The Gospel Reading of this Sunday is from Mark 10: 46-52. We are told the episode as Jesus on his way to Jerusalem restores the sight of the blind Bartimeus.

He had heard about Jesus passing by from the crowds possibly cheering Jesus. Bartimeus called out loudly, "Jesus Son of David have pity on me." Unfortunately, many people in his vicinity rebuked him telling him to be quiet. He kept on calling out the more to Jesus who got his attention and asked the man to be brought to him.

Jesus asked him; "What do you want me do for you?" Master that I may see replied the blind man. Jesus said to him; "Go your way, your faith has saved you."

We are told that this man with his sight restored, followed Jesus on his way to Jerusalem. Jesus healed both his physical and spiritual blindness. He was able to see Jesus as the Messiah. This man had earlier on called Jesus Son of David- a title for the Messiah. The signs of healing the blind, lame and mute were signs announcing the Messiah.

Bartimeus was able to recognize and name his disability and sought Jesus for healing. His sight was restored. The point for us, Am I able to recognize my shortcoming, name it and ask Jesus to get me out of it?

Bartimeus is an example of persistent prayer and faith. Let us pray for the spirit of being persistent and constant in prayer.
