THE [REDACTED] HAD THE PROPERTY LINE SURVAYED ON TREE CUTTING DAY AND THEY STILL BELIEVE THIER LIES AND REMOVED AND HID THE MARKER IN THE GROUND, WHEN THIS FIRST STARTED CONTACTED TWO CLOSE FRIENDS OF MINE FROM THE WOODSCKET POLICE DEPT, ABOUT THIS PROBLEM. Pursuant to the provisions of the general laws of the State of Rhode Island Title 42 State Affairs and Government Chapter 42-28.6 Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights Section 42-28.6-2, you are hereby notified of the following:

§ 42-28.6-2 Conduct of investigation. – Whenever a law enforcement officer is under investigation or subjected to interrogation by a law enforcement agency, for a non-criminal matter which could lead to disciplinary action, demotion, or dismissal, the investigation or interrogation shall be conducted under the following conditions:

- (1) The interrogation shall be conducted at a reasonable hour, preferably at a time when the law enforcement officer is on duty.
- (2) The interrogation shall take place at an office within the department previously designated for that purpose by the chief of police.
- (3) The law enforcement officer under interrogation shall be informed of the name, rank, and command of the officer in charge of the investigation, the interrogating officer, and all persons present during the interrogation. All questions directed to the officer under interrogation shall be asked by and through one interrogator.
- (4) No complaint against a law enforcement officer shall be brought before a hearing committee unless the complaint be duly sworn to before an official authorized to administer oaths.
- (5) The law enforcement officer under investigation shall, prior to any interrogating, be informed in writing of the nature of the complaint and of the names of all complainants.
- (6) Interrogating sessions shall be for reasonable periods and shall be timed to allow for such personal necessities and rest periods as are reasonably necessary.
- (7) Any law enforcement officer under interrogation shall not be threatened with transfer, dismissal, or disciplinary action.
- (8) If any law enforcement officer under interrogation is under arrest, or is likely to be placed under arrest as a result of the interrogation, he or she shall be completely informed of all his or her rights prior to the commencement of the interrogation.

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(9) At the request of any law enforcement officer under interrogation, he or she shall have the right to be represented by counsel of his or her choice who shall be present at all times during the interrogation. The interrogation shall be suspended for a reasonable time until representation can be obtained.

(10) No statute shall abridge nor shall any law enforcement agency adopt any regulation which prohibits the right of a law enforcement officer to bring suit arising out of his or her duties as a law enforcement officer.



(11) No law enforcement agency shall insert any adverse material into any file of the officer unless the officer has an opportunity to review and receive a copy of the material in writing, unless the officer waives these rights in writing.

(12) No public statement shall be made prior to a decision being rendered by the hearing committee and no public statement shall be made if the officer is found innocent unless the officer requests a public statement; provided, however, that this subdivision shall not apply if the officer makes a public statement. The foregoing shall not preclude a law enforcement agency, in a criminal matter, from releasing information pertaining to criminal charges which have been filed against a law enforcement officer, the officer's status of employment and the identity of any administrative charges brought against said officer as a result of said criminal charges.

(13) No law enforcement officer shall be compelled to speak or testify before, or be questioned by, any non-governmental agency.

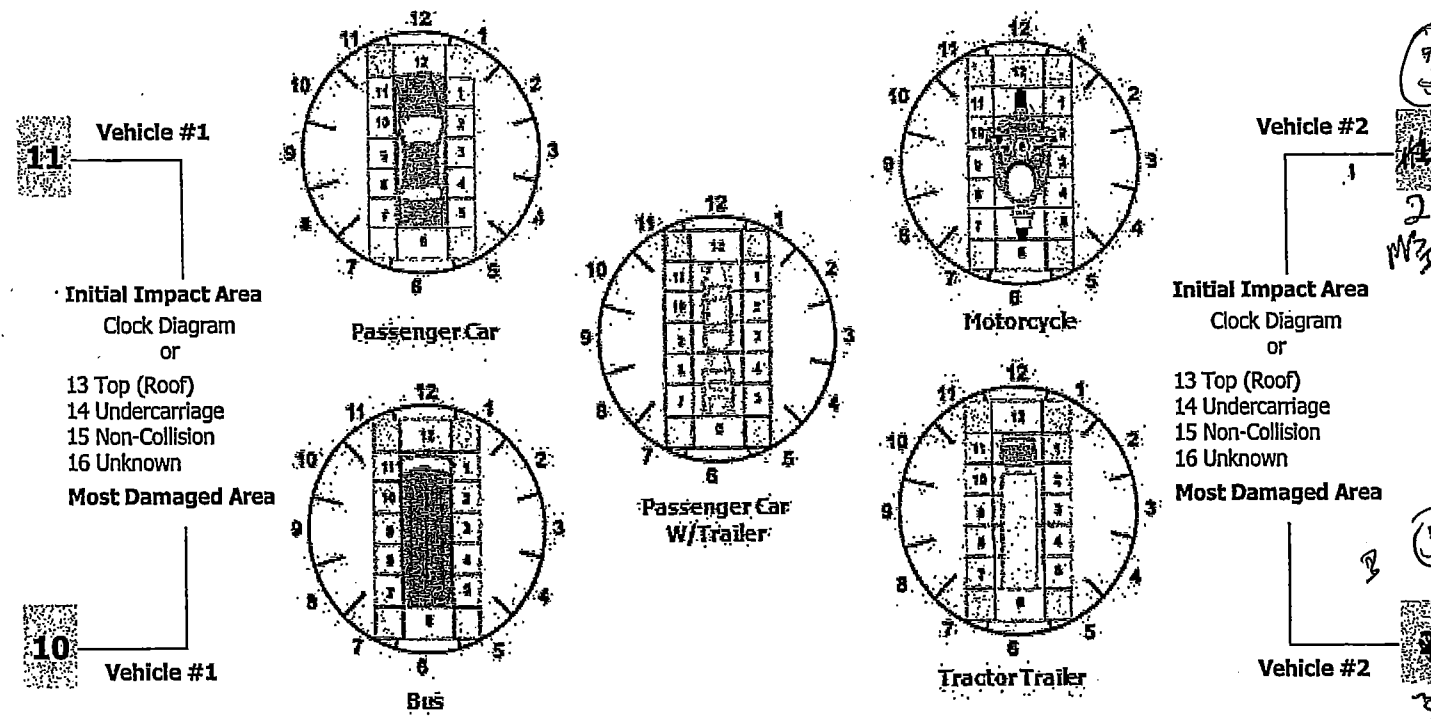

He then told me, in a loud voice, that quote "You fill out this form, I am done you can do it". I then replied to him that he doesn't give orders to me and that if she refused to co-operate with police he needed just to write refused on the DVSA-1 Form and have the fill the rest of the form filled out later. His reply was "No, you can do it I am done" he proceeded and threw the form in my mailbox outside of my office. I then told him he was out of line and he would be reprimanded for being insubordinate. He replied "then write me up" and stormed out the back door. This was all in ear shot and in front of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], as well as [REDACTED]. Civilian Complaint Procedure

The North Smithfield Police Department is dedicated to upholding high ethical standards and a high degree of honesty in accomplishing our law enforcement mission. To protect the citizenry, officers, and the reputation of the North Smithfield Police Department, the Chief of Police is responsible for conducting prompt and thorough investigations of all complaints received to maintain high professional standards within the department.

With the goal of maintaining professional standards, the North Smithfield Police Department has instituted the position of Internal Affairs Officer, who shall investigate all internal matters, allegations, and other complaints against department personnel. The Internal Affairs Officer is directly responsible for the investigation of these complaints and reports directly to the Chief of Police.

Any person wishing to file a complaint may do so with any sworn officer or civilian dispatcher at the department. That officer or dispatcher is mandated to log the receipt of the complaint into the daily police log and promptly notify the Shift Commander / Assistant Shift Commander, who will collect as much information as necessary to complete a *Personnel Complaint Report Form*. This form will then be forwarded to the Internal Affairs Officer. Also, the Shift Commander / Assistant Shift Commander will supply the complainant with a *Civilian Complaint Report Form*, if one is requested.

The Internal Affairs Officer shall maintain the confidential status of all internal affairs investigations and records. All internal affairs investigations are conducted in accordance with the North Smithfield Police Department Rules and Regulations, department general orders, special orders, the Rhode Island Law Enforcement Officer's Bill of Rights and existing collective bargaining agreements.

All complainants will be formally notified by the Internal Affairs Officer of the beginning and end of an internal investigation along with periodic status reports, when necessary. Forms can be mailed to the address below, faxed to the fax number listed below, dropped off in person at police headquarters or emailed to the internal affairs officer listed in the FAQ page.

Pursuant to the provisions of the general laws of the State of Rhode Island Title 42 State Affairs and Government Chapter 42-28.6 Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights Section 42-28.6-2, you are hereby notified of the following:

§ 42-28.6-2 Conduct of investigation. – Whenever a law enforcement officer is under investigation or subjected to interrogation by a law enforcement agency, for a non-criminal matter which could lead to disciplinary action, demotion, or dismissal, the investigation or interrogation shall be conducted under the following conditions:

- (1) The interrogation shall be conducted at a reasonable hour, preferably at a time when the law enforcement officer is on duty.
- (2) The interrogation shall take place at an office within the department previously designated for that purpose by the chief of police.
- (3) The law enforcement officer under interrogation shall be informed of the name, rank, and command of the officer in charge of the investigation, the interrogating officer, and all persons present during the interrogation. All questions directed to the officer under interrogation shall be asked by and through one interrogator.
- (4) No complaint against a law enforcement officer shall be brought before a hearing committee unless the complaint be duly sworn to before an official authorized to administer oaths.
- (5) The law enforcement officer under investigation shall, prior to any interrogating, be informed in writing of the nature of the complaint and of the names of all complainants.
- (6) Interrogating sessions shall be for reasonable periods and shall be timed to allow for such personal necessities and rest periods as are reasonably necessary.
- (7) Any law enforcement officer under interrogation shall not be threatened with transfer, dismissal, or disciplinary action.
- (8) If any law enforcement officer under interrogation is under arrest, or is likely to be placed under arrest as a result of the interrogation, he or she shall be completely informed of all his or her rights prior to the commencement of the interrogation.

(9) At the request of any law enforcement officer under interrogation, he or she shall have the right to be represented by counsel of his or her choice who shall be present at all times during the interrogation. The interrogation shall be suspended for a reasonable time until representation can be obtained.

(10) No statute shall abridge nor shall any law enforcement agency adopt any regulation which prohibits the right of a law enforcement officer to bring suit arising out of his or her duties as a law enforcement officer.

(11) No law enforcement agency shall insert any adverse material into any file of the officer unless the officer has an opportunity to review and receive a copy of the material in writing, unless the officer waives these rights in writing.

(12) No public statement shall be made prior to a decision being rendered by the hearing committee and no public statement shall be made if the officer is found innocent unless the officer requests a public statement; provided, however, that this subdivision shall not apply if the officer makes a public statement. The foregoing shall not preclude a law enforcement agency, in a criminal matter, from releasing information pertaining to criminal charges which have been filed against a law enforcement officer, the officer's status of employment and the identity of any administrative charges brought against said officer as a result of said criminal charges.

(13) No law enforcement officer shall be compelled to speak or testify before, or be questioned by, any non-governmental agency.

If you do answer, neither your statements nor any evidence which is gained by reason of such statements can be used against you in any subsequent departmental or any other administrative hearing.

The questions and answers resulting from this investigation are confidential and will not be released or revealed to any person or agency, inside or outside, the North Smithfield Police Department without the approval of the Chief of Police.

You will be notified prior to any formal questioning as to the date and time.

The father was identified as [REDACTED], who is also a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for the North Smithfield Fire Department.

While officers were responding to the said residence the mother received a text message from the daughter that their father was mad because someone called the police and they were heading over to his house. [REDACTED] asked the daughter how the father had knowledge of the police responding there and she replied he was looking at his phone and he must have received a text message.

Once hearing this information I pulled the report and called the responding officers. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] was on the desk. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were assigned to South and North Beats. [REDACTED] stated he did put it over the air and dispatched both said officers to the residence. Officer's stated to me that there was nothing out of the ordinary at the home, the two children were fine. The children were actually playing board games. Officers were originally called there because the daughter did not want to be there with her father.

Pursuant to the provisions of the general laws of the State of Rhode Island Title 42 State Affairs and Government Chapter 42-28.6 Law Enforcement Officers' Bill of Rights Section 42-28.6-2, you are hereby notified of the following:

§ 42-28.6-2 Conduct of investigation. – Whenever a law enforcement officer is under investigation or subjected to interrogation by a law enforcement agency, for a non-criminal matter which could lead to disciplinary action, demotion, or dismissal, the investigation or interrogation shall be conducted under the following conditions:

- (1) The interrogation shall be conducted at a reasonable hour, preferably at a time when the law enforcement officer is on duty.
- (2) The interrogation shall take place at an office within the department previously designated for that purpose by the chief of police.
- (3) The law enforcement officer under interrogation shall be informed of the name, rank, and command of the officer in charge of the investigation, the interrogating officer, and all persons present during the interrogation. All questions directed to the officer under interrogation shall be asked by and through one interrogator.
- (4) No complaint against a law enforcement officer shall be brought before a hearing committee unless the complaint be duly sworn to before an official authorized to administer oaths.
- (5) The law enforcement officer under investigation shall, prior to any interrogating, be informed in writing of the nature of the complaint and of the names of all complainants.
- (6) Interrogating sessions shall be for reasonable periods and shall be timed to allow for such personal necessities and rest periods as are reasonably necessary.
- (7) Any law enforcement officer under interrogation shall not be threatened with transfer, dismissal, or disciplinary action.
- (8) If any law enforcement officer under interrogation is under arrest, or is likely to be placed under arrest as a result of the interrogation, he or she shall be completely informed of all his or her rights prior to the commencement of the interrogation.

(9) At the request of any law enforcement officer under interrogation, he or she shall have the right to be represented by counsel of his or her choice who shall be present at all times during the interrogation. The interrogation shall be suspended for a reasonable time until representation can be obtained.

(10) No statute shall abridge nor shall any law enforcement agency adopt any regulation which prohibits the right of a law enforcement officer to bring suit arising out of his or her duties as a law enforcement officer.

(11) No law enforcement agency shall insert any adverse material into any file of the officer unless the officer has an opportunity to review and receive a copy of the material in writing, unless the officer waives these rights in writing.

(12) No public statement shall be made prior to a decision being rendered by the hearing committee and no public statement shall be made if the officer is found innocent unless the officer requests a public statement; provided, however, that this subdivision shall not apply if the officer makes a public statement. The foregoing shall not preclude a law enforcement agency, in a criminal matter, from releasing information pertaining to criminal charges which have been filed against a law enforcement officer, the officer's status of employment and the identity of any administrative charges brought against said officer as a result of said criminal charges.

(13) No law enforcement officer shall be compelled to speak or testify before, or be questioned by, any non-governmental agency.

[REDACTED] immediately informed me of the phone conversation with [REDACTED] forwarded me a Inter-office memo as to the conversation and informed me I would more then likely receive a call from [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] also forwarded me a copy of the log entry from [REDACTED], as well as the [REDACTED].

On [REDACTED] I was contacted by [REDACTED] by department landline at approximately [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated to me that he wanted to know what the process was for him to file a civilian complaint against [REDACTED]. I informed him that he could fill out a civilian complaint form and forwarded it to my office. A few days later [REDACTED] dropped off a civilian complaint form to my office and I started an Internal Affairs investigation. I first called [REDACTED] via cell phone and informed [REDACTED] I started an Internal Affairs investigation in regards to a complaint I had received from [REDACTED] regarding an incident that occurred on [REDACTED] sometime after [REDACTED].

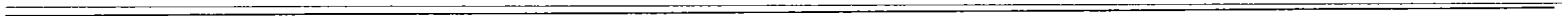

So he says, "You're gonna clean the fuckin' car off." I said, "I'm not cleaning the car off. Go fuck yourself." And then I says, "You know," I says, "your fuckin' ego," I says, "you must like being [REDACTED] since you guys all sit around jerking each other off in a circle," I said, you know, "telling each other how great you are." I said, "That attitude and that ego," I said, "aren't gonna fly here with me." And he says, "Yeah, we'll see who's got the fuckin', who's got the," um, like, "the ego," or "the attitude." He goes, he goes, "I'm gonna have you fucked." He goes, "I'm gonna call," uh, like I said, I think it was [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], and, "I'll call the investigators." He said, "And don't think for one fuckin' minute I'm not gonna testify in your fuckin' divorce." He goes, "I'll voluntarily show up there about you being a lousy father and about the inheritance money." This is a dispute over inheritance money that I got. My wife's after it and everything.

So, um, uh, I just ended up, uh, when he left, I says to him, I says, "You know what?" I said, "You just got no balls." I said, "You come here, talk to [REDACTED] like that," I said...so I shut the fuckin' door, and, and I didn't talk to him anymore. And I told [REDACTED], I says, "You shouldn't be putting up with this shit. I don't give a fuck who he is."

INAUDIBLE, "Nobody should talk to you like that." All right. Now we're getting to the, the other spot. He's, basically, what he was saying to me was, "I'm gonna take my, my position..." Oh, that's what he says. He says, "Don't worry. I know who the fuck to call." In o-, in other words, as his position as a police officer, he knows who to call. He knows what to do, what buttons to fuckin' push. [REDACTED] very articulate with a pen and he knows how to, he knows how to push the buttons. And I just, he likes, I feel he likes to come here and bait me, and try to get me to come at him, and tries to get me to be aggravated.

I go upstairs. Uh, the kids, my kids are here. Oh, a-, and that's what he said to me out on the deck. He goes, "Look how you're acting in front of your kids." And I says, "You're trying to have me arrested over putting snow on your car, but that's okay. But me being upset over how you talk to [REDACTED] is the end of the fuckin' world in front of my kids? Okay." I shut the door. I could hear bits and pieces come out. I shut the door, I go upstairs, and I can hear [REDACTED] and the kids. I said, "What's going on?" I can hear him saying something to the police officer, like, I, either I'm out of control, or

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unstable, or something to that effect. Well, I knew, because I, I do have some experience, uh, in growing up in a, a family of law enforcement, I could tell by the body language outside that something was going on. I met with the two police officers in the front, and the, the second car pulled up out here. It was [REDACTED], according to the report. Um, he gets out. [REDACTED] shakes his hand. They're talking. It's, uh, it's a good old boys' club. I mean, I know that, no disrespect to you or the other guys, but I know how, sometimes, it can work.

[REDACTED]: You got a guy who's a police officer. He's [REDACTED]. He's telling you he's got someone, what I believe he's saying, who's unstable, is out of control, and you got guns in the house. Like, he's ramping it up over somebody putting snow on the car.

[REDACTED]: I t-, we, we just took it to a level of d-, o-, he took it to a level it didn't need to be at. I observed [REDACTED] putting on body armor. And I'm saying to myself, I said to my, m-, I said to my mother, "I gotta get the kids outta here." I said, "Obviously, he's saying something," I said, "'cause they're gearing up to come in to talk to me over something." They c-...do you have any other questions or do you want me to continue?

[REDACTED]: Um, at that time, they came around the side. They come into the house. Um, they asked, uh...the ki-, the kids come in, I made sure at that time, because I knew something was going on. I had the door open. I had my hands in plain sight. I wasn't, I wasn't gonna get INAUDIBLE gun pointed at me. You know, with the, with the police shootings that have been going on, um, I, I, I, I knew better than to just, than to tweak anybody at that point, especially because I felt that he was using his position to influence, you know, to push 'em, to get 'em to come at me. So anyway, they come in the house and, um, [REDACTED] says to me...I says, "How you doing?" He says, uh, "What's so f-..." INAUDIBLE, "What's so funny," or "What's up?" He says, uh, "You been drinking?" I says, "If you call Sam's Clear Choice," uh, "Strawberry Zero Calorie Water 'drinking,'" I said, "I'm guilty." And he comes in, so I'm trying to get my kids out of the room. Now the kids see them come in and, uh, get 'em all upstairs. And he says, "What's going on," something to that effect. Oh, I asked him, um, I said, "Did you really put body armor on to come in and see me?" I said, "You really thought..." I says, "What, what...you drinking his Kool-Aid out there?" And he says to me, goes, "We're not drinking anyone's Kook-Aid." He said something to the effect, "Oh, that's not, not for you." He says, "We gotta go deal with a guy after, another snow shoveling incident. Somebody's been drinking and we gotta deal with him." And I said, "Really?" I said, "You think I'm that stupid?" And he says, "Oh, what, were you watching us?" I said, "I have four generations of cops in my family." I said, "There's not much I don't miss or I watch out the front." 'Course I was there. My kids are here.

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I'm looking out the window. So anyway, he comes in and I said to him, he says, um, the other patrolman, I think from the report his name [REDACTED], he says to me, uh, "W-, tell us what's going on with the car." At that time, I did tell him that I put the snow on the car, but at this, th-, after the incident had taken place and I thought about it and realized that I had to live here, u-, under fear of retaliation from somebody who happens to be [REDACTED], who happens to be in a position of authority, who happens to know the right buttons to push to, as he put it, have me fucked, or "I'll fuck you," um, I, um...I lost my train of thought. I, you know, I figured I, "Now I need to tell you that I put the snow on the car." At the time, I was pissed off and I was like, "No, it was a rogue snowplow." That was my way of saying fuck him, I'm not cleaning the snow off. Um, he says, "A rogue snowplow?" I said, "Yeah, that's what it was." He says, "Are you gonna clean it off?" I said, "Not on your life." And he said, "Well, obviously, you and [REDACTED] don't get along." He says, "You can't," uh, "be near each other." I says, "I live here." I said, "He came here." Um, at that time, they left. They went out front. Um, INAUDIBLE, [REDACTED] left. [REDACTED] then opened the, you know, he... [REDACTED] lives here, but [REDACTED] has, in my opinion, has no rights to the, uh, the garage and stuff where I keep my property in.

[REDACTED]: "Unstable" and "out of control" were the two comments I heard.

[REDACTED]: You heard that?

[REDACTED]: I heard that.

[REDACTED]: Okay.

[REDACTED]: And I heard it made to [REDACTED] when I shut the garage door on him.

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[REDACTED]: Okay.

[REDACTED]: He pointed at me, looked, and he smirked, and he says, "See?" He goes, "He's out of control."

I said, "Cause you answer snow-on-car complaints off him." And they kind of just looked at each other, and I said, "You know, that, that's what I thought." So, uh, that...

[REDACTED]: ...say anything?

[REDACTED]: Not that I recall.
