- II. Goal Progress Updates
 - a. Peer Support Groups
 - i. Kim has finished a draft of the facilitator training and lesson plans, Alaina proof read & edited, and the documents have been sent out to the committee to review
 1. Send Kim any feedback so she can finalize the documents
 2. Need to identify a list of potential facilitators: Send Kim any recommendations
 3. 20 different lesson options, with an overall focus on addressing & changing aspects of criminal thinking
 - a. navigating supervision
 - b. life skills
 - c. building healthy supports
 - d. developing decision making skills
 4. Attend eight and get a month of supervision waived, attend 16 and the data shows reduction in recidivism rates
 - ii. Follow Ups
 1. Identify additional measurable objectives pertaining to implementation
 2. Partner with Dave Lehman to utilize community mentors
 3. Searching for funding options to help offset costs for facility rental, printing, incentives, supplies, etc.
 4. Present to CJAB Forensic Initiatives Committee and to President Judge for review and approval
 - iii. Goal: present an overview of the program at the September Franklin Together meeting
 - b. Recovery Community Center
 - i. Kim has developed a work plan to assist local organization in developing their own recovery community centers
