (██████████/95) was escorted out of the club for causing a disturbance inside. While outside the club Escobar tried to forcefully reenter the club and attempted to push the door man out of the way to reenter. Police asked Escobar numerous times to leave the area and he began to become belligerent and threaten Police. Escobar then threw a full water bottle at Patrolman ██████████ striking him in the upper left arm. Police then attempted to place the subject into custody but the subject began to pull away from Police flailing his arms. Police then had to take the subject to the ground in order to attempt to place him into custody. Escobar continued to flail and resist while on the ground while being placed in handcuffs. It should be noted that when Escobar was taken to the ground he sustained a ██████████ Car 315 was notified. Escobar was charged with Disorderly Conduct and Resisting and held for the next session of 6th District Court. Subject was run via ch. 4 which confirmed an active Warrant out of Pawtucket PD for a Stolen Vehicle DOW(12/14/16). Pawtucket PD was notified.

A supervisors use of force inquiry was completed by Sgt Charles Vieira and found to be within policy

Narrative

On 9/30/17 at approximately 0120 hours, I was notified by Ptlm [REDACTED] that he and Ptlm [REDACTED] had arrested an individual identified as Alejandro Martinez Escobar ([REDACTED]/95) for disorderly conduct and resisting arrest while on the club detail at the Strand. At this time Ptlm [REDACTED] notified me that the subject had been denied re-entry after already being thrown out for causing a disturbance inside. Escobar also attempted to push a door man out of the way in his attempt to re-enter. [REDACTED] further advised me that he and Ptlm [REDACTED] asked Escobar numerous times to leave the area and he became increasingly belligerent, threatening police. Escobar then threw a full water bottle at Patrolman [REDACTED] striking him in the left arm. Police attempted to place the subject into custody but he began to pull away from them, flailing his arms. Police then took the subject to the ground in order to safely place him into custody. It should be noted that while on the pavement, Escobar sustained a [REDACTED]

Due to a busy club night and set up for multiple club closings in the downtown area and Eastside area, I was unable to immediately respond to the scene. I did however respond back a short time later but the club bouncers were dealing with other unruly patrons. Escobar had also already been transported to the cellblock. At approximately 0245 hours I responded to men's detention to interview Escobar. I knocked several times on the cellblock door and was unable to wake him due to him sleeping so soundly. I also opened the cell door and attempted to physically wake Escobar up to speak with him but again had no luck. During my attempts to wake the subject up [REDACTED] At this time I responded downstairs and met with Ptlm [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] who again advised me of the arrest. Given the circumstances surrounding the arrest I find that both officers' actions were within policy and justified.

While I was working a detail at The Strand, I observed a subject later identified as Alejandro Martinez Escobar ([REDACTED]/95) being escorted out of the club by staff for causing a disturbance inside. Escobar then began to try and reenter the club several times and attempting to push pass the doorman at one point. I then walked over and gave Escobar loud verbal commands to leave the area. Escobar continued to yell and began to be belligerent towards Police. It is at this time that Escobar turned and threw a water bottle at me striking me in the left upper arm. I then walked over to Escobar and attempted to place him into custody for Disorderly Conduct, and Escobar began to pull away, flailing his arms in an attempt to not be handcuffed. I and Patrolman [REDACTED] then had to bring him to the ground in an attempt to handcuff the suspect. Escobar continued to resist while on the ground and Police were eventually able to place him into custody. Escobar sustained [REDACTED] while flailing on the ground. Car 315 was notified and Downtown 2 transported the subject to Central.

On Saturday September 30, 2017 at aprox. 0105 Hours Ptlm. [REDACTED] and Myself while assigned to a detail at The Strand Night Club located at 79 Washington Street I observed a H/M later identified as Alejandro Martinez Escobar DOB: [REDACTED] 95 being escorted from the building by Security. Escobar was then observed to attempt to push His way back into the establishment and began to grab the door pulling it from the grip of the Security Officer. Security again pushed Escobar out and was able to secured the door.

Police approached Escobar who appeared to be highly intoxicated, and requested that He leave the area. Police explained He could not re-enter, and spoke with another H/M who He was in the company of (NAME UNKNOWN) and attempted to get the subjects to return to their vehicle. Escobar began to swear and tell Us he would not leave . Escobar then walked a couple steps from Us and threw a full water bottle striking Ptlm. [REDACTED] in the upper Left arm.

We approached Escobar and attempted to place him into custody at which time He began to flail his arms and resist. Escobar was taken to the ground and placed into custody at which time He still attempted to resist being cuffed.

During the altercation Escobar sustained [REDACTED]
Escobar was transported to Central Station by Down Town 2. Car 315 Sgt.Viera was notified.

Summary:

On Monday 10/16/17 at approximately 0149 hours, Police (Patrolmen Endres and Sepe, Car 322) were dispatched to the intersection of Broad Street and Verndale Avenue for the report of a hit and run accident that had turned into a disturbance. As Police responded to the location, they observed two subjects in the middle of Broad Street frantically waving down Police and pointing down Verndale Avenue. Police pulled their vehicle onto Verdale Avenue and observed three subjects in a highly agitated state. These subjects were later identified as Frandisha Mellish (DOB [REDACTED] 1984), Juanito Stevens (DOB [REDACTED] 1990) and James Walker (DOB [REDACTED] 1979). Mellish, Stevens and Walker were aggressively arguing with the occupant and passenger of a vehicle, which was parked legally on the side of the street that Mellish struck. Police intervened and attempted to keep the peace between the subjects by separating them.

Police spoke with both parties and began to determine what had happened. Both parties stated Mellish recklessly backed her vehicle in a westerly direction on Verndale Avenue and struck the driver's side door of the legally parked vehicle. Police then began to gather the necessary information in order to complete a traffic accident report and inquire if anybody was injured. While Police were attempting to do this, they were interrupted by Walker and Stevens who continued yelling at the occupants of the parked vehicle. Police advise Walker and Stevens, who were not occupants of any motor vehicles, to leave to scene and stop being disruptive. Walker then yelled out to Police "FUCK YOU I LIVE ON THIS STREET, I DON'T HAVE TO GO NO WHERE." Stevens then stepped in front of Walker, placed a hand on his chest, and began pushing him backwards stating to Police "I GOT YOU, BUT DON'T BE TELLING US WHAT TO DO BOY." Walker continued on his expletive filled tirade towards Police, however he and Stevens slowly moved down the street.

At that time Police attempted to refocus their attention on the accident and restarted gathering information from the motorists. Walker and Stevens then walked back towards the scene of the accident and in close proximity to Police. Walker then declared to Police that "I DON'T HAVE TO GO NOWHERE, THIS IS A PUBLIC STREET, YOU CANT TELL ME SHIT." Meanwhile, Stevens was yelling at the other motorist across the street. Police attempted to reason with Walker and Stevens, explaining to them that the Police are trying to handle an accident report, and respectfully requested them to stand on the sidewalk, quietly, as Police tried to work. Stevens and Walker refused to listen and began walking forward closer towards Police, screaming and yelling expletives. Police then yelled for them to leave the scene or they would be arrested for Disorderly Conduct and Obstruction. This statement by Police propelled Stevens and Walker into a higher state of agitation. Walker was trying to confront Police a second time; however he was grabbed around the waist by Stevens who was pulling him backwards. Walker was trying to break free from the grasp of Stevens by pushing Stevens' hands away however this was to no avail as the two slowly moved backwards. Walker continued shouting expletives at Police while Stevens stated "FUCK THESES WHITE NIGGAS, THEY THINK THEY TOUGH, THEY NOT." Police tried to refocus on the accident investigation as Walker and Stevens moved slowly down the street, screaming loudly.

Shortly thereafter, Walker and Stevens returned to the scene a second time continuing to scream and yell expletives at Police and the occupants of the other vehicle. It should be noted that several of the residents of Verndale Avenue were in front of the houses, clearly disturbed by the loud and tumultuous behavior by Walker and Stevens. Their behavior had also impeded the ability of Police to hand the accident report/tend to possibly injured subjects. At that time, Police advised Walker and Stevens that they were under arrest for disorderly conduct and obstruction. Walker and Stevens began slowly walking backwards up Verndale Avenue again, yelling expletives at Police. Police placed Stevens in handcuffs without incident, however Walker began walking towards the arresting officers stating "NO YOU CANT ARREST HIM," and reached his arm out in an apparent attempt to interfere with the arrest. At that time Officers grabbed Walker, pulled him away and advised him to place his hands behind his back, however he refused.

PtM. [REDACTED] then placed Walker in the prone position on the roadway. In response, Walker rolled over and struck PtM. [REDACTED] in the jaw one time with a closed fist. PtM. [REDACTED] then struck Walker in the face and torso with closed fist strikes. Walker then rolled onto his stomach and attempted to get off the ground while PtM. [REDACTED] pinned him to the ground. It should be noted that PtM. [REDACTED] was continuously yelling "STOP RESISTING, PUT YOUR HANDS BEHIND YOUR BACK," to Walker, to no avail. PtM. [REDACTED] then issued a short burst of department issued OC spray to the face of Walker. Walker was then immediately able to be handcuffed. Walker and Stevens were then searched incident to arrest, and placed in the rear of Police vehicles. Car 325, Sgt. Kantorski responded to the scene.

While Police were dealing with Stevens and Walker, Mellish ran back across the street and reengaged in a verbal argument with the occupant of the other vehicle. Police again intervened and separated Mellish. At that time Police were approached by two subjects, later identified as [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]) and [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated that prior to the arrival of Police, they observed Stevens, Walker and Mellish arguing and pushing the subjects in the other vehicle. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they walked over in an attempt to help calm the subjects down. As they walked over, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated to Police that Mellish turned and pushed both of them. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they wished to press charges for simple assault. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] completed written statements documenting the incident. Mellish was then secured in handcuffs, searched incident to arrest, and secured in the rear of a Police vehicle.

Mellish and Stevens were run via channel 4 which advised they were negative NCIC/local. Channel 4 advised that Walker had an active bench warrant. The warrant details are as follows:

Mellish, Steven and Walker were transported to Central Station. Mellish was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Simple Assault, Stevens was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Obstruction and (1) One count of Disorderly Conduct and Walker was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Disorderly Conduct, (1) One count of Obstruction, (1) One count of Simple Assault and (1) One count of Resisting Arrest. All subjects were held for the next session of 6th District Court.

A use of force inquiry was completed by Sgt Kantorski and determined the use of force was within policy.

Narrative

On 10/16 /17 at approximately 0210 I was contacted by Ptlm Endres regarding a use of force at the intersection of Broad St and Verndale Av. Upon arrival Ptlm Endres informed he responded with several officers to a disturbance involving vehicle crash. During the disturbance 2 security guards from Lo Vera Lounge were assaulted while attempting to quell the dispute in the street prior to police arrival. As the officers arrived on scene they observed approximately 10 subjects in the road shouting at each other and pushing and shoving. A short time later Ptlm Endres and Ptlm [REDACTED] took a male subject Juanito Stevens into custody for disorderly conduct. At that time, Stevens' acquaintance James Walker reached out to grab onto Ptlm Endres and Ptlm [REDACTED] in an attempt to interfere with the apprehension. Ptlm Lewis observed this and pulled Walker away, and attempted to place him into custody for obstruction. At this time Walker pulled away from Ptlm Lewis. Ptlm [REDACTED] then grabbed onto Walker and placed him in the prone position. At this time Walker rolled over and threw a closed fist punch at Ptlm [REDACTED] striking him in the jaw. At this time Ptlm [REDACTED] informed me he punched Walker in the face and torso area several times. Walker then rolled onto his stomach and attempted to get off the ground while Ptlm [REDACTED] was attempting to pin him down. After several warnings to stop resisting, Ptlm [REDACTED] then issued a short burst of department issued OC spray to the face of Walker. Immediately after being sprayed, Ptlm [REDACTED] informed me Walker placed his hands behind his back. He was then handcuffed without further incident.

I spoke with Walker on scene and he stated he was sorry for what he did and he needed water on his face. I then directed Ptlm [REDACTED] to transport him to C/S. I then spoke with Juanito Stevens who stated [REDACTED] I asked him what happened and he said [REDACTED] He sustained no injury due to his arrest.

Ptlm [REDACTED] Endres, and [REDACTED] reported no injuries at this time and remained on duty. The security guards who claimed they were assaulted informed me they did not witness the use of force.

After reviewing the officers' statements and reports I deem the officers use of force justified.

Patrolmen Endres / Sepe

On Monday 10/16/17 at approximately 0149 hours, Police (Patrolmen Endres and Sepe, Car 322) were dispatched to the intersection of Broad Street and Verndale Avenue for the report of a hit and run accident that had turned into a disturbance. As Police responded to the location, they observed two subjects in the middle of Broad Street frantically waving down Police and pointing down Verndale Avenue. Police pulled their vehicle onto Verndale Avenue and observed three subjects in a highly agitated state. These subjects were later identified as Frandisha Mellish (DOB [REDACTED] 1984), Juanito Stevens (DOB [REDACTED] 1990) and James Walker (DOB [REDACTED] 1979). Mellish, Stevens and Walker were aggressively arguing with the occupant and passenger of a vehicle, which was parked legally on the side of the street that Mellish struck. Police intervened and attempted to keep the peace between the subjects by separating them.

Police spoke with both parties and began to determine what had happened. Both parties stated Mellish recklessly backed her vehicle in a westerly direction on Verndale Avenue and struck the driver's side door of the legally parked vehicle. Police then began to gather the necessary information in order to complete a traffic accident report and inquire if anybody was injured. While Police were attempting to do this, they were interrupted by Walker and Stevens who continued yelling at the occupants of the parked vehicle. Police advise Walker and Stevens, who were not occupants of any motor vehicles, to leave the scene and stop being disruptive. Walker then yelled out to Police "FUCK YOU I LIVE ON THIS STREET, I DON'T HAVE TO GO NO WHERE." Stevens then stepped in front of Walker, placed a hand on his chest, and began pushing him backwards stating to Police "I GOT YOU, BUT DON'T BE TELLING US WHAT TO DO BOY." Walker continued on his expletive filled tirade towards Police, however he and Stevens slowly moved down the street.

At that time Police attempted to refocus their attention on the accident and restarted gathering information from the motorists. Walker and Stevens then walked back towards the scene of the accident and in close proximity to Police. Walker then declared to Police that "I DON'T HAVE TO GO NOWHERE, THIS IS A PUBLIC STREET, YOU CANT TELL ME SHIT." Meanwhile, Stevens was yelling at the other motorist across the street. Police attempted to reason with Walker and Stevens, explaining to them that the Police are trying to handle an accident report, and respectfully requested them to stand on the sidewalk, quietly, as Police tried to work. Stevens and Walker refused to listen and began walking forward closer towards Police, screaming and yelling expletives. Police then yelled for them to leave the scene or they would be arrested for Disorderly Conduct and Obstruction. This statement by Police propelled Stevens and Walker into a higher state of agitation. Walker was trying to confront Police a second time; however he was grabbed around the waist by Stevens who was pulling him backwards. Walker was trying to break free from the grasp of Stevens by pushing Stevens' hands away however this was to no avail as the two slowly moved backwards. Walker continued shouting expletives at Police while Stevens stated "FUCK THESE WHITE NIGGAS, THEY THINK THEY TOUGH, THEY NOT." Police tried to refocus on the accident investigation as Walker and Stevens moved slowly down the street, screaming loudly.

Shortly thereafter, Walker and Stevens returned to the scene a second time continuing to scream and yell expletives at Police and the occupants of the other vehicle. It should be noted that several of the residents of Verndale Avenue were in front of the houses, clearly disturbed by the loud and tumultuous behavior by Walker and Stevens. Their behavior had also impeded the ability of Police to handle the accident report/tend to possibly injured subjects. At that time, Police advised Walker and Stevens that they were under arrest for disorderly conduct and obstruction. Walker and Stevens began slowly walking backwards up Verndale Avenue again, yelling expletives at Police. Police placed Stevens in handcuffs without incident, however Walker began walking towards the arresting officers stating "NO YOU CANT ARREST HIM," and reached his arm out in an apparent attempt to interfere with the arrest. At that time Officers grabbed Walker, pulled him away and advised him to place his hands behind his back, however he refused.

Ptlm. [REDACTED] then placed Walker in the prone position on the roadway. In response, Walker rolled over and struck Ptlm. [REDACTED] in the jaw one time with a closed fist. Ptlm. [REDACTED] then struck Walker in the face and torso with closed fist strikes. Walker then rolled onto his stomach and attempted to get off the ground while Ptlm. Smith pinned him to the ground. It should be noted that Ptlm. [REDACTED] was continuously yelling "STOP RESISTING, PUT YOUR HANDS BEHIND YOUR BACK," to Walker, to no avail. Ptlm. [REDACTED] then issued a short burst of department issued OC spray to the face of Walker. Walker was then immediately able to be handcuffed. Walker and Stevens were then searched incident to arrest, and placed in the rear of Police vehicles. Car 325, Sgt. Kantorski responded to the scene.

While Police were dealing with Stevens and Walker, Mellish ran back across the street and reengaged in a verbal argument with the occupant of the other vehicle. Police again intervened and separated Mellish. At that time Police were approached by two subjects, later identified as [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]) and [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]). [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated that prior to the arrival of Police, they observed Stevens, Walker and Mellish arguing and pushing the subjects in the other vehicle. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they walked over in an attempt to help calm the subjects down. As they walked over, [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated to

Police that Mellish turned and pushed both of them. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] stated they wished to press charges for simple assault. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] the completed written statements documenting the incident. Mellish was then secured in handcuffs, searched incident to arrest, and secured in the rear of a Police vehicle.

Mellish and Stevens were run via channel 4 which advised they were negative NCIC/local. Channel 4 advised that Walker had an active bench warrant. The warrant details are as follows:

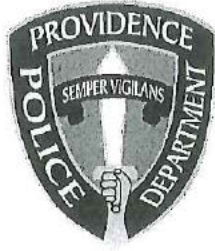

Mellish, Steven and Walker were transported to Central Station. Mellish was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Simple Assault, Stevens was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Obstruction and (1) One count of Disorderly Conduct and Walker was charged by the Patrol Bureau with (1) One count of Disorderly Conduct, (1) One count of Obstruction, (1) One count of Simple Assault and (1) One count of Resisting Arrest. All subjects were held for the next session of 6th District Court.

The vehicle that Mellish was driving was removed from the scene by Sterry St. Towing.

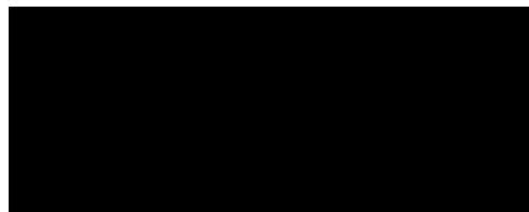

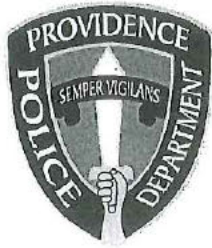
On 9-16-17, I, [REDACTED] was assigned as the OIC for the Out last Shift. At approximately 318 hours, I monitored a call for the Wendy's on Charles Street and a vehicle refusing to move. Ptlm. [REDACTED] was responding. Moments later, Ptlm. [REDACTED] stated over channel one that he received information from witnesses on scene that there was a firearm in the vehicle. Ptlm. [REDACTED] was approaching the white vehicle, it quickly accelerated out of the lot. Ptlm. [REDACTED] responded back to his vehicle and came over channel one.

I monitored the pursuit as Ptlm. [REDACTED] was giving out the directions. After a short period of time, Ptlm. [REDACTED] came over the radio that he was the secondary car behind Ptlm. [REDACTED]. As per policy, I asked for the secondary to broadcast the location, which Ptlm. [REDACTED] who was the passenger of the marked vehicle broadcast the locations, traffic conditions, and speed very clearly. I monitored the pursuit and allowed it to continue since the speed was only approximately 40 mphs due the fact the vehicle was making numerous turns onto side streets and during the broadcast the driverside door was open numerous times indicating the driver was about to flee on foot, which he did on Silver Spring St. by the Walmart. He was apprehended after a short foot pursuit. There was no injuries or any reported accidents from this pursuit.

I believe this pursuit was in policy due the fact the officers received information from witnesses that there was a firearm in the vehicle. Ptlm. [REDACTED] did an excellent job, allowing his trainee and Ptlm.

██████████ to drive their respective vehicles. Ptlm ██████████ gave out all the information I needed to allow the pursuit to continue. There is no need for any further investigation into this pursuit

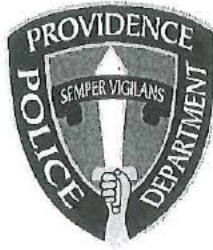
Sir,

On 09/16/17 at approximately 0318 hours we responded to 391 Charles St, Wendy's, for a keep the peace. Dispatch stated that a white vehicle was in the drive thru refusing to move and giving the workers a hard time. Upon my arrival we observed, Car 372 Ptlm [REDACTED] exit his vehicle and approach the above vehicle. As we exited our vehicle, a group of people eating in the parking lot stated that they overheard the operator stating he was in possession of a firearm. Moments later the above vehicle quickly accelerated out of the parking lot. I entered our patrol vehicle, activated the lights and sirens and attempted to catch up with the vehicle which had traveled onto Touro St, making a left onto Lombardi St, and then a right onto Charles St. While on Charles St, we observed the vehicle pass through the red light at the intersection of Branch Ave and Charles St. It should be noted that Ptlm [REDACTED] was the lead car and we maintained the radio duties, at the time of the incident my trainee, Ptlm [REDACTED] operated our vehicle as the secondary vehicle.

At this time we began to broadcast our locations, speed, and traffic flow. We continued to follow the vehicle and observed the vehicle to make a left turn onto Windmill St, right onto Smart St, right onto Argol St, left onto Batcheller St, right onto Silver Spring St continuing to travel at approximately 40 mph. The vehicle then traveled right onto Bismark St, left on Amory St, left on Ledge St and right onto Silver Spring St. The vehicle then rolled through the red light at the intersection of Silver Spring and Branch Ave. At this time the driver's door of the vehicle began to open. The vehicle stopped at the intersection of Silver Spring St and Chatham St where the driver began to flee on foot. We pursued the driver on foot and apprehended him in the rear yard of 16 Chatham St.

ORIGINAL REPORT

On 9/16/17 at approximately 0318hrs, police responded to Wendy's (391 Charles St.), for the report of a refusing to leave. Dispatch advised police, the caller was staff at the business, who stated several subjects in a white vehicle were causing a disturbance in the drive-thru and were refusing to leave the property. Upon arrival, police located the vehicle in question (Texas Reg.# [REDACTED] at the window of the drive-thru. It should be noted, there were several bystanders eating in the parking lot, who advised police they overheard the operator make mention of having a firearm.

As police pulled in the lot and began to walk to the vehicle, the front passenger, later identified as Carlos Rosa (DOB [REDACTED]/93) yelled "fuck you" and the vehicle accelerated at a high rate of speed through the parking lot. During this time, there were numerous patrons in the parking lot, due to bar closings and Wendy's being one of several late night food venues. The operator of the above vehicle, later identified as Elvis Fortes (DOB [REDACTED] 84), operated the vehicle through the parking lot in a reckless manner that jeopardized the safety of all the patrons in the area.

Based on the report of the subject possessing a firearm, as well as his reckless operation, police then attempted to catch up to the vehicle to conduct a traffic stop, however the vehicle continued operating recklessly across Silver Spring St, onto Touro St. Police activated their emergency overhead lights and sirens and began to follow the vehicle, notifying Car 300 (LT. Aspinall) of our location, speed and reason for the pursuit. The vehicle turned left onto Lombardi St. from Touro St. without yielding to the stop sign and nearly struck a pole on the corner of the intersection. The vehicle then continued on Lombardi St, turning right onto Charles St. At this time, the vehicle was still operating in a reckless manner, operating left of center to pass a vehicle and traveling through the solid red light at the intersection of Charles St. and Branch Ave. Police followed the vehicle as it traveled on Charles St, turning right onto Jasper St. The vehicle traveled up Jasper, turning left on Windmill St., then right onto Smart St. The vehicle traveled down Smart St, turning right onto Argol St, a left onto Bacheller St, and then a right back onto Silver Spring St. As the vehicle was traveling on Silver Spring St., it crossed over the solid double yellow line, into the opposite lane of travel, however there were no other vehicles on the street during the incident. The vehicle continued on Silver Spring St, turning right onto Bismark St, left onto Armory St, a left onto Ledge St and then eventually back onto Silver Spring St. Police continued following the vehicle, which had now slowed to the point police felt the operator was going to flee the vehicle. Just prior to Chatham St. the driver's door opened, the vehicle stopped and the operator (Fortes) fled from the vehicle.

While running after Fortes, police observed him grabbing the front of his waist and running as though he had something in his pants. Police believed the subject to either be concealing or grabbing a weapon from his waistband. Fortes ran up Chatham St, into the rear yard of 16 Chatham, where he ran out of room to run. Fortes ran to the end of the driveway, where he turned around and raised his hands. Due to police believing he was still in possession of a weapon, Fortes was taken to the ground and placed into handcuffs. Search incident to arrest yielded no weapons or contraband.

Fortes was escorted from the rear yard and placed into cruiser #721. The passengers, Carlos Rosa and an additional female, [REDACTED] (DOB [REDACTED]) were detained at the suspect vehicle by police. A search of the subjects and vehicle also yielded no weapons or contraband. All three subjects and the vehicle were run via Channel 4. All subjects were negative for warrants, however Fortes (operator) did not have a valid license to operate a vehicle. The vehicle was not listed in NCIC as stolen and had a valid registration. Cars 300 and 385 responded to the scene.

K&B Towing responded to the scene and took custody of the vehicle. Car 371 transported Fortes to central for processing. 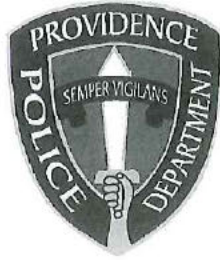

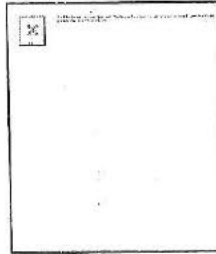

On Friday October 20th 2017, at approximately 1155 hrs., I responded to 899 Manton Avenue 3rd floor to serve as a part of a Force Investigation Team along with yourself, and Detective Sgt. Paul Zienowicz of OPR. We met with Ptlm. [REDACTED] who stated that he had deployed his department issued taser on a subject by the name of Eugenio Nobre D.O.B. [REDACTED] 86.

Ptlm. [REDACTED] explained that he monitored a call for a leaving the scene of an accident, around the vicinity of 576 Manton Avenue. Nobre subject fled on foot and was located at his residence on Manton Avenue. From a disinterested witness the subjects identity and address was developed and officers pursued Nobre to his residence at 899 Manton Avenue. Where he was confronted by officers, he slammed the common hallway door on the Officers and fled to the 3rd floor apartment. Officer [REDACTED] responded to the 3rd floor and began searching the apartment with several other Officers. The Nobre subject was found in a closet which connects two of the bedrooms in that apartment. While confronting this subject with weapons drawn, Officer [REDACTED] reholstered his dept issued firearm and drew his department issued taser and began giving loud verbal commands for the subject to exit the closet and to display his hands.

Officer [REDACTED] stated the subject displayed his hands then retracted them and moved further into the closet. Officers at this point got hold of the Nobre subject and began to physically extract the subject from the closet. The Nobre subject at this point began actively resisting arrest and attempted to strike the Officers with his hands. Officer [REDACTED] were caused by the accident the subject was involved in prior to his contact.



I feel that Ptlm. [REDACTED] taser deployment was justified for the following reasons:

- Officer [REDACTED] gave several loud verbal commands and intent to use the taser which was ignored by the Nobre subject. In an attempt to thwart any further overt acts toward the officers, the use of the taser was justified.
- The purpose of utilizing less lethal force is to save lives and reduce injuries.
- The subject was given verbal commands by the officers to comply, but continued to resist arrest.
- The subject was eventually handcuffed and given medical attention per policy immediately following the incident.

Ptlm. [REDACTED] and the officers on scene controlled this subject and used a lesser amount of force and adhered to the use of force guidelines. They showed great restraint during this incident. They also showed great decision making while coordinating a safe outcome for both the suspect and the Officers.

ARREST

On today's date I was on a fixed post in the area of Traver Ave. and Hedley Ave., in reference to stop sign and one way violations. It was at that time when I observed RI Registration [REDACTED] pass by me at a high rate of speed. It was also at that time when the said vehicle continued at that speed and went through the stop sign at the listed location. I immediately activated my overhead lights and siren, attempting to conduct a motor vehicle stop. It was at that moment when the vehicle in question went left of center passing 3 other vehicles which were stopped at the light of Hedley Ave., and Greenville Ave. At that time it was clear that the suspect vehicle was not going to stop and was attempting to elude apprehension. I immediately notified dispatch personal of my location and the fact that I was in pursuit of the above listed vehicle. It should be noted that the entire time while I was in pursuit of the suspect vehicle, the overhead lights and siren to my police vehicle were activated.

While in pursuit I was able to look down at my speed odometer and observed that I was traveling at approximately 100mph. At that time I passed the Stop and Shop which is located on Manton Ave. When I reached the area of Manton Ave., and Cortez St., I decided to terminate the pursuit for the following reasons: the excessive speed, the amount of traffic on the road, the fact that the suspect was still refusing to stop, and the fact that the suspect vehicle had already passed several other vehicles. I immediately notified dispatch personnel that the pursuit had been terminated. Once turned off my overhead lights and siren, I continued on Manton Ave. and lost sight of the suspect vehicle. As I continued further down Manton Ave. I observed what appeared to be smoke from the suspect vehicle possibly losing control, and then I heard a loud crash. It was at that time when I observed heavy rear end damage to RI Registration [REDACTED] which was parked unattended. I then observed that the suspect vehicle had crashed into a pole on Manton Ave., just prior to Glenbridge Ave. As I approached the suspect vehicle I observed the male operator exit the vehicle and flee on foot. The suspect/operator was described as a Hispanic male tall and thin wearing a blue sweatshirt and black shorts. The suspect then fled south thru a parking lot, jumped a fence and ran into the surrounding yards. At that time dispatch personal advised Providence PD of the pursuit and the last known location of the suspect. After losing sight of the suspect, officers from Johnston and Providence PD began searching the surrounding area. Moments later the registered owner of the suspect vehicle arrived on scene and was in shock when she observed her damaged vehicle. The owner [REDACTED] refused to cooperate with the investigation and stated she had no knowledge as to who was driving her vehicle. At that time [REDACTED] stated she may have to report that her vehicle was stolen. I advised her to choose wisely, filing a false police report is a felony.

It was at that time when a neighbor was passing by and observed the suspect vehicle as well as [REDACTED]. This neighbor who wished to remain anonymous advised police that [REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED] and theres a good chance that it was her boyfriend [REDACTED] was operating the suspect vehicle. At that time Providence PD was notified and several officers responded to the address in question. After searching the residence a suspect was taken into custody. I immediately responded to 899 Manton Ave., to conduct a show up of the suspect in Providence Police custody. At that time I positively identified the suspect in custody as the suspect who fled on foot from the suspect vehicle after it crashed into the pole on Manton Ave. That suspect in custody was identified as Eugenio Nobre.

I then responded back to the scene, and met with Sgt. Scichilone who was standing by with the

suspect vehicle. It was at that time when I conducted an inventory search of the suspect vehicle. While searching the suspect vehicle I observed what appeared to be several pieces of crack cocaine, tied in plastic bags. The suspected crack cocaine was found on the drivers side door jam/handle. I immediately seized the suspect crack cocaine and placed it in a evidence bag. When the search was complete the vehicle was towed from the scene by Precision Towing.

At police headquarters the suspected crack cocaine was turned over to B.C.I. Detective Heywood for testing. Shortly thereafter, Detective Heywood advised that the plastic bags tested positive for cocaine and fentanyl. Said property was later entered into evidence by Detective Heywood. At the conclusion of the investigation the suspect was charged with: Possession of Scheduled I-V 21-28-4.01(C) (2) (1), High Speed Pursuit 31-27-4.1, Obedience to Stop Sign 31-20-9 and Operating without a License (3rd offense) 31-11-18. All citations were sent via US Postal Service.

On [REDACTED] you were a groomsman for a friend's wedding. The ceremony and reception took place at [REDACTED]. You state you began drinking alcohol with the other members of the wedding party at approximately 1130hrs. At approximately 1245hrs you were transported to the [REDACTED] arriving around 1300hrs. Throughout the early afternoon you continued to consume alcohol and smoked a cigar with other members of the wedding party. At approximately 1645hrs your girlfriend, [REDACTED] arrived at the reception. After the ceremony you socialized with other wedding guests. As you were seated for dinner, [REDACTED] told you that your eyes were glossy and your speech was slurred. She told you she was going to have you cut off at the bar. At this point the two of you began to argue. Others at the wedding noticed the arguing and asked you if you wanted to take a walk outside to cool down. Your mother joined you outside and also advised you to cool down and start drinking water. At some point you went to the bar and ordered another beer which a short time later created another argument between you and [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] again told you that you were cut off from the bar. At this point [REDACTED] meant she did not want you to drink anymore, however you were under the impression that the establishment had cut you off. You became upset and said to [REDACTED] "they can't cut me off, what the fuck did I do wrong"? You argued a little longer about whether you were ok to continue drinking or you should cease drinking.

A short time later the wait staff arrived at the table to inquire as to what the guests wanted for dinner. You stated to a member of the wait staff "you know when I'm done fucking drinking but not fucking eating."

You state you did not consume anymore alcohol during the wedding and only had water. A while later you felt better and danced and enjoyed the evening without further incident.

In conclusion, the documentation provided by you appears to be an accurate description of your actions on the night in question as Sgt. Currier has been able to confirm this with several people.

After reviewing this incident, I find you in violation of department rules and regulations, specifically:

Part II, Section 200.5 Standard of Conduct: which states in whole or in part...*Personnel shall conduct their private and professional lives in such a manner as to avoid bringing discredit upon themselves or the Department.*

Part II, Section 200.6 Rules Governing Conduct: which states in whole or in part...*Any act or omission, contrary to good order, discipline, or accepted standards of conduct, when committed either on or off duty, shall subject a member or employee to disciplinary action.*

After reviewing these matters, I have decided to impose summary punishment on you for these violations in accordance with the Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights, section 42-28-6-13. You shall also be ordered to receive remedial training to address your actions for this incident.

Per the agreement made on your behalf and the Providence Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge #3 you concur with the findings in this matter that you did violate the above mentioned Rules and Regulations of the Providence Police Department. As a result, you have agreed to a two (2) day suspension without pay.

You are to be suspended without pay for two (2) days; additionally you will seek appropriate department approved counseling, arranged through the peer support unit and retraining in the policies mentioned above. The date of suspension will be specifically:

You will turn in your badge, identification card, portable radio and weapon to your commanding officer prior to your suspension; and you will exercise no police powers during your suspension. Following the completion of your suspension, you will obtain your badge, identification card, portable radio and weapon from your commanding officer.

Sir,

On Saturday September 16, 2017 at approximately 1030hrs, I arrived at my friend [REDACTED] house for his wedding that was going to be held at 1700hrs at [REDACTED]. I was a groomsman in the wedding that day along with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At approximately 1130hrs, I began to drink alcohol with other groomsman and began to start getting ready while pictures were being taken. At approximately 1245hrs, all of the groomsman were transported and arrived at [REDACTED] at 1300hrs. All of the groomsman had a private room inside of the country club. I continued to drink alcohol and food that we brought to the country club that day. We had a cigar in front of the club while the bridal party was continuing to get ready. The groom saw the bride, [REDACTED] at approximately 1430hrs for a first sight and had pictures taken inside of the bride's room. The groomsman continued to drink in the groom's room. I went out to the pool with other groomsman to finish the cigar that we started to smoke earlier in the day. Club staff came outside while we were at the pool and stated that we weren't allowed to be out there. We immediately returned back into the private room and continued to drink alcohol and listen to music. At approximately 1530hrs, the entire party gathered out in the yard to have pictures taken of everyone. Pictures ended at approximately 1600hrs and I returned back to the groom's room with other groomsman and continued to drink. At approximately 1645hrs, I went out to the front of the club to say hello to my mother [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. At approximately 1650hrs, the wedding party gathered in line to begin the ceremony. The ceremony began at approximately 1700hrs and ended at approximately 1730hrs. After the ceremony, I began to talk with people that I knew that were invited to the wedding, such as my friend [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] while having drinks at the bar. I began to eat food that was provided. At approximately 1800hrs the wedding was brought inside the wedding room and I sat at the table alongside [REDACTED] who is employed by the country club as a Marketing and Member Relations Coordinator [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] my girlfriend [REDACTED] noticed that my eyes were glossy and my speech had become slurred. She stated that she was going to have me cut off at the bar and I got into an argument with her. My friends noticed that I was arguing with my girlfriend and asked me if I wanted to go outside of the country club. My mother [REDACTED] came outside with me and stated that she agreed with my girlfriend and told me to cool down and start drinking water, and eat, like my girlfriend told me to do. I calmed myself down and returned into the wedding. The best man, and maid of honor relayed there speech to the audience. During the appetizers, I decided that I wanted to have another beer. I went up to the bar located at the back of the room and asked for a beer with [REDACTED]. After finishing my beer, my girlfriend stated that I was cut off from the bar. I got into another disagreement with my girlfriend and stated to her "they can't cut me off, what the fuck did I do wrong". At the time, I did not realize that the bartender had never cut me off and that it was my girlfriend telling me that she wasn't going to allow me to drink anymore. I continued to insist to her that I was okay to drink and she continued to tell me to continue to drink water. I began to drink a lot of water and eat as much food as I could. When dinner came to the table, the wait staff asked me what I wanted to eat and I stated that they should know that sarcastically. I began to eat with people at my table and continued to drink water. I began to feel a little better, but was still questioning why they cut me off and what I did wrong to my girlfriend. The wait staff returned to my table to grab my food and asked me whether I was done, in which I stated "you know when I'm done fuckin drinking, but not when I'm done eating". After I was finished eating, I began to gather my composure, feel better, and gather my state of mind. I continued to do what my girlfriend and mother told me to do and didn't have any more drinks. After dinner was completed, I began to dance on the dance floor with my girlfriend, friends, and family. I did not have another drink that night and began to feel a lot better. I continued to drink water and dance on the floor. At approximately 2300hrs, I left the wedding ceremony with my girlfriend [REDACTED] and returned home to [REDACTED].

My actions on this night were unacceptable and my ability to drink responsibly was missing. I spoke with [REDACTED] who was at the wedding with me that night, and she provided me with [REDACTED] contact number, who is a Wedding Event Manager. After this incident, I contacted [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] on [REDACTED] in an attempt to apologize to her for being rude to wait staff that night. Unfortunately [REDACTED] was unavailable at that time and I could not reach her through the telephone. [REDACTED] informed me that during her next shift on Tuesday September 19, 2017 she spoke with management of the country club in which they stated to her that an apology was unnecessary.

I had a conversation on September 20, 2017 with Patrolman [REDACTED] after roll call. I apologized for my actions that night and not telling him immediately. I promised Ptlm. [REDACTED] that I would work on the issue I have while being out of uniform. He informed me that any of my actions on or off duty could jeopardize my career as a Police Officer. I understand that a senior officer's advice is beneficial to my career and I appreciate all of the guidance Ptlm. [REDACTED] has provided me with up to this point and continues to provide. I am regretful of this night and have made a decision to quit drinking. I understand that any of my actions while being a Police Officer, on or off duty, can negatively impact or destroy my career.

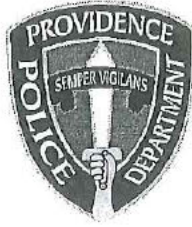
