

The Daughters of Divine Love Congregation, an international order of Women Religious, founded in 1969 in Nigeria by late Bishop Godfrey Mary Paul Okoye, C.S.Sp, during the agonizing and ravaging Nigeria-Biafra war will be coming to the Cameroon Catholic Community to sell their Raffle booklets/tickets on the weekend of February 16, 2014.

The death of the founder, barely seven years after the founding of the Congregation, put its survival in question; however, the Congregation continued to grow and thrive. Today by God's mercy this mustard seed, the Daughters of Divine Love has grown into a big tree with over 900 sisters ministering in 15 countries in Africa, (including Cameroon), Caribbean Islands of Jamaica, Cuba and Haiti, and the United States. The members pronounce the public vows of Chastity, Poverty and Obedience, and dedicate themselves to contemplation and apostolic work feeding, educating, providing shelter, medication, and basic necessities to the poor, lonely and needy.

Emeritus Bishop of Buea  
Pius Suh Awa  
1930-2014  
"Ut Cognoscant Te":  
That they may know You

Born on May 4, 1930 in Bafut-North West Region, Bishop Pius Suh Awa attended Brigard Memorial Seminary in Enugu-Nigeria from where he proceeded to Rome for further studies.

Ordained priest in Rome in 1961, he became co-adjutor Bishop of Buea in 1971, and took over the Diocese of Buea in 1973. On January 1, 2007 he stepped down and handed over the reigns to Bishop Immanuel Bushu. He passed onto eternal glory on

February 9, 2014, and will be buried in the Soppo Cathedral on February 24, 2014. May His soul rest in Perfect Peace.

**THE LAW FULFILLED**

Jesus tells us in today's gospel that He has come not to abolish the Law of Moses but to 'fulfill' it and the teachings of the prophets. Christ is not abandoning the Ten Commandments but He is demanding of his followers a more perfect and sincere fulfillment of them. He calls us to train our hearts to master our passions and emotions. True service of God therefore begins in the heart and has its value from our interior disposition. Outward observance of the Law is not enough. It is not enough that we do not murder, commit adultery, divorce or lie.

The true Christian must remove any inclination to murder for example by building up true, brotherly love for all mankind in his or her heart. We must not only not injure our neighbor in person or character but be ready to help him or her and prevent injury whenever we can. We must not only not commit adultery, but must also develop a Christian respect and esteem for purity. We must be truthful always and be people of our word. Keeping the Ten Commandments is our way of proving to God that we are grateful, obedient and loyal to Him who gave us all we have and who has promised us abundant life.

Just as our love for God is proved by our love for our neighbor, so the last seven of the Commandments impose on us obligations regarding our neighbor. It is only by fulfilling these seven that we can fulfill the first three which govern our relations with God.
