

Joe-Pye Weed



Eupatorium species are excellent pollen and nectar sources for butterflies and other insects. The Swallowtail butterfly is especially fond of Joe-Pye Weed. The seeds are also eaten by several species of birds. This tough native perennial can grow just about anywhere and adds a strong vertical accent to the garden. There are also multiple medicinal uses including the treatment of kidney complaints, rheumatism, fevers, and colds.

Eupatorium fistulosum

- Hardiness: Zone 4-8
- Size: 5-8', spreads and self seeds
- Flower: Large clusters of pink or purplish-mauve flowers from July to September
- Culture: Full sun to part sun and moist to wet soils. Very adaptable
- Uses: Meadow, wetland, rain garden, pond or stream edge, border, vertical accent, showy, butterflies, pollinators, birds, good wildlife value, cut flower, medicinal, deer tolerant
