Tidings from Timothy

My family is gone this weekend. Connie and I would have been gone for PTP anyway, and it is our anniversary time. Hatton will be preaching at the morning services. In the evening, you will have the Jonny Royal lesson on the home released at 6pm for you to study on. This was his Wednesday night lesson a few weeks ago that we could not play for technical reasons. We have now worked that out and look forward to seeing what he had to say.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and familyoriented church.Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

All of us at one time lived in a state of eminent death, spiritually speaking (Rom. 6:23). It was because of the sin that we realized something worse could come, if no penitence was offered (1 John 3:4; Isa. 59:2). By Christ’s coming into this world and providing a way (John 14:6), we then could be made alive. Of course, one question begs an answer. How are we made alive in Christ?

We are first made alive in Christ because He has forgiven all sins. It is when baptism takes place that all past sins are remembered against us no more (Acts 2:38; Isa. 1:18). All individuals who have fulfilled the Lord’s commands should manifest great confidence in this. Often it is the case that folks let their past transgressions hold them back from serving with full potential. Although the past may be remembered, it does not need to hold one back. Let us take the apostle Paul for illustrating this point. He went about his days persecuting God’s people, then he obeyed the gospel. Though he remembered those things daily, he did not dwell upon them. He kept pressing forward for a high prize (Phi. 3:14). If Paul can be forgiven and live life to its fullest, we must be willing to do the same.

Next, we are made alive by the blotting out of the handwriting of ordinances which was against us. This is bearing reference to the law of Moses and its efficacious nature. The law of Moses was not a sinful system, for Paul openly stated it was a good, just and holy law (Rom. 7:12). It had a certain purpose in mind, which was not to take away sin (Heb. 10:1-4). The law of Moses was put into place to role sins over until the point in history when the Christ came (Gal. 4:4). It was at the perfect point that the Christ came and put the law of Moses out of commission. It was at his death that the law of Moses died, insomuch as its effects are concerned (Heb. 9:15-17). The law of Christ is what helps to make us alive, for we are not condemned if we are under His law (Rom. 8:1-2). If we are not condemned, let us rejoice in our freedom!

Deeply Offended

When the time came for it, Jesus was ever ready to give to one and all the gospel which the people needed to hear. On other occasions, he was the listening master, responding to accusations and insincere questions in a calm but straightforward manner.

Perhaps one of the best illustrations of this behavior by Christ is found in Matthew 15:7-14: *“[Ye] hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying, This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with [their] lips; but their heart is far from me. But in vain they do worship me, teaching [for] doctrines the commandments of men. And he called the multitude, and said unto them, Hear, and understand: Not that which goeth into the mouth defileth a man; but that which cometh out of the mouth, this defileth a man. Then came his disciples, and said unto him, Knowest thou that the Pharisees were offended, after they heard this saying? But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up. Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch.”*

The point is that Jesus both knew how to be courageous and at the same time deal with the situation without “blowing up.” From our Savior we see the example of someone whose words were not rash but nevertheless disagreeable to some. That’s just the way things are. The sooner we accept the fact that many in our society will be deeply offended at the truth, the sooner we will be able to accept the truth when we hear it.

What causes you to not tell your friends the truth? Afraid of offense? Maybe this is because the truth offends *you* and so you think it would them as well. Read the passage once again and take heart. The Lord is with us and their souls are at stake, so tell others the truth.
