Bishop Benedict Explains:

Each one of us lives in a certain environment: we have parents, brothers, sisters, wife, husband, children, friends, persons who support us. We have people whom we support, whom we trust and who trust us. Society consists of very many different groups, subgroups who collaborate with each other to some extent and people live with the feeling of belonging to one of them. For us, those whom we know, owing to the force of these or other circumstances are always closer. Other people whom we don't know are strangers to us; we won't say that they are our enemies but foreign to us and we keep a certain distance from them. We always tend to be more sympathetic with our acquaintances. And we relate with those we don't know – perhaps not with antipathy but with certain "indifference". It is easy for us to do something good for our acquaintances because we expect that they will also pay us back for it. However, the Heavenly Father expects us to be good to each human being because each is created in His image. We know that the Lord identifies himself as a neighbor with each human being. "What you did for one of my neighbors you did it for me". What we do for whoever the person may be; – we do it for God. If we are good only to those who are dear to us, we simply act as humans, because they are close to us. Let us do what is good to every person because then we will be doing what is good to God!

"28. The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community.
