Pastor's Corner

It's September 20th as I write this. Wiebke and I took our dog, Talia, for our morning walk this morning at Burrell Lake. It was very misty with low light, giving a very palpable "Fall has arrived" feel, as we could see the dozens of intricate spiderwebs, delineated by the dew, that you normally can't see otherwise. The fog was thick enough that you couldn't see across the lake to the other side (and as you probably know, it's a *small* lake). The vast majority of the ducks (at least 30) were on the water in an interesting pattern of black dots. But I digress. My point is – it felt like my favorite season had arrived *both* softly and "in force."

It has been similar with the restarting of various ministries and activity at Puckety over the last month: Kickoff Sunday, Children's Church, Youth Group, Choir, Life Groups, Outreach opportunities with the Burrell School District, our bonfire and more. I'm excited about what the Lord has in store. But just as I sometimes tell people in October – "make sure you take some time amidst your packed calendar just to enjoy the color of the leaves on the trees, because they'll be

done soon" – I want to encourage you (and myself) to take the time to *pay attention* to what God is doing around us, to slow down, look and listen. Let's be sure to remember who we are in Christ, and why we're here. Let's recommit ourselves (weekly) to our *Mission* – "*We personally and collectively, Honor God, Grow in Faith and Improve our Community and World.*"

I praise God for giving us the ability to do the many things we've been up to – giving deep thanks for answered prayer left and right; but it's also important to ask ourselves if we're doing them for the right reasons ... are we doing them because: 1) it's what we've been doing for years ... or 2) it's what we like to do and lines up with our interests ... or 3) it's what we've discerned God desires and believe it's what our Lord is calling us to? Sometimes, obviously, it can be more than one of those reasons, but we should ALWAYS ask if #3 is true, and if we're not sure, to get to prayer and discussion with our sisters and brothers in faith. Oftentimes, when we start that conversation (not waiting for someone else to do it), we discover things we didn't know, and learn of ways Christ can use us, through the power of the Spirit, to bring glory to the Father. To that end, may the Lord equip and use you to be the heart, voice, and hands of God, making a lasting difference, not just in the lives you know, but in the broader community and world.

<u>A Devotional For You</u> – Read Psalm 126

As you read this, we will just be in the middle of a sermon series called, "Got Joy?" – drawing from 3 different New Testament letters to help us get a better grip on this particular fruit of the Spirit. So, for the devotional I thought I'd go with the *Old Testament* for broader perspective. Let me begin with a quote from Eugene Peterson – "Joy is not a requirement of Christian discipleship; it is a *consequence*. It is not what we have to acquire in order to experience life in Christ; it is what comes to us when we are walking in the way of faith and obedience. We come to God because none of us have it within ourselves, except momentarily, to be joyous. Joy is a product of *abundance* (not abundance in worldly circumstance but abundance in Christ's presence). It is the overflow of vitality" (*A Long Obedience in the Same Direction*).

I believe Peterson is right, and I'm sure many others would too, but I think the problem comes when people misunderstand *where to look* for the abundance. And it's not just unbelievers, many of us have the same problem. We try to get it through entertainment. We pay someone to make jokes, tell stories, perform with dramatic flair, sing songs, etc. As Peterson goes on to say, "We buy the vitality of another's imagination to divert and enliven our own poor lives. Society is a bored, gluttonous king employing a court jester to divert it after an overindulgent meal." But that kind of joy never penetrates our lives. The effects are (extremely) temporary – a few minutes, a few hours, a few days at most. Maybe that's because joy cannot be commanded.

But there is something we can do. We can decide to live in response to the abundance of God and not under the dictatorship of our own poor needs. We can decide to live in the environment of a living God and not our own dying selves. We can decide to center ourselves in the God who generously gives and not in our own egos which greedily grab. That's what the Psalmist was calling God's people to do (Ps. 126). Keep in mind the Psalmists were no strangers to hurt and pain and hardship. The Psalmist calls us beyond our immediate, ephemeral experience, to develop a historical memory, fed by God's faithfulness in the past and his sure promise for the future. Joy is rooted in God's mighty deeds of redemption of generations past, and joy is nurtured by anticipation of his goodness to come. If the joy-producing acts of God are characteristic of our past as God's people, they will also be characteristic of our future as his people.

The joy that develops in the believer – in the way of discipleship – is an overflow that comes from feeling good not about yourself but about God. It's not dependent on good luck or good health. Christian joy is actual in the midst of pain, suffering, loss and misfortune (remember the Apostle Paul – you need both hands for the number of examples). In the end, this psalm doesn't give us joy as a neatly wrapped package or secret formula, but it does help us see pass the tinniness of the world's joy and affirms the solidity of God's joy. It encourages us in the way of faith to both experience and share joy. And that's enough. God bless you – not with fleeting experiences – but his own abiding, abundant Presence. ~ *Pastor Brian*
