22" x 4 ½" barrel stave or similar sized surface - design is horizontal,


PREP BEFORE MEETING:


- Sand as needed for your surface. End prep with a light sanding and brush off dust. The dry brushing will be easier if your surface isn't sanded satin smooth.
- Slightly thin CN and IB and slip-slap color all over the stave. With the dirty brush, randomly slip-slap mor thinned CN in a second layer in some places.
- Thin G to a wash thickness and slap a hint of color in various places around the background. Repeat with just a hint of Soft Lilac.
- If desired, thin G and splatter all over the surface. Remember, the thinner your paint the larger your splatters. Experiment on paper if you are unsure.
- Use BGM to base a solid ¼" border all the way around. You can use a #8 flat for the exact size or tape it off. It doesn't have to be perfect because you'll put an outline later.
- 6. Put on pattern including very careful tracing of lettering.
- 7. a) basecoat pumpkins and stems TO
 - b) basecoat leaves marked "Y" YO
 - c) basecoat leaves marked "G" CG

d) leaves without the "Y" or "G" are not basecoated with anything. Leave your background showing.

e) basecoat berries G

f) OPTIONAL BASECOAT – stroke in the letters with a #6 flat loaded with inky HB. A round brush is also an option. Letters will look best if you stroke them on one stroke rather than traditional basecoating. This does not need to be completely opaque because you will do both a shade and a highlight over the basecoat.

FAMILY BLESSINGS By Barbara Bunsey Taught by Linda McDonald

SURFACE: 5 x 7 canvas or wooden surface of your choice
PALETTE: DECOART

Antique White, Bleached Sand, Burnt Orange, Burnt Sienna,
Burnt Umber, Buttermilk, Charcoal Grey, Driftwood, Espresso,
Georgia Clay, Light Avocado, Light Buttermilk, Neutral Grey,
Orange Twist, Payne's Grey, Raw Sienna, Red Alert, Spiced
Pumpkin, True Ochre

BRUSHES: liner or script liner, assorted flats, filberts and round.

Lg Dry Brush or Dome brush for edge scrubbed look. Regular Acrylic Supplies

PREPARATION: Basecoat Antique White. Using a flat brush, slip/slap

Bleached Sand in the middle of the piece. Along the right, bottom, and partially up the left side, scrub Raw Sienna on the edges and onto surface some. We will do similar with the BU together in class.


