FOLLOW THE LIGHT FAITHFULLY!

Is. 60:1-6; Ps. 72: 1-2, 7-8, 10-13; Eph. 3:2-3a, 5-6; Matt. 2:1-12



"For the Lord shall rescue the poor when he cries out, and the afflicted when he has no one to help him. He shall have pity for the lowly and the poor; the lives of the poor He shall save."

Today the Roman Church celebrates the feast of the Epiphany, from Greek, *epiphanein*, which means *appearance*, *showing* or *revelation*. It was used to describe the appearance of a god among the people, a *theophany*. The Eastern Greek-speaking Church found it natural to use the word to describe the appearance of the true God in flesh; thus, the feast is the original feast of Jesus' birth. Early Eastern Christians celebrated the birth of Jesus on January 6th, long before Christians in Rome began to celebrate it on December 25th. Because the feast of Epiphany was already well established as a major feast, the Western (Roman) Church could not ignore it. In light of this, the Roman Church started celebrating Epiphany as the three manifestations of the divinity of Christ – His birth, the adoration of the magi and His baptism. This "solemn adoption" thereby extended the Christmas celebration far beyond one day.

The historical context of today's first reading from the Book of Prophet Isaiah is the conquest and enslavement of the Israelites by the Babylonians about 600 years before the birth of Christ. Fifty years after the Israelites were taken to Babylon and oppressed, the Persians conquered Babylon and freed the children of Israel, allowing them to return to their homeland. Thus, in today's reading Isaiah zealously proclaims this return, "Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." Isaiah was so enthused that he saw in the return of the Exiles something much more important and wonderful than their freedom from captivity. He saw Jerusalem becoming the center of spirituality and light for all the world - "Nations shall walk by your light." People will come from all over the world to visit Jerusalem and will be nourished by the spiritual light and life radiating from her - "and kings shall walk by your shining radiance."

In the same vein, in the feast of Epiphany we celebrate more than Christ's manifestation to the magi, "the three kings" - we celebrate His manifestation not just to the Jewish people but also to the Gentiles - not just to believers but also to unbelievers. By His birth, Christ has brought light to "those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death." God, in Christ, has revealed Himself to all nations - to anyone willing to accept Him. As Isaiah envisaged the return of the Israelites from exile and all nations joining them in a pilgrimage of joy to Jerusalem, the Holy and Eternal City: the event in the gospel where the magi faithfully and diligently followed the "star" that led them to Christ, encourages us to make a pilgrimage of faith to Christ every moment of our lives. He came so that all might be saved. Sadly, sometimes there are obstacles that often hinder us from coming to the Light. Herod sought to destroy the Light, because he preferred to be in the dark. Like the Three Kings, you and I must never waver in our commitment to follow Christ and give our lives to serving Him above all else, especially in this Year of Faith, 2013.
