The PJA Welcomes a New Professor

The title of Danzan Ryu Professor is awarded to those individuals who have dedicated many years of their lives learning, practicing, teaching and promoting the arts and esoteric principles passed down to us by Professor Henry S. Okazaki. In addition to technical ability, one must also possess the qualities of honesty, integrity and moral character.

During this year's Bob Krull Memorial, Sensei Kevin Colton was awarded the title of Danzan Ryu Professor by the Pacific Jujitsu Alliance. Professor Colton began his

study of Danzan Ryu Jujitsu in 1966. He is the sensei of Santa Clarita Valley Jujitsu in Saugus, California and has promoted 40 black belts.

Twelve DZR Professors, from four different DZR organizations, unanimously supported the Pacific Jujitsu Alliance's recommendation to award Kevin the title of Danzan Ryu Professor.

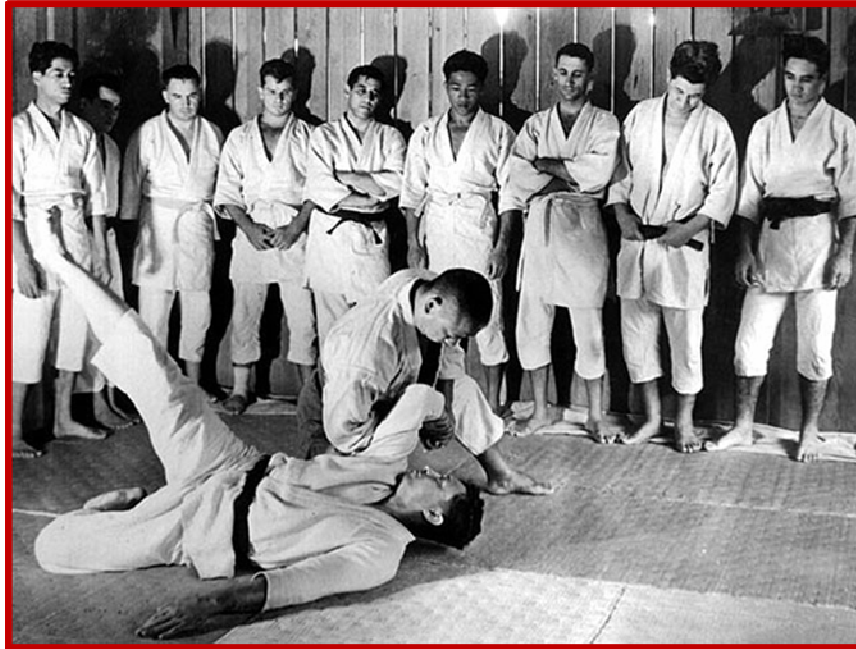
KODENKAN POLICE COURSE CLINIC

OPEN TO ALL STUDENTS 14 YEARS & UP WITH THE RANK OF YELLOW BELT AND ABOVE, AS WELL AS ACTIVE LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL.



This is an opportunity to learn seldom taught techniques from the Kodenkan Police Course, also known as Keisatsu Gijutsu. This course was developed in Hawaii by Professor Henry S. Okazaki and was designed as a specialized course for civilian and military police officers. In the 1940s Professor Okazaki taught these arts to several of his senior black belts, one being Professor William Montero. During the 1970s Professor Montero taught the Kodenkan Police Course to his senior black belt, Prof. Bob McKean.

Prof. McKean is a retired police lieutenant with 30 years of law enforcement service and holds the black belt rank of Shichidan (7th degree) in Danzan Ryu Jujitsu. He has taught defensive tactics for numerous law enforcement agencies and police academies and was certified as a state, national and international law enforcement defensive tactics instructor. We are privileged and honored that Prof. McKean has agreed to come and instruct this special clinic. Prof. McKean has not instructed these traditional Keisatsu Gijutsu arts in the Bay Area for over 15 years.
