Student Re-enrollment Period & Process for all Current Families begins January 2nd and concludes January 19th Once school is back in session on January 2nd, all Sunrise families will receive important re-enrollment information via email. This email will be accompanied by a letter providing the new tuition rates for the 2024 - 2025 academic year and options, along with a returning student application form. To secure your child's preschool or kindergarten space for September 2024, please complete the returning student application form and send it back no later than January 19th – there is no application fee for re-enrollment of current students. It is important to secure your child's space before the new student enrollment begins on January 20th. If you need an application for a younger child, please let me know as this form is slightly different. After you receive the re-enrollment email next week, please feel free to contact me if you have questions.

Health and Safety Illness Policy Reminder

To help keep our students, families, and staff healthy, I would like to remind the Sunrise Community about our illness policy. It is important that sick children remain out of school when they are ill or have not fully recovered from an illness. This decreases the likelihood that germs will spread. Look for signs or symptoms of illness if you suspect your child is sick before bringing him/her to school. Please refer to the Parent Handbook for more information about Sunrise's illness policies. Don't forget to contact the school if your child will be absent from school!

Thinking Ahead Regarding Inclement Weather Delays and School Cancellation Policy

Sunrise typically follows the Franklin Public School's inclement weather policy. In the event of a delay, closing, or an early dismissal, I will email the parent body directly. This policy is also outlined in the Parent Handbook.



Outdoor Recess Clothing Reminder

As you know, Sunrise follows the Department of Early Education and Care's weather policy, and the students play outdoors as much as possible during the winter. Please remember to send the following items daily throughout the winter season: A hat, mittens or gloves, boots, a warm jacket, and snow pants or a snow suit (even if there is no snow). Snow gear provides protection from the frozen ground and cold temperatures. Please label all your child's outdoor items to ensure that any misplaced items get returned to its owner. These items will be sent home daily and must be returned the next day.



Dear Classroom A families,

We had a busy month full of celebrations! At the beginning of the month, we started off celebrating Hanukkah and learned the meaning of lighting the candles each night. The children loved practicing spinning the dreidels! We read and learned about many of the ways people celebrate Hanukkah and Christmas!





A huge thank you to Rachel, William's mother, for coming in to read a book to our class and teach us about how her family celebrates Hanukkah.

Our class also had a lot of fun singing Christmas Carols. We loved playing instruments and singing along to *Jingle Bells*!

In the **Math** area, the children enjoyed working on seasonal works such as counting candles on the menorah and clipping the clothespin to the symbol. In **Language**, the children worked hard on completing the pattern with Christmas trees! They also enjoyed pin-punching holiday/seasonal themed pictures, while developing concentration skills and pincer grip!









This month in **Science and Geography**, our classroom was learning about the changing of seasons from fall to winter. We also focused on the various plants that grow in the winter around this time of the year. We talked about evergreens and Christmas trees that stay green all year. Our class had a wonderful time celebrating the winter solstice by wearing cozy PJs to school, making winter crafts, and having a hot chocolate treat to celebrate the longest night of the year! We learned that the winter solstice is when half of the Earth is tilted the farthest away from the sun and the least amount of sunlight reaches Earth. We know that the sun gives us light and heat, and we learned how people celebrate the light returning as the days get longer and longer after the winter solstice!























During **Kindergarten Class**, we worked on handwriting, reading, and number formation. It was fun to complete mazes, color by numbers, dot-to-dot numbers and decorate a wreath weaving work as well to celebrate the upcoming holidays!

Happy December! The children have been busy learning about the different holidays the month of December brings. 
