# Avoiding the Summer Slump By Mrs. Little

Did you know that children who do not practice reading and math skills over the summer break can lose as much as two months of the progress gains made during the school year? Happily, these losses can be avoided with a few simple steps.

#### Be a Bookworm!

### Six books to summer success:

Research shows that reading just six books during the summer may keep a struggling reader from regressing.

Visit the library: Visiting the library is a fun and free way to keep reading motivation strong. The Orange County Library System even has a special Summer Reading Challenge that can motivate your student. You can register online at <a href="http://ocpl.readingbydesign.org">http://ocpl.readingbydesign.org</a>

Keep reading aloud: Reading aloud benefits children through their teens! One benefit is that you can read books your child can't, so she will build listening comprehension skills with grade-level and above books. Reading

the same book can also stimulate rich family discussion.

Go Multimedia: Read newspapers, magazines, comics, and online sources. For example have your child follow a recipe online

### What about Math?

Go Digital: There are many free or low cost online programs to practice math skills. The Quantile math challenge works with the Math Inventory "MI" assessment score we use at school to provide daily simple family challenges for students. Get Shopping (and budgeting!) Shopping is a great opportunity to
practice all types of math computation.

responsibility lesson by helping
children plan how to earn money for a

Write old fashioned notes to family members and friends. Special pens paper, or a family mailbox can make this a real treat.

Create a family story- Here's a fun idea to motivate your students. Have one family member begin a story, and continue passing the story to different family members who can add their own twist. You never know where the story will end up!

## **Historic Buildings**


In March of 2017, OUSD Board of Trustees voted their approval to remove the two abandoned historic buildings in the middle of campus. The demolition is scheduled to take place during the 2017 summer break, so no students are affected. Once the buildings are removed, construction will then begin on a improved campus quad. The District hired landscape architect firm PBK Architects to design this new, large space. While the architectural rendering tells most of the story, there are a few important things to note ...

- Our concrete outdoor auditorium is getting bigger! School events like Graduation, Open House, Winter Concert and Lip Sync will have more space for parent & grandparent viewing.
- The new quad has been designed to improve the drainage problems. There is new grading and the addition of a dry well to help relieve the excessive runoff water from rains.
- The school bell will be removed from the old building and used for a monument located just to the east side of the stage area.
- A large, oval concrete pad will be added toward the south end. This will initially be just concrete, but in the future we hope to fundraise and add on a shade structure + tables and make this a usable activity area for a pull-out classroom and other uses..
- There will be the addition of new fencing and gates inbetween the office & MPR. This space will be used for parents to gather and socialize just before pick-up or as they are waiting during the 15 minutes stretch of time between lower and upper grade dismissals.

The OUSD's schedule timeline has all historic building abatement & demolition activities taking place during the 2017 summer break. It is expected that quad improvements will not be completed until early October. We are excited for these new changes and the open space in our quad area.

Great things are in store for the 2017-18 school year!
