In Loving Memory Virginia L. Nelson

October 27, 1926 - July 7, 2020



Virginia Lucille Nelson, 93, died July 17, 2020 in Colorado Springs, CO. She was born October 27, 1926 in Albert Lea, MN to Leslie V. and Luella Ida (Grasdalen) Erickson, Sr. Virginia grew up on a farm where she and her siblings, Doris, Mickey, Sherwood, Arlene, Rodger, and Leslie Jr. enjoyed good outdoor fun and family reunions. She married Nordean "Swede" F. Nelson on April 21, 1946 in Albert Lea.

Virginia graduated from high school in Albert Lea, MN and worked as a secretary for the Dept of the Navy, Washington, DC. For a time, she and Swede lived in Florida and had many adventurous times. They moved to Colorado Springs in 1952 and had several different businesses throughout their lives together. In 1973, they became charter members of the Sons of Norway, Fjellheim Lodge. During her 47-year membership, Virginia held various positions in the lodge, but most recently, she had been our historian and, for many years, the reservation 'taker' for the Lutefisk Dinner and, as a result, she knew members and many nonmembers all by name, most being 'Lutefisk & Meatball Lovers'. Virginia was a remarkable person: bright, capable, willing, and tenacious along with a good sense of humor. She was very courageous - Ole remembers the day of Swede's memorial service at Ft. Logan (WWII Vet). When she returned home, Virginia fell on uneven concrete and suffered a broken hip. It was a painful injury with a long recovery. He was amazed at how she bounced back and at her positive attitude during that time. Great lady! So many members have said she was a lovely person, a good friend, and that she will be missed very much.

Virginia was a member of Grace Lutheran Church. She is survived by her daughters, Barbara Ann Nelson and Cynthia Louise Ritz, two grandchildren, Allison Ritz and Jessica Lawyer and their spouses, and four great-grandchildren. She is also survived by her sister Arlene (Byron) Reid and brother Rodger (Marje) Erickson, also Fjellheim members, and her sister Mickey Wildie in CA. She is preceded in death by her parents, her husband, Nordean "Swede" Nelson, son-in-law Daryl Ritz, and three siblings to include Doris Lake, a Sons of Norway member who died in October 2019. A Memorial Service was held August 1, 2020, with inurnment at Pikes Peak National Cemetery on August 3, 2020.

MANNEN OG KATTEN



This famous painting, 'Mannen og Katten' by Norwegian artist Christian Skredsvig is a portrait from 1888 of Ole Olson who was my great-great-grandfather's brother.

Skredsvig loved painting what he saw as the traditional rural Norwegian countryside and people. But at the time of the painting, Ole had been around possibly more than the artist. He had immigrated to the US and may have even enlisted in the US army during the Civil War (according to family legend) before going back to the Old country.

Ole was born in Norway but came to America (ca. 1860's ?) with his brothers and then returned to Eggedal, Norway in 1886 and remained there until his death. Ole was noted for his great physical strength.

Ole was from a family of eight siblings. Two of these were Gulbrand and Halvor (Olson, Haugen) Hefta who remained in the US. Halvor is my great-great grandfather. Hefta is a place name from Eggedal that the brothers adapted in the US to distinguish themselves from the many Olson's and Haugen's among the Norwegian immigrants they settled with in Iowa and later in North Dakota.
