English

As we lead up to the end of Year 6 children will write, edit, improve and complete final pieces of writing to ensure they have a portfolio of work. We shall use this term's text—*Street Child* as a stimulus for their writing. Children will revise all areas of grammar and punctuation to ensure they are confident in using them in writing. They will continue to practice the spelling rules they have learnt all year.

Finally children will complete many comprehension exercises in timed conditions to prepare them for the Reading SAT.

Computing

The children will have weekly Mathematics lessons, and time on Spelldrome. To prepare for their SAT tests

Science

Our Science topics this term will be: Living things and their habitats, Classification and finally Evolution and Inheritance

Mathematics

Throughout this term children will revisit and advance their skills within:

- Calculations
- Handling Data
- Measuring
- Understanding Shape
- Using and applying maths

We will also carry out extensive practice recalling our existing knowledge of arithmetic facts in preparation for the new SAT test.

History/Geography

Throughout the term, our creative curriculum will make links to our English text. Children will use their knowledge of life in Britain during the Victorian Era. Hopefully the topic will culminate in a visit to Beamish.

Music

The children will be working with a specialist teacher within their music lessons. They will be exploring rhythm and patterns in music, using different instruments to investigate and create sounds. They will also learn how to Samba !!!

Art/DT

William Morris is chiefly known as a great designer of patterns derived from natural forms. Wild and garden flowers, inter-twining leaves, birds and animals all feature in his wallpapers, textiles, carpets and ceramics. Using this artist as an inspiration the children will complete work in his style.

PE
