Captain Merriwell William "Tex" Vineyard, USN Retired died peacefully on August 17, 2016. He was born on September 21, 1920 in Whitewright, Texas to Willard and Effie Mae Vineyard.

He is survived by his daughters, Barbara Alexander and husband Alan of Raleigh, Nancy Allred and husband Steve of Julian; five grandchildren, Nicole Alexander and husband Patrick, Keely Alexander, Eric Allred and wife Amy, Sarah Allred, and Sam Allred; brothers Harold Vineyard and Jerry Vineyard; sister Billie West.

He is preceded in death by his parents; his wife of 57 years, Jean Barnard Vineyard; special friend Camilla Herlevich; son William Alan Vineyard; sisters Vonda Lee Riley and Evelyn "Modene" Vineyard; brothers Jack Vineyard and James Vineyard.

In 1939 he hitch-hiked with a childhood friend to Canada, joined the RCAF, completed flight training, and acquired the lifelong nickname of Tex. He was deployed to Britain to fly Spitfires against Nazi Germany where he had an unconfirmed kill. On November 9, 1942, he joined the [United States Navy](#) and entered the Pacific theater flying in a squadron of F6F Hellcats. During his WWII combat career he was officially credited with 41 strikes and 6 kills earning him Fighter Ace status. After the war he continued his career with the Navy including stints as a flight instructor and at the Naval War College. He retired from the Navy in 1973. His decorations include Ace, Silver Star, Legion of Merit (2), DFC (3), and Air Medal (7). In 2015 Congress awarded the surviving aces with a Congressional Gold Medal. Tex lived life to the fullest and while he was a strict and demanding parent, he was always quick with a smile and a laugh and was a devoted husband, father, and grandfather. As he frequently said, he may not always be right but he was never wrong! At Tex's request there will be no formal service.
